So is "encouraging" and "bolstering" de-escalation, words that are meaningless as cops like Lee continue to be rewarded for their anti-Black and murderous actions. LAPD also suggests it "enhance the complaint investigation intake process," which brings to mind the department's complaint audits that will go to lengths describing how MANY ways a person can submit a complaint about LAPD, only to have them deemed unfounded at a rate that mocks the entire process - yet this is accepted and institutionalized. LAPD's plan is not new, which is exactly what is intended. We instead demand that LAPD be defunded.

Let people speak AFTER each agenda item; the other way doesn't make sense. Decrease Moore's time and open up public comment, with no restrictions on number of speakers and no 45-minute time limit. Members of the communities most affected by policing are by far the most knowledgeable about the real-world effects of the matters before the board, and about LAPD in their neighborhoods, and you need to hear what they have to say. Resume in-person meetings immediately, but keep a virtual public-comment option for people who can't or don't want to show up in person.
