

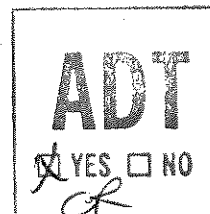

OPERATIONS NOTICE NO. 7

SUBJECT: ENFORCEMENT OF SUSPENDED OR REVOKED VEHICLE
REGISTRATION VIOLATIONS

EFFECTIVE: IMMEDIATELY



As of January 1, 2006, Senate Bill 1500 has required the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) to suspend, cancel or revoke the registration of a vehicle under specified conditions when the DMV has not received evidence of financial responsibility for that vehicle.

Currently, there are no California Vehicle Code (CVC) sections that allow officers to impound a vehicle specifically for having a suspended or revoked registration. However, the City Attorney's Office and DMV have advised the Department that Section 22651(o)(1) CVC, Expired Registration in Excess of Six Months, may be used to impound a vehicle that has a vehicle registration which has been suspended or revoked for at least six months and one day.

Therefore, sworn personnel who encounter a vehicle with a suspended or revoked registration shall follow the same procedures outlined in Office of Operations Order No. 12, *Enforcement of Vehicle Registration Violations*, dated August 8, 2005.
