- The app is available from the Apple App Store or Google Play.
- The tasks that can be accomplished include bulky item pickup, illegal dumping, graffiti, pothole repair, traffic signal malfunction, availability of a picnic area in a local park, paying City bills such as DWP, animal issues and many more in a continuously expanding list.
- Mr. Gomez recommends registering for an account so that you can check progress and receive email updates on your service requests. Check the "Receive Email" box to activate this feature.
- The system can be used from a computer at the address www.lacity.org/myla311
- Mr. Gomez recommends accessing the system from the app instead of calling which will be much slower because of older equipment and busy attendants.
- The app will accept a photo of the problem which is helpful so that the right equipment can be sent out and for follow-up. Be safe when photographing people (such as an encampment or car repair on the street), perhaps by using the camera's zoom from across the street.
- Gandhi Diaz (representing Gil Cedillo, CD1) noted that the Service Request number is useful for follow-up, including escalating a problem to the Council District Office.
