OPERATIONS NOTICE NO. 1

March 10, 2010

**SUBJECT: ENFORCEMENT OF CALIFORNIA VEHICLE CODES  
PERTAINING TO CYCLISTS**

**EFFECTIVE: IMMEDIATELY**

Because cyclists are among the most vulnerable users of the roadway and are more likely to suffer injuries in a collision, they need to be recognized as legitimate users of the roadways. Cyclists also deserve law enforcement personnel who are familiar with the laws that apply to both motorists and cyclists who engage in activities that endanger cyclists and the general public. Attached is a list of California Vehicle Code (CVC) sections that have been identified as the leading cause of traffic collisions resulting in injuries to cyclists.

This Notice is to serve as a reminder for officers to be mindful of the provisions granting cyclists equal rights to the use of the roadways. Officers are encouraged to educate the motoring public about the applicable CVC sections through traffic enforcement and community education efforts. Officers observing the violations specified in the attached Notice, and who are available (e.g., not transporting a suspect or enroute to a priority call), shall take appropriate enforcement/education efforts.

OPERATIONS NOTICE NO. 1, 2010  
APPLICABLE VEHICLE CODE SECTIONS

- 21100 VC Grants cyclists the right to ride on the sidewalk so long as due care is exercised. No requirement that a cyclist dismount their bicycle in a crosswalk (LAMC 56.15).
- 21453 (a) VC A driver facing a steady circular red signal shall stop before entering the crosswalk and shall remain stopped until an indication to proceed is shown.
- 21200(a) VC Every person riding a bicycle upon a highway has all the rights and is subject to all the provisions applicable to the driver of a vehicle by this division.
- 21202(a) VC The "Bike to the Right" provision does not require cyclists to travel in the "door zone."
- 21650 (g) VC This section allows bicycles on any shoulder, or sidewalk.
- 21650.1 VC A bicycle operated on a roadway, or the shoulder of a highway, shall be operated in the same direction as vehicles to be driven.
- 21656 VC On a two-lane highway where passing is unsafe because of traffic in the opposite direction or other conditions, a slow moving vehicle, including a passenger vehicle, behind five or more vehicles, shall turn off the roadway to allow vehicles to proceed.
- 21801(A) VC The driver of a vehicle intending to turn shall yield the right-of-way to all vehicles approaching from the opposite direction.
- 21802(a) VC The driver of any vehicle approaching a stop sign shall stop as required by Section 22450. The driver shall then yield the right-of-way and shall continue to yield the right-of-way until he or she can proceed with reasonable safety.
- 21804 VC The driver of any vehicle about to enter or cross a highway shall yield the right-of-way to all traffic and shall continue to yield the right-of-way to that traffic until he or she can proceed with reasonable safety.
- 22106 VC No person shall start a vehicle stopped, standing, or parked on a highway, nor shall any person back a vehicle on a highway until such movement can be made with reasonable safety.
- 22107 VC No person shall turn a vehicle from a direct course until such movement can be made with reasonable safety and then only after the giving of an appropriate signal in the manner provided in this chapter in the event any other vehicle may be affected by the movement.
- 22350 VC No person shall drive a vehicle upon a highway at a speed greater than is reasonable or prudent.
- 22450 VC The driver of any vehicle approaching a stop sign at the entrance to, or within, an intersection shall stop.
- 22517 VC No person shall open the door of a vehicle on the side available to moving traffic, unless it is reasonably safe to do so.

**SUBJECT:           COMPLETING TRAFFIC CITATIONS WITH VALID COURT  
                      DATES DUE TO COURT FURLOUGHS**

**EFFECTIVE:         IMMEDIATELY**

This Notice serves as a reminder to commanding officers and personnel issuing citations that the Traffic and Superior Courts are closed on the third Wednesday of each month as a result of the state budget crisis. Mandated court furlough days were effective July 15, 2009, and will remain in effect until June 2011.

Department personnel received several prior notifications during the 2009 calendar year, including the following:

- \* Traffic Court Liaison Unit, Detective Support and Vice Division, issued a roll call notice with the *Los Angeles Superior Court Furlough Days* attachment, May 19, 2009;
- \* Chief of Detectives Notice, *Court Services Closures Due to Furloughs At the Los Angeles Superior Court*, dated June 22, 2009;
- \* Local Area Network, *Court Closure Update*, posted June 23, 2009; and,
- \* Local Area Network, *Update of Additional Court Closures*, posted July 8, 2009.

