**SUBJECT:** PEREGRINE TECHNOLOGIES

### **PURPOSE**

The purpose of this Notice is to inform personnel of the Department's implementation of the Peregrine Technologies. Peregrine's deployment reflects the Department's ongoing investment in efficient, real-time decision-making and collaborative policing. This implementation will also position the Department to respond more effectively to evolving public safety challenges.

### **BACKGROUND**

Peregrine Technologies is an analytical digital platform that strengthens crime analysis, generates investigative leads, and supports both strategic and operational planning. Peregrine integrates data from essential Department systems [including Computer-Aided Dispatch (CAD), Records Management Systems (RMS), Automated License Plate Readers (ALPR), and Field Interview (FI) Cards] into a single interface; it does not independently retain any data. This platform enables users to identify patterns, trends, and associations among individuals, locations, and incidents, enhancing the Department's ability to connect critical information quickly and efficiently.

Peregrine is a vital resource for both sworn and civilian personnel engaged in analysis, investigations, and command-level decision-making. The technology improves situational awareness, expedites case development, and reinforces LAPD's commitment to data-driven policing. By automating data integration and analysis, Peregrine saves analysts and investigators significant time, allowing for faster identification of suspects and more effective deployment of resources.

The intended audience for Peregrine includes:

- Command Staff and Supervisors – For operational planning, mission deployment, resource allocation, and the visualization of crime patterns and trends.
- Crime and Intelligence Analysts – For identifying crime patterns, series, and spatial trends.

- Sworn Personnel – For completing crime reports or investigations, when personnel have the right and need to access criminal justice and Department data systems as part of their investigation.

### **ACCESS REQUIREMENTS**

To maintain data security and ensure appropriate use, access to Peregrine is granted based on assignment and completion of required training. All personnel must complete online or in-person training on the proper use of Peregrine to gain and/or maintain access to the platform.

Upon completion of the training, the following personnel may be granted immediate access to Peregrine:

- Crime and Intelligence Analysts (CIANs);
- Police Officers and Detectives;
- Detective Commanding Officers; and,
- Commanding Officers.

Personnel in the above ranks/classifications have been determined to have a need to access Peregrine as a data analytics and investigative tool. If personnel prerequisites are met and login failures occur, please contact peregrineaccess@lapd.online for assistance.

### **REQUESTING ACCESS FOR ADDITIONAL GROUPS**

Personnel who do not fall within one of the above ranks/classifications, may also request access to Peregrine, by submitting a Form 15.02.00 through their Commanding Officer to Information Technology Bureau (ITB), Area CLETS Coordinator. The request shall include:

- Name;
- Rank;
- Serial Number;
- Job Assignment; and,
- Brief justification for needing access to Peregrine.

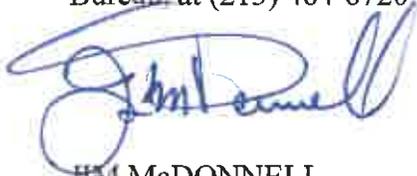
Upon approval, instructions for completing Peregrine training will be provided before access is granted.
