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- 2. Offenders required to register within 5 working days of
 - a. Moving to a new jurisdiction
 - b. Moving to a new residence in the same jurisdiction,
 - c. The registrant's birthday (annually).
 - d. Attending an institution of higher learning must also register with college, university police department or local law enforcement agency
 - e. Leaving the law enforcement jurisdiction (i.e., vacationing, visiting, temporary employment)
- 3. Transient sex offenders who are physically present in a jurisdiction shall register every thirty days and within 5 working days of their birthday

II. Sex Offender Registration

- A. Conditions & Requirements
 - Offenders must register in multiple jurisdictions if
 - a. Live in one jurisdiction
 - b. Work in another jurisdiction
 - c. Enrolled as a student at an institution of higher learning
 - 2. Other registration conditions
 - a. Anyone convicted of crimes against children including:
 - 1) Child pornography (PC 311.2)
 - 2) Misdemeanor child molestation (PC 647.6(a))
 - 3) Aggravated assault of a child (PC 269)
 - b. Sexually violent predators (SVP) register every 90 days or it is a felony
 - c. Oral copulation and sodomy where victim is over 14, the court has the discretion to order an offender to register.
 - 3. Sex offender registrants to:
 - a. Sign a notice of registration requirement issued by the Department of Justice standard

Ask If you wanted to keep track of sex offenders, what kind of information would you want to know and maintain about each of them?

Ask What if they were transient? Would you want to put additional requirements in place?

- b. Be fingerprinted,
- c. Be photographed,
- d. List the license plate numbers of any vehicle they own or that is registered in their names, or regularly driven by the registrant
- e. Give the name and address of employer, or the school they are attending,
- f. Give address to place of employment, if different than employer address,
- g. Provide DNA
- 4. If violate registration, evidence can be: [10.4.B]
 - a. Recorded witness statement (spouse, significant other, family, roommate(s), neighbor(s), new residents)
 - b. Statement from suspect
 - c. Mail with suspects address
 - d. Rental receipts, utility bills