Department employees continue to issue citations with invalid court dates.

Supervisors shall verify that all citations have a valid court date and ensure that corrections and violator notifications are completed immediately. It is incumbent on each command to develop a method that facilitates the officers' access to dates the courts will be closed through June 2011. Each command is responsible for the adherence of this policy.

Officers are encouraged to cross-out all invalid dates on their Los Angeles Police Department Citation Guide, Form 16.65.00, in order to assist them in citing to dates the courts are open. Attached is a list of the applicable furlough dates.

**SUBJECT: NEW LEGISLATION FOR 2010**

**EFFECTIVE: IMMEDIATELY**

This Notice provides a summary of new state legislation that took effect on January 1, 2010. The following are highlights of legislation that potentially affect Department operations. Department personnel are highly encouraged to review these highlights and reference the specific codes for details.

**Penal Codes (PC)**

**PC §186.2 (a) (28) and (31) Human Trafficking - Added.** Human trafficking, and abduction or procurement of fraudulent inducement for prostitution is added within the definition of "criminal profiteering activity." See Penal Code Section 236.1, *Human Trafficking*, and 266a, *Fraudulent Inducement for Prostitution*, for additional information.

**PC §241.5 (b) and PC § 243.65 Highway Workers: Assault and Battery - Amended.** The definition of a "highway worker" is expanded to include employees or volunteers employed by a city or county, contractor or employees of a contractor while working under contract with the city or county, or the Department of Transportation who performs maintenance, repair, or construction of state highway or local street or road work zones.

**PC §290.95 (c) Sex Offenders: Working with Minors - Amended.** Any person, who is required to register under Section 290 because of a conviction for a crime where the victim was a minor under the age of 16, shall not work directly and in an unaccompanied setting with minor children on more than an incidental and occasional basis or have supervision or disciplinary power over minor children, and shall disclose his or her status as a registrant, upon application or acceptance of a position to that person, group, or organization.

**PC §336.9 (a) Betting Pools - Amended.** It is an infraction for any person who participates by a bet, wager, or betting pool or pools between the person and any other person or group of persons who are **not acting** for gain, hire, or reward, other than what is at stake under the conditions available to every participant; upon the lawful trial, or contest of skill, speed or power of endurance of person or animal, or between persons or animals, or mechanical apparatus.

**PC §337a. Betting Pools - Amended.** It is a misdemeanor to participate in a betting pool, if the initiator or other participants make a profit from the original bet.

**PC §381c Nitrous Oxide: Prohibit Sale to Minors - Added.** It is a misdemeanor to sell or give away a device, canister, tank, or receptacle exclusively containing nitrous oxide, or exclusively containing a chemical compound mixed with nitrous oxide to a person under 18 years of age.

**PC §487h (a) and (b) Grand Theft: Cargo - Amended.** Every person who steals, takes, or carries away cargo of another, if the value of the cargo taken exceeds \$950, except as specified, is guilty of grand theft. Section (b) describes "cargo" as meaning any goods, wares, products, or manufactured merchandise that have been loaded into a trailer, railcar, or cargo container, awaiting or in transit.

**PC §538e (e) (1) and (e) (3) Fire Fighting Uniforms - Amended.** Any vendor who sells firefighting uniforms must verify that the person is an employee or authorized member of the agency or department before allowing the purchase of the uniform. Any vendor who does not verify authorization is guilty of a misdemeanor.

**PC §597.5 (b) Dog Fighting - Amended.** Any person knowingly present as a spectator at a dog fight is guilty of a misdemeanor.

**PC §626.10 (a) (2) Crime: School Grounds: Weapons - Amended.** It is a misdemeanor to bring or possess a razor blade or box cutter upon school grounds of any public or private school providing instruction in kindergarten or any grades 1 to 12.

**PC §653b (a) and (c) Loitering: Criminal Street Gangs - Amended.** It is a misdemeanor for any person to loiter after being asked to leave, as specified, about any school or public place at or near which children attend or normally congregate. There are now enhanced penalties for this crime if the person is required to register with the chief of police or sheriff for committing specified criminal street gang offenses pursuant to PC Section §186.30.

