This semiannual public report has been prepared pursuant to Consent Decree Paragraph 156. That paragraphs states:

The LAPD shall prepare and publish on its website semiannual public reports by this paragraph. Such reports shall include aggregate statistics broken down by each LAPD geographic area and for the Operations Headquarters Bureau, and broken down by race/ethnicity/national origin of citizens involved, for arrests, information required to be maintained pursuant to paragraphs 104 and 105, and uses of force. Such reports shall include a brief description of each of the following that was completed during that period: (i) report of a specified audit completed, audits completed pursuant to paragraphs 111, 113, 125, 126, 130, 133, and 134, and any significant actions taken as a result of such audits or reports, (ii) a summary of all discipline imposed during the period reported by type of misconduct, broken down by type of discipline, bureau and rank, and (iii) any new policies or changes in policies made by the Department to address the requirements of this Agreement. Such reports shall also include the reports prepared pursuant to paragraph 173 and 175.

Summaries of each audit and the respective findings are detailed below.

MOTOR VEHICLE and PEDESTRIAN STOPS DATA COLLECTION AUDIT

In accordance with the Fiscal Year (FY) 2005/06 Annual Audit Plan (AAP), Audit Division (AD) conducted a Motor Vehicle and Pedestrian Stops Data Collection Audit. Federal law prohibits detentions of persons based solely on race, color, or ethnicity. Consent Decree (CD) Paragraphs (¶) 104 and 105 require the Los Angeles Police Department (Department) to collect data on specified detentions (stops) using Field Data Reports (FDR).

This audit evaluated four primary objectives. They were to examine completeness, authenticity, underlying actions, and supervisory oversight and post incident review of the FDRs.

In addition, the audit evaluated whether FDRs were completed when required. Audit Division reviewed the activities from 44 randomly selected DFARs from August 21 through September 17, 2005 [Deployment Period (DP) 9], to determine whether the activities required completion of an FDR and, if so, whether one was completed. One hundred sixty FDRs were compared to documents related to the respective stops to determine completeness, authenticity, underlying actions, and supervisory oversight. A process flow review of the overall FDR data collection process evaluated critical controls. The review documented the process flow, examined the completeness of record transfers between systems, and reviewed for evidence of supervisory approval and uncorrected kickbacks (kickbacks are disapproved FDRs awaiting correction by the issuing officers).

Thirty-one percent of FDRs were not loaded to the STOP system due to the implementation of enhanced data validation controls within the Portable Officer Data Device System (PODDS). The PODDS was implemented in June 2004 and continues to undergo improvements to enhance FDR data accuracy, as well as to integrate Field Interview Report, Form 15.43 (FI card), and traffic citation issuance capabilities. Department management should be aware that system changes may temporarily impair FDR data in the STOP system, and should verify its status before placing reliance on it for reporting or analysis purposes. The STOP system is the Department's FDR tracking database used for reporting, analysis, and other official Department purposes. Complete and timely updates to the STOP system are necessary for accurate analyses.

NON-CATEGORICAL USE OF FORCE AUDIT

In accordance with the FY 2005/06 AAP, AD conducted an audit of Non-Categorical Use of Force (NCUOF) Reports to assess the Department's compliance with the requirements of CD §§ 65, 68, 69, 80 (c, e, and f), 82, 128, 129, and Department policy.

The audit population consisted of every reported NCUOF incident that occurred during the calendar month of September 2005. A total of 171 Use of Force Reports was identified. Audit Division located 154 reports; the remaining 17 reports had not reached the final review process.

The Department generally continues to conduct quality, timely and thorough NCUOF investigations. The previous audit determined that the most pressing area of concern and non-compliance in conducting NCUOF investigations was the Department's failure to ensure the accurate representation of taped and written statements by investigators. The audit resulted in a single recommendation regarding this issue. While the Department has taken action on this recommendation and some improvement has been made, the inaccurate representation of statements in supervisor summaries continues to be the most non-compliant of all audit objectives. Hard controls (policies and procedures) are appropriately in place; however, individual supervisors continually fail to ensure that all pertinent statements related to the force used are adequately represented in the NCUOF investigation.

In analyzing the deficiencies noted, non-compliance was not caused solely at any one level of review. The responsibility falls upon each level of review to heighten individual attention to detail in each investigation.

Overall, the Department was not compliant with six out of the 18 objectives and sub-objectives. The areas of non-compliance are as follows.

- Evaluation for inconsistent information;
- Evaluation for on-scene supervision;
- Evaluation of Post-Incident review;
- Interviewing all at-scene supervisors; and,
- Tape-recording all Level I interviews.

