Diversity, Equity & Inclusion Plan Basic Definitions



DIVERSITY

Diversity is the presence of differences. Some of these differences may include race, ethnicity, gender, gender identity, gender expression, medical condition, sexual orientation, age, social class, physical ability, attributes, religious, ethical values system, national origin, beliefs, perspective, profession, education, or experience.



EQUITY

Equity is the quality of being fair and impartial and ensures that individuals can access necessities and opportunities in a manner that is fair and proportional. Equity seeks to provide resources where needed.



INCLUSION

Inclusion is the act or process of finding individuals who have been previously excluded or marginalized and removing those barriers. When systems are determined to be unfair or unjust, inclusion can revitalize those systems.

■ Diversity makes the City of Los Angeles great. The great diversity in the City and the Department brings with it new ideas and experiences. Diversity means that people can learn from each other, bringing together different ideas and perspectives that leads to better problem-solving. Diversity opens dialogue and promotes creativity. The Department must continue to embrace and expand its diversity.

■ Equity differs from equality which assumes that everyone's conditions are the same and so everyone needs the same assets to compete fairly. The Department's goal for equity is to constantly search for ways to improve access and opportunities both within the Department (e.g., training, experience, loans, and exposure) and outside the Department (e.g., recruitment, programs, advisory boards, community councils, community academies, and service projects).

■ The Department must constantly evaluate its policies, procedures, practices, and culture to determine if they unnecessarily hinder inclusion. We must increase resources and efforts that prepare individuals to compete in existing Department systems and when necessary, change those systems to dismantle barriers that limit inclusivity. We must also seek to include and give a voice to the community, as the Department exists to serve them.

Current Crime Trends:
During the last 30 days, covering September 1 to September 30, 2021, there were 64 crimes in basic car area 15A3, which is 9 more than last month.

Overall violent crime increased this month compared to last month.

During this period aggravated assaults showed the biggest increase in overall crime. This period there were 12 incidents of aggravated assaults compared to 3 last period. Most of the incidents were domestic and family violence.

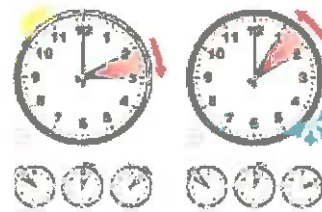


Current Crime Trends for Basic Car 15A21 had a total of 51 Part I crimes in the Month of September:

- 9 Aggravated Assaults;
- 4 Robberies;
- 11 Burglary from Motor Vehicles (BFMV);
- 8 Burglaries;
- 10 Grand Theft Auto (GTA); and,
- 8 Thefts.

There was a 34.21% increase from September; 51 Crimes reported in September as compared to 38 crimes reported in August. There were no discernable patterns with these crimes. GTA continues to be the number one crime category with older model Honda and Toyotas being targeted.

As the Daylight Savings time approaches and we turn our clocks back (November 7th), please remember to also adjust your light timers to turn on when it gets dark (rather than by time-set timers). In 2018 there was a spike in residential burglaries when the Daylight Savings time changed, and it was possible that burglars were targeting houses that were very dark and appeared that no one was home. Completely dark houses (both on the inside and exterior) give the impression that no one is home and could possibly be an easy target for breaking in.

- 9 Aggravated Assaults;
- 0 Rapes;
- 1 Robbery;
- 5 Burglary;
- 10 Grand Theft Auto;
- 12 Burglary from Motor Vehicle; and,
- 6 Thefts

During the last week of September, the Department of Sanitation along with Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority (LAHSA) were busy housing individuals living on the sidewalks in the area of Vineland and Victory.

After they were placed in temporary housing Sanitation removed the remaining items from the sidewalk. The New Tiny Home project has housed many of the un-housed Angelenos from the area of North Hollywood.

Safety tip for our furry companions. September and October are usually a hot months for the San Fernando Valley. Don't leave your pets in a locked vehicle. Temperatures can reach 20 degrees hotter in a locked car compared to the air temperature outside. Keep your furry friends at home with plenty of shade and water.

Hello from SLO33,

Compared to last year's crime statistics we are up 14.6% as of September 18, 2021.

- The biggest rise was in the area of thefts, up 87.2%;
- Property crime was up 15.5%; and,
- Total violent crime was up 10.7%.

This again is a reminder to "lock it, hide it, keep it". Keep all valuables locked in the trunk of your vehicle if you need to leave anything in your car. While shopping at retail stores don't leave your purse or any personal items unattended.

The parking signs around the NOHO West complex are up in the neighbors for permitted parking and will be enforced. After numerous clean ups, Alexandria Park by the tiny homes is now free of encampments and we will continue to conduct enforcement in the park for any tents that are up.

