<p>I. Final pursuit briefing</p> <p>A. Very similar to the pursuit conducted on Day-1</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. One student driver with one instructor in the passenger seat 2. The student will be paired with a new instructor for this event <p>B. Staging in cul-de-sac</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Activate lights/siren (pass/fail score) 2. Pursuit broadcast (pass/fail score) <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Identify unit b. Declare pursuit c. Give location <p>C. Pursue suspect</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Remain within track limits 2. Complete stop at two stop signs 3. Broadcast a minimum of three of the four street signs <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. In the alternative three of three broadcasts during the lap as a secondary will also 	

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<p style="text-align: center;">meet the requirement</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">4. Avoid any cones in the roadway5. A five second penalty will be added for making contact with any portion of the yellow boundary line with the rear wheel(s) (e.g., trailing wheel adjustment)6. A ten second penalty will be added for making contact with any portion of the yellow boundary line with the front wheel(s) (e.g., front end collision, understeer)7. Steering to the green light when driving through the Collision Avoidance Simulator8. If a student chooses a red lane while driving through the Collision Avoidance Simulator it is an automatic failure9. Hitting or passing over a cone while entering the correct green lane will be given a 5 second penalty10. It is an automatic failure for losing control of the vehicle11. It is an automatic failure if the instructor must intervene to prevent loss of vehicle control12. The maximum time allowed in order to pass the final pursuit test is 2 minutes and 30 seconds after penalty adjustments (no time limit if inclement weather exists)13. The student must demonstrate a working knowledge of the six fundamentals of vehicle control <p>[D] (see instructors note)</p>	<p>[13] Ask the students if they have any questions about how the test will be administered</p> <p>[13.1] Ask the students if they understand what is required of them to achieve a passing score on the final pursuit test</p> <p>[D] Students will now participate in Learning Activity No. 25 (Pursuit Test)</p>
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
