Course Goal: To provide the students with basic skills necessary to complete a Traffic Enforcement Stop in a manner consistent with law, policy, and tactically sound principles.

Learning Objectives:

This learning activity gives the students the opportunity to observe and identify a violation being committed, use radio communication to conduct a traffic stop and approach the vehicle tactically safe. **[28.VII.C, C1, C2, C3]**

The student will participate in a learning activity addressing:

1. Written Communication as an expression of integrity, reliability, fairness and credibility
2. Effective reports as a demonstration of an officer’s character, decision make, and courage
3. Potential stakeholders that may be positively or adversely affected by a well written report
4. Consequences of an ineffective/inaccurate report to the officer, officer’s agency, policing profession and the community
