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<p>C. Broadcast C-10</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Request a Clear Frequency on Radio2. Proceed with broadcast upon obtaining approval from RTO3. End broadcast with "KMA"4. Listen to the RTO broadcast the return on your C-105. Identify if the person you have detained/arrested has Wants/Warrants6. Is it a Code 6 Charles warrant? <p>D. Code 6 Charles Indicated</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Broadcast your location to RTO and state to standby (unless detained person is already handcuff)2. Immediately handcuff detained person3. Directions:

Play code 10 audio tracks form South Bureau. Ask questions related to audio tracks.

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Play South Bureau, Track 1. · Ask: Did the officers go Code 6? · Ask: Did the officers request a clear frequency? · Ask: How was the officer's broadcast? (too fast or slow) · Discuss possible returns from the Code 10 (i.e. Code 6 Charles, no wants/warrants, etc.)

Play South Bureau, Track 2. · Ask: Did the officers go Code 6? · Ask: Did the officers request a clear frequency? · Ask: How was the officer's broadcast? (Too fast or slow).

Play Valley Bureau, track 3. · Ask: How was this last broadcast?

Time Allowed: 10 minutes.