**PC §836 (c) (3) Officer Responding to a Domestic Violence Call: - Amended.** The term "*primary aggressor*" is replaced with the term "*dominant aggressor*."



**PC §1524 (a) (9) and (10) Search Warrants: Firearms - Amended.** A search warrant can be issued when the property or things to be seized include a firearm or any other deadly weapon at the scene of, or at the premises occupied or under the control of the person arrested in connection with a domestic violence incident; or, when in the possession of, or in the custody or control of a person described in Section 8102 (a) WIC.

**PC §11411 (a) Hate Crimes: Nooses - Amended.** Any person who hangs a noose, knowing it to be a symbol representing a threat to life, for the purpose of terrorizing an owner or occupant, on private property, a college campus, public park or place of employment of another, without permission, is guilty of a misdemeanor.

**PC §12020.1 Composite Knuckles - Amended.** It is a misdemeanor to possess hard "composite" knuckles or hard wooden knuckles. The term "plastic knuckles" is replaced with "composite knuckles."

**PC §12050 (a) (1) (A) (ii) Firearms - Amended.** This bill clarifies that any licenses issued, as specified, by a sheriff or police chief in a county with a population under 200,000, to carry a loaded and exposed handgun, are valid only within the county in which they are issued.

**PC §12061 (a) (1) Ammunition - Added.** An ammunition vendor shall not permit any employees who the vendor knows, or should reasonably know is a person described in Section 12021 or 12021.1 of the Penal Code or Sections 8100 or 8103 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, from being able to handle, sell, or deliver handgun ammunition in the course or scope of his or her employment.

**PC §12061 (a) (2) Ammunition - Added.** No ammunition shall be accessible or sold to a purchaser or transferee without the assistance of the vendor or employee.

**PC §12070 (b) (18) Firearms - Added.** An exemption from the delivery, sale, return, or transfer of firearms for exchange to or from a gunsmith for the purposes of service or repair was added.

**PC §12072 (a) (9) (A) and (B) (xiii) Firearms: Purchasing Restrictions - Amended.** Community colleges that are certified by the Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training that instruct the law enforcement academy basic course or other commission-certified law enforcement training is added to a list of exemptions from making more than one application to purchase more than one handgun within any 30-day period.

**PC §12316 (a) (1) (B) Ammunition - Amended.** Any person who sells any ammunition or reloaded ammunition designed and intended for use in a handgun to a person under 21 years of age is guilty of a misdemeanor. If ammunition or reloaded ammunition can be used in both a rifle and a handgun, it may be sold to a person who is at least 18 years old, if it is for use in a rifle.

**PC §12317 (a) Ammunition - Added.** Any person, corporation, or firm who supplies, delivers, sells, or gives possession or control of ammunition or reloaded ammunition to any person who knows or should know is prohibited from owning, possessing, or having any ammunition or reloaded ammunition is guilty of a misdemeanor.

#### Vehicle Codes (VC)

**VC §4461 (a) Unlawful Use of Forms of Registration, Plates Permits, or Placards, or Validation Tabs - Amended.** A person, or a person to whom a disabled person placard is issued, shall not lend a certificate of ownership, registration card, license plate, special plate, validation tab, or permit issued to him or her if the person desiring to borrow it would not be entitled to its use, and a person shall not knowingly permit its use by one not entitled to it.

**VC §21204 (a) Bicycles - Amended.** No person may operate a bicycle upon a highway without having and using a permanent and regular seat, *unless the bicycle was designed by the manufacturer to be ridden without a seat.*

**VC §21809 (a) (1) and (2) Vehicles: Emergency Vehicles - Amended.** The repeal date has been eliminated and vehicles traveling on the freeway or highway are mandated to move to an available lane and/or slow to a reasonable speed when emergency vehicles and tow trucks are on the shoulder of the freeway.

**VC §22659.5 Vehicles: Nuisance Abatement. Impoundment - Added.** The provisions requiring a five-year pilot program are repealed, and the city or county can adopt a permanent ordinance declaring motor vehicles a nuisance when involved in certain crimes, such as prostitution and illegal dumping.

