SUBJECT: PARTNERSHIP WITH BIKE INDEX

The purpose of this Notice is to inform Department personnel about the newly-established partnership with Bike Index. Bike Index is a non-profit organization offering a web-based bicycle registration service (www.bikeindex.com) that is available to all members of the community. The goal of this partnership is to encourage the reporting of bicycle theft, which will in turn provide law enforcement an additional tool to identify the rightful owners of lost/stolen bicycles to ensure the return of their property. The success of this partnership will be reliant on community outreach to include not only bicycle owners, but also bicycle shops, bicycle organizations, college campuses, and more.

Bicycle registration is voluntary and can be completed online by entering bicycle details, such as the bicycle's serial number, description and photographs. Community members will have the ability to mark their bicycle stolen in Bike Index and also be instructed to file a police report with the Department via the Community Online Reporting System or in person with any officer.

Effective immediately, all Department personnel will have law enforcement access to the Bike Index website. Upon publication of this Notice, all Department personnel with smartphones will receive a link with log-in instructions. Law enforcement access will provide officers the ability to contact the registered owner of a stolen/found/recovered bicycle directly, via a telephone call or an electronic mail. Additionally, officers will have the ability to assist a community member with registering his or her bicycle on the officers' Department smartphones.

Department personnel who recover a bicycle should first query the Automated Property Index (API) system to determine if the bicycle has been reported lost or stolen. Subsequently, Department personnel may query Bike Index by entering the manufacturer's serial number, scanning the Quick Response (QR) code on the Bike Index sticker (attached to the bicycle) or conducting a search using the bicycle's make, color and zip code.

Note: Officers shall not initiate a detention or arrest, or seize a bicycle, solely on the information obtained from the Bike Index website. Information from the Bike Index website must be verified through the proper Department resources, including contacting the victim of a bicycle that has been stolen, to determine if a bicycle can be seized.
