## Required Test – Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR)

**Purpose:** Peace officers may be required to provide basic life support for a victim, fellow officer, or themselves until additional medical services become available. This may include physically performing cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) for a victim until emergency medical services arrive. This exercise will test the students' knowledge and ability to perform high quality CPR.

**Description:** The instructor will stage an adult mannequin in the courtyard outside of the instructor break room, or any other available space away from the other students. Students will test one at a time with the instructor. If multiple instructors are available, multiple testing stations may be staged. The instructor will follow the instructions on the CPR Exercise Test form. If the students have pocket masks available they may be used for the test, but are not required.

Scenario: Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) on an adult.

The student receives a radio call of a 415 fight in the park. Upon approaching the scene, they observe a victim down. The instructor will evaluate the student on the proper performance of the following:

- 1. Assesses the victim [34.VII.B.1]
- 2. Activates emergency response system [34.VII.B.2]
- 3. Checks for a pulse [34.VII.B.3]
- 4. Delivers high-quality CPR [34.VII.B.4]
- 5. Provides effective breaths [34.VII.B.5]
- 6. Automated External Defibrillator (AED) operation

### **Resources needed:**

- Adult and child mannequins (1 each per testing station)
- CPR skills exercise test form (1 per student)
- Training AEDs (1 each per testing station)
