**SUBJECT:** CRISIS TO SHELTER PILOT PROGRAM

The City of Los Angeles Mayor's Office has developed a Crisis to Shelter Program to provide emergency shelter for domestic violence victims during an active crisis. The program will provide shelter on an emergency basis (one to five nights). After placement, a shelter advocate will meet with the victim as soon as possible to discuss "next steps" services and safety planning.

This is a pilot program, so the initial implementation will be limited to Central, South, and Valley Bureaus. In Central and South Bureau, shelter will be a room at a designated shelter. In Valley Bureau, shelter will be at a motel or hotel and arranged by the service provider. To qualify for consideration, the domestic violence victim must be in an **emergency situation** (e.g. suspect has not been arrested, Emergency Protective Order was denied by the bench officer).

Officers believing a victim qualifies for Crisis to Shelter **shall** request the Domestic Abuse Response Team (DART) car respond to the location. The DART advocate will conduct an intake to determine if the victim qualifies for the program and arrange for placement.

**Note:** If the DART advocate is not on duty, officers can call the following hotline phone numbers for their respective Bureaus and state they have a possible Crisis to Shelter client. **Shelter is not guaranteed on days DART is not working.**

The DART car shall transport the victim to the designated shelter, motel or hotel. If DART is unavailable, officers and the shelter agency shall work together to provide safe transportation for the victim.