I have received many complaints regarding encampments, you can report them to the city of LA via theMYLA311 app or by calling 311.

Recently, we have noticed several RVs have moved from Cahuenga Boulevard. In addition, multiple vehicles have been impounded for numerous vehicle code violations.

A great arrest was recently made when officers discovered a stolen RV and found an assault rifle (AR-15) ghost gun inside the RV.

The suspect was booked for possession of ex-convict with an assault rifle.

There have been less tents at the North Hollywood Park/Recreation Center. I am happy to report that Enforcement and outreach is working in this area. Department of Sanitation is assisting with monitoring the encampments. Please utilize MYLA311 to assist with trash/debris and bulky items that are left on the sidewalk/street.

Please lock and secure your vehicles at all times. Many vehicle thefts and Burglary from Motor theft crimes are occurring in underground parking garages. Also LOCK IT, HIDE IT, KEEP IT and to not leave keys in vehicles. Nearly half of vehicles that are stolen are occurring due to keys that are left in the vehicle.

As we enter the last quarter of the year, crime in Valley Village remains relatively low. Even though we are at just over a 1 percent increase in total crime, Violent crime in Valley Village has significantly dropped.

Robberies are down over 33% and Aggravated assaults are about 24% down when compared to this time last year. Burglary, Personal Theft and Burglary from vehicles (car break-ins) are almost identical to last years numbers, and a notable increase in crime being grand theft auto (stolen vehicles).

A majority of the stolen vehicles occur with either the car running or key fobs are left in vehicles.

Please make extra effort to lock your vehicles and make sure all keys and fobs are accounted for. Do whatever you can to reduce your risk of becoming a victim.

As I previously mentioned, homelessness is still a visible part of Valley Village and continues to be part of our daily mission. Even though we see encampments move around in the Valley Village area, there is a noticeable decrease of these encampments over the last few months. We have used available City and County resources to relocate and assist individuals in need and we utilize whatever available enforcement tools when services are refused by problematic individuals. I believe the results are noticeable in Valley Village.

As always, I appreciate the continuous efforts of the community in identifying problems and making me or the appropriate City department aware of the issue so that we can best address it.

Current crime trends extending from September 1 to September 30, 2021 in 15A67's area had a total of 110 Part 1 crimes:

- 14 Aggravated Assaults
- 2 Robberies
- 44 Burglary from Motor Vehicles
- 14 Burglaries
- 18 Grand Theft Autos
- 2 Grand Theft Persons; and,
- 16 Thefts.

Most crimes occur in RDs 1555 and 1557 which are located from Camarillo to Magnolia and Cahuenga to Tujunga. The concentration of crimes is adjacent to the Lankershim corridor.

I have personally observed that due to clean ups that have occurred under freeway overpasses some encampments are moving to other sidewalk locations. Please utilize MYLA311 for debris and/or bulky items that are left on the street/sidewalk.

Tips to assist with lowering property crimes in the area would be to LOCK IT, HIDE IT, KEEP IT and to not leave keys in vehicles. Nearly half of vehicles that are stolen are occurring due to keys that are left in the vehicle.

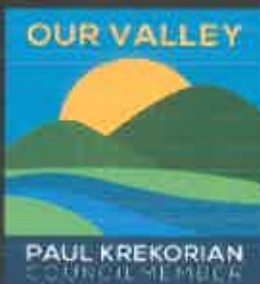

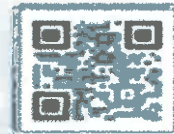

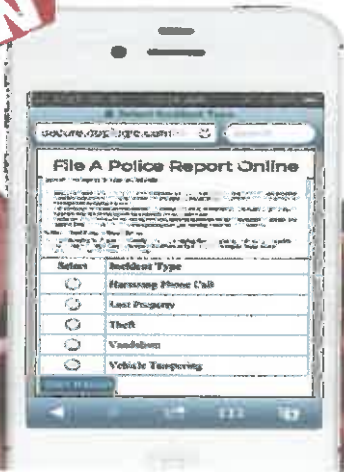

File a Police Report Online

The Los Angeles Police Department just made reporting some types of crimes a whole lot easier. Now you can simply go online and file a report about crimes such as the victim of harassing phone calls, lost property, theft, theft from vehicle or vandalism, please follow the link and check it out.

The majority of crimes like robberies, assaults, car break-ins, burglary of your car, home, or business must still be first reported by calling either 9-1-1 if the crime is happening now or if the crime happened earlier call the non-emergency number of the LAPD at 1-877-ASK-LAPD. A police report will be taken by officers once they arrive. If you have had your bicycle stolen for example you should try to file that report first online. It still make take a visit to your local police station at some point.