**VC §23109 Speed Contests and Exhibitions of Speed; Punishment - Amended.** This amendment still prohibits an individual from engaging in a motor vehicle speed contest on a highway. A motor vehicle speed contest consists of any motor vehicle racing against another vehicle, a clock, or other timing device, and exceeds the speed limit. The punishment sections have been amended.

**VC §23301.5 (a) (1) and (2) Vehicles: Payment or Tolls. Exemptions - Added.** Emergency vehicles displaying an exempt license plate and properly identified or marked as an emergency vehicle are exempt from paying a required toll fee when responding to or from an urgent or emergency call.

**VC §23576 (a) Exception for Operation of Vehicle (Owned by Employer) - Amended.** An individual required to have an ignition interlock device, related to first-time violators of Vehicle Code Sections 23152 or 23153 when operating a motor vehicle, may drive a vehicle not equipped with an ignition interlock device when they are required to operate an employer's vehicle during the course and scope of their employment. The employee must notify the employer that their driving privilege has been restricted, and proof of that notification must be in their possession or a copy must be inside the vehicle.

**VC §27602 (a) Television - Amended.** This amendment prohibits any motor vehicle from displaying a television or video screen any point forward of the back of the driver's seat where the driver may see such display while the vehicle is moving.

**VC §32000.5 (a) License to Transport Hazardous Material - Amended.** A motor carrier, who directs the transportation of an explosive, directs the transportation of a hazardous material, or who transports for a fee in excess of 500 pounds of hazardous materials requiring a placard shall be licensed. This license shall be available for examination and shall be displayed in accordance with the regulations adopted by the commissioner.

**VC §38304.1 Ability to Reach and Operate Controls: Persons Under 14 Years of Age - Added.** A parent, guardian or person supervising a child who is under 14 years of age shall not grant permission to or knowingly allow that child to operate an **off-highway** motor vehicle, if they are unable to reach and operate all controls necessary to safely operate the vehicle.

#### Health and Safety Code (H&S)

**H&S §1799.102 (b) (2) Personal Liability - Amended.** Any person, including medical, law enforcement and emergency personnel, who in good faith, and not for compensation, renders emergency or non-medical care at the scene of an emergency, shall not be liable for any civil damages resulting from any act or omission as long as the act or omission does not constitute gross negligence or willful or wanton misconduct.

#### Business and Professions Codes (B&P)

**B&P §25608 (a) (10) Alcoholic Beverages: Places of Consumption - Amended.** The sale or consumption of alcoholic beverages is permitted during events at a community college-owned facility. This subdivision shall not apply to any public education facility in which any grade from K-12, inclusive, is schooled.

**B&P §25660 (a), (b), and (c) Alcoholic Beverages: Proof of Age. Passports - Amended.** A valid passport, issued by the United States government or a foreign government, is acceptable bona fide evidence. A military identification card that displays a photo and date of birth on the card is considered valid identification and acceptable bona fide evidence.

#### Code of Civil Procedure (CCP)


**CCP §527.85 (a) Temporary Restraining Orders: Private Institutions - Amended.** The chief administrative officer, or his designee, of a post-secondary educational institution, is able to seek a Temporary Restraining Order on behalf of a student(s) who has suffered from a credible threat of violence.

#### Education Code (EC)

**EC §48902 (a) and (c) School Safety: School Security and Police Department - Amended.** It is the responsibility of the principal or the principal's designee to report the possession, sale or furnishment of a firearm, or the possession of an explosive, committed by a pupil or non-pupil on a school site, to the city police or county sheriff with jurisdiction over the school.

**SUBJECT: CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF MOTOR VEHICLES  
OPERATING PERMITS**

**EFFECTIVE: IMMEDIATELY**

This Notice serves as a reminder that the California Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) issues several types of operating permits that entitle a vehicle to be operated on the road while the registration application is being processed.

The Temporary Operating Permit (TOP), DMV Form REG 19, is the most common operating permit issued for incomplete transactions. The permit has a bold white number (month of expiration) on a red background. With this permit, the vehicle may be operated up to and including the day indicated on the front of the TOP.

The New/Used Report of Sale form is a white form that is used to process the registration application of a new or used vehicle by a dealership. The customer's copy is the bottom portion of the form, titled New Vehicle Dealer Notice Temporary Identification, DMV Form REG 397, or Used Vehicle Dealer Notice/Temporary Identification, DMV Form REG 51, and is commonly referred to as a Temporary Identification. The Temporary Identification must be displayed in the lower rear window of the vehicle so that it can be read from the outside, or if the information would be obscured, in the lower right corner of the windshield.

