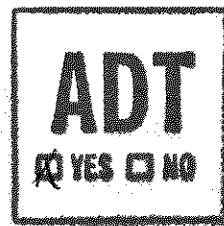

SUBJECT: DEPARTMENT ACCESS TO THE CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS AND REHABILITATION PAROLEE GLOBAL POSITIONING SYSTEM THROUGH REAL-TIME ANALYSIS AND CRITICAL RESPONSE DIVISION


EFFECTIVE: IMMEDIATELY

Real-Time Analysis and Critical Response (RACR) Division is designed to improve the way the Department processes crime information. One of the goals of RACR Division is to assist the investigative process by identifying, developing, and utilizing tools that enhance the Department's ability to rapidly identify crime suspects.

Currently, the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR) has placed Global Positioning System (GPS) ankle bracelets on approximately 500 parolees throughout the State. Of these, approximately 50 parolees have been placed on conditional release parole in the greater Los Angeles area. In fiscal year 2007/2008, there are plans to add 500 additional parolees to the GPS program. Presently, only individuals on parole for sexual assaults are subject to GPS monitoring.

Personnel from RACR Division were granted access to, and trained in the use of, the CDCR Parolee GPS program. Real-Time Analysis and Critical Response Division now has the ability to process data regarding the time and location of a criminal offense and automatically correlate the data with the location of sexual offenders subject to electronic monitoring. This process may facilitate the quick identification of potential crime suspects. Additionally, CDCR parole agents have the ability to create "inclusion" and "exclusion" zones to record the date(s), time(s) and location(s) that a parolee entered a designated "off-limit" area.
