SUBJECT: DEPLOYMENT OF PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT CACHES -
REVISED

The inherently hazardous nature of any emergency situation necessitates that safety be approached from a risk-management perspective. Rather than eliminating risk altogether, incident commanders aim to minimize or shield first responders from hazards to the greatest extent possible.


This Notice is to inform incident commanders that Emergency Operations Division (EOD) maintains Level "C" Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) caches that are available to be deployed to decrease the risk associated with a response to a chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear, or hazardous materials incident.


Deployment requests may be made via Real-Time Analysis and Critical Response Division after consultation with technical specialists from the Hazardous Materials Unit, Emergency Services Division. The deployment request should include the nature of the incident, incident location, and the location of the staging area. If possible, ingress routes should be provided that will allow access for a vehicle towing a large trailer. The PPE cache will be deployed to the staging area at which time equipment will be issued by authorized personnel.

As a reminder, a PPE cache may also be requested for deployment at a pre-planned special event as a precautionary measure. The availability and purpose of the PPE cache should be included in the appropriate Incident/Event Action Plan.
