Re: Public Comment — Pattern of LAPD Harassment, Retaliation, and Institutional Misconduct

Members of the Police Commission,

The Los Angeles Police Department has a long, documented record of corruption, retaliation, and abuse of power. What happened to me fits that pattern.

Over an extended period, I experienced harassment, intimidation, misuse of authority, and retaliation connected to my former workplace and daily life. This conduct has interfered with my ability to work, feel safe, and trust my environment. LAPD failed to investigate properly or honor procedural safeguards. Rather than investigate, the department employed delay and deflection to shield misconduct from scrutiny.

This is not about a single incident—it is about consistency and escalation. I experienced repeated targeting and interference by individuals leveraging police authority. The pattern reflects targeted retaliation consistent with LAPD's treatment of whistleblowers.

I have documented what occurred through video recordings, timelines, and other materials that document surveillance, evidence mishandling, and abuse of institutional power. I am placing this submission on the record to document the abuse of institutional power in the absence of meaningful oversight. All documentation is being preserved for legal counsel.

The Commission's responsibility is not limited to individual complaints. It includes systemic misconduct that persists because it is enabled or ignored. When the department is allowed to investigate itself, accountability becomes performative.

This matter should be evaluated as part of a broader pattern of LAPD misconduct, not minimized as an isolated grievance. Oversight has no credibility if it avoids difficult cases or minimizes documented harm.

This submission is intended as written public comment and is being entered into the record consistent with the public participation requirements of the Brown Act (Gov. Code § 54954.3). This comment is

submitted after the 5:00 PM deadline for the March 3, 2026 meeting and is provided for the record and Commission consideration.

We cannot and will not allow the LAPD to do the bidding of federal immigration agents who lie and violate Angelenos' constitutional rights.

As a City, we must continue working together to prioritize the protection and well-being of all our community members. The LAPC is well-positioned to help move this work forward. Your leadership can ensure that LAPD fully complies with the City's sanctuary policies in a way that promotes transparency, accountability, and the safety of all Angelinos.