**Note:** Per California Vehicle Code Section 4456 (c) (1) and (2), a vehicle displaying a Temporary Identification may be operated without license plates or a registration card until either of the following, whichever occurs first:


- \* The license plates and registration card are received by the purchaser; or,
- \* A six-month period, commencing with the date of sale of the vehicle, has expired.

Another valid operating permit is the Vehicle Moving Permit, DMV Form REG 172. This permit allows the vehicle to be driven for only one day as indicated on the permit. The form is white and has specific terms applicable to the vehicle's usage.

November 4, 2010

This permit is often issued for a vehicle that has been registered as a Planned Non-Operation, or on vehicles for which fees have been paid, but all registration requirements, such as smog certification, have not been met. The Vehicle Moving Permit, accompanied by a Report of Deposit of Fees (Department of Motor Vehicles printout), meets the requirements of a registered vehicle for the day it is issued only.

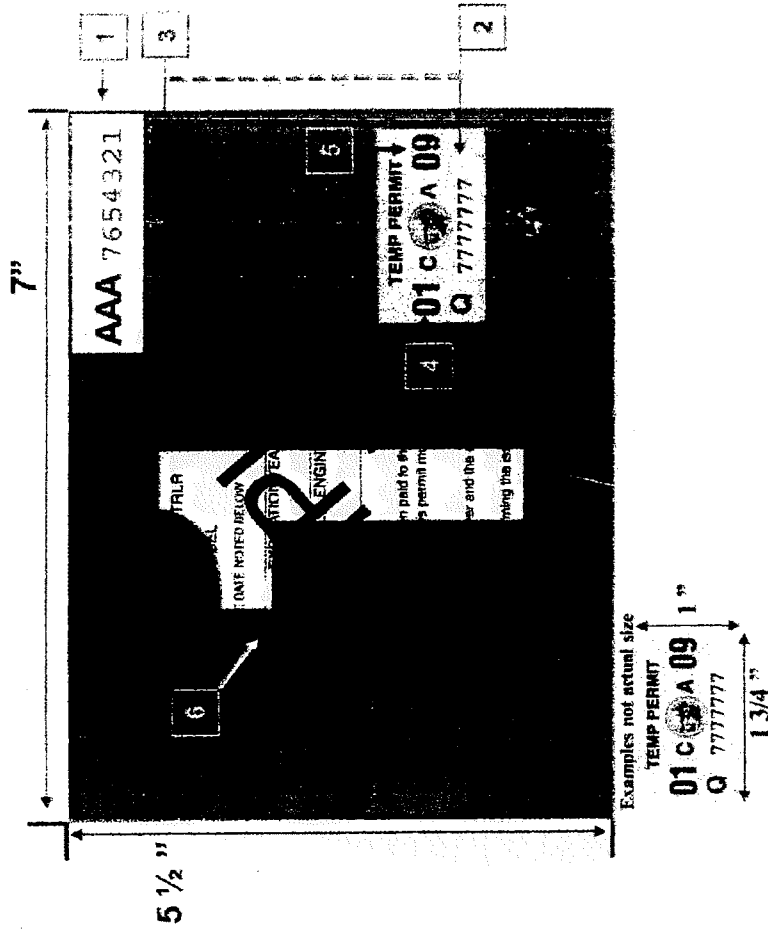

- #1 This portion displays a pre-printed three position Alpha prefix followed by a seven position numeric serial number.
- #2 This is a silver serialized sticker that validates the permit. It displays a one position Alpha and seven position numeric serial number.
- #3 The sticker serial number is handwritten on the TOP.
- #4 The Sticker month must match the TOP month.
- #5 This is the year the TOP expires.
- #6 This is the day the TOP expires.





# New/Used Temporary Identification

The New/Used Report of Sale form is a white form that is used to process the registration application of a new/used vehicle by the dealership. The customer's copy is the bottom portion commonly referred to as a Temporary Identification. The temporary identification must be displayed in the lower rear window of the vehicle so that it can be read from the outside, or if the information would be obscured, in the lower right corner of the windshield.
