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Commissioners,

Summary

We're not in a property crime wave, despite Chief Moore's fear-mongering.
 I oppose the 12% increase in the LAPD budget.

3. I oppose the TVTP (CVE) (PATHE) grant. This harmful program will be implemented in a discriminatory manner and become another line item in the bloated LAPD budget.

I oppose the profoundly failed and profoundly mismanaged Fusion Center program and I oppose promoting Officer Alex Vargas of the Fusion Center.
Allow public comment. Decrease Chief Moore's time and open up public comment, with no restrictions on number of speakers and no 45-minute time limit.

Details

Chief Moore and other City officials held a press conference this past Thursday to further sensationalize recent instances of property crime. Chief Moore used this press conference to push the narrative that the city has devolved into pandemonium, even though robberies in the city of Los Angeles are down more than 7% from last year and almost 25% from 2019. He then used these instances of property crime to attack the people's hard won Zero Bail Policy and to sow fear among Angelenos. Attacking the Zero Bail Policy serves only to wind back progress. As a recently released statement by BLM-Los Angeles states "Holding people in jail doesn't reduce crime or improve lives but comes at a tremendous price to taxpayers". It's clear that Moore's continued fear-mongering is an attempt to justify his ridiculous proposed 12% increase to the LAPD budget. We reject these attempts to undermine the will of community members and we reject Chief Moore's pathetic attempts at spreading fear to strengthen his murderous police force.

Item 3D on the agenda is a vote on the approval of a \$250,000 Targeted Violence Terrorism Prevention (TVTP) grant. The TVTP grant is just the most recent rebranding of the Countering Violent Extremism (CVE) grant that Angelenos, primarily educators, rejected in 2018. This grant will be used to fund a program called Providing Alternatives to Hinder Extremism (PATHE) meant to develop and train a 500 person team of spies and informants to monitor youth using risk assessment tools and by monitoring "suspicious behavior". We've seen implementations of CVE programs in Minnesota similar to PATHE result in the targeting of Black Muslim, East African, Somali and Native Youth. In fact, in 2016 The American Federation of Teachers wrote to the director of the FBI in sharp opposition to its "Don't Be a Puppet" program, similar to PATHE and CVE, citing its "emotional and psychological toll on innocent children". The racist intent of these programs would only be compounded by the racist LAPD.This TVTP grant is a clear effort to circumnavigate the clear and resounding rejection of CVE that community members projected in 2018.

Alex Vargas, the officer set to lead PATHE, currently serves as the deputy director of Los Angeles' Fusion Center. Vargas oversaw the surveillance of protesters during the George Floyd Uprisings, proving that the criterion for his qualification is his effectiveness in targeting Black and Brown Angelenos and his desire to quell dissent.

This is also obviously another attempt by the LAPD to grow their massive budget. As with so many of the harmful programs the LAPD has in its arsenal, PATHE will initially be funded by a grant but will inevitably find its way as a line item proposal by the LAPD. PATHE runs contrary to the public's calls to defund the police.

Regarding public comment - let people speak after agenda items! The community must have input on agenda items after hearing additional information on the item; it is through fear of public knowledge and public comment that the Police Commission does not currently allow this.

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Commissioners:

On the agenda this week as usual are items directing more money to police, which is against the demands of more than half of city residents, the majority of which favor defunding the police! Every year, the LAPD spends over \$3.2 billion, taking over half the city's discretionary funding. \$187K of this grant money (item 3C) is to pay LAPD to teach 40 youth to ride minibikes. As community members have stated regarding funding LAPD activities with youth, they would rather the city supported families having those interactions, instead of paying police for these programs - invest in communities, take out police! We demand a divestment from police, and an investment in supportive and fulfilling community services.

For item 4B, LAPD lists where it is with regard to police "accountability" laws, all of which is a farce. Moore closes the document by performatively listing the George Floyd Justice in Policing Act, a bill that was not passed but Moore can't stop from taking the opportunity to say that LAPD is in compliance with numerous protocols on the bill anyway (it's not), and therefore LAPD is a "leader" in police practices." In reality, LAPD is a leader in police brutality, cruelly taking the majority of the city budget year after year while poverty increases, then using those resources to target folks that are unhoused. 7. Why was the Bluestone company awarded a NO BID contract to perform objectionable medical tests for the Covid 19 virus?

8. Why are officers who conscientiously object to being vaccinated being forced to pay for testing out of their own pocket twice a week?