The Department appears to have sufficient policies and procedures in place to provide for quality and timely NCUOF investigations that are compliant with CD mandates. The deficient areas identified during this audit are resolvable through management's emphasis on, and commitment to, the reform mandated by the CD. The Department must place emphasis on management and supervisory attention to detail.

It was requested that the Chief of Police review and consider the following recommendations:

1. It was recommended that Consent Decree Coordinators and Divisional Training Coordinators attend the LAPD Basic Law Enforcement Performance Auditor Course in order to enhance their fundamental understandings of risk management issues and quality control of NCUOF investigations.

¹ A determination of compliance was withheld as none of the 18 investigations was a Level I investigation.

2. It was recommended that the Director, Office of Operations, ensure adherence to Department policy and procedures regarding NCUOF investigations. Further, the Director, Office of Operations, should ensure that bureau and Area commanding officers establish controls to provide for the overall quality of NCUOF investigations. Specifically, all related reports and taped statements should be reviewed to ensure the accuracy of paraphrased statements. These controls should be audited regularly by each bureau to ensure compliance with Department policy.

CONFIDENTIAL INFORMANT CONTROL PACKAGE AUDIT

Pursuant to the Los Angeles Police Department's Annual Audit Plan, an audit of confidential informant control packages was completed to determine the Department's compliance with CD ¶s 128, 108, and 109.

Each of the Department's 84 informant control packages that were active at the time of the audit was reviewed. Eight of the 84 packages were controlled by gang detectives.

Due to the large population and lower risk management issues associated with inactive informant packages, a statistically valid sample of 77 packages was identified and reviewed.

Active Informant Packages

There were 39 packages that did meet the standards for multiple objectives. Thus, the overall compliance rate was 46%. This rate is a decrease of 19% from the Confidential Informant Package Audit for FY 2003/2004, which reported an overall compliance rate of 65%. The audit completed in FY 2002/2003 reported a compliance rate of nine percent. The table on the following page indicates findings regarding active informant packages.

Gang Informant Packages

There were eight gang informant packages included in the 84 active informant packages. Of the eight packages, four (50%) met the standards for each objective. Auditors reviewed the findings and determined there were no significant risk management issues warranting further review.

Inactive Informant Packages and Shared Informant Packages

The compliance rates for standards set for inactive informant packages and shared informant packages ranged from 97% to 100% for each standard.

The table on the following page illustrates the Department's compliance for each of the six operational objectives for active informants. In cases where a finding was substantive, the package was held out in more than one applicable objective.

Notwithstanding the existence of hard controls, the Department may need to place emphasis on one component of a control risk, e.g., soft controls, in which concentration is placed on management and supervisory operating style and commitment to proficiency. Such management and supervisory operating style should encompass a sense of urgency to abide by those objectives set to meet Department policies and procedures and CD mandates. Commitment to proficiency should be embraced by management and emphasized to those they oversee.

The following recommendations were made to assist in adjusting management and supervisory operating style and enhancing commitment to quality and proficiency.

² The 18 shared informant packages were not included in the CITSD, and therefore were not measured for compliance with Objective No. 5.

1. It was recommended that Audit Division assign one Police Performance Auditor on loan to Narcotics Division for a minimum of one deployment period. This interactive work, between the auditor and the Department Confidential Informant Coordinators, would provide for insights regarding those areas to be addressed to bring informant packages into compliance with Department policies and procedures and CD mandates.
2. It was recommended the Department Confidential Informant Coordinators attend the LAPD Basic Law Enforcement Performance Auditor Course in order to enhance their fundamental understandings of risk management issues and quality control of informant packages.
 - Upon completion of the auditor course, the Department Confidential Informant Coordinator should be loaned to Audit Division for a minimum of three deployment periods. The loan would enable the skills learned in the auditor course to be put into practice, with the goal of building a solid base for quality control of informant packages.
3. It was recommended the Commanding Officer, Narcotics Division, contact the Commanding Officer, Audit Division, and arrange a training session by Audit Division personnel for all controlling officers, in which the findings of this audit are thoroughly discussed. Such training would provide controlling officers the insight as to what concerns and areas need to be fully addressed in order to bring informant packages into compliance with Department policies and procedures and CD mandates.

CATEGORICAL USE OF FORCE SYSTEMS AUDIT REPORT

Audit Division conducted an audit of Categorical Use of Force (CUOF) systems in accordance with the FY 2005/06 AAP.

The audit evaluated compliance with 14 separate CD ¶s and utilized five different populations.⁴ The primary population consisted of all CUOF incidents that occurred during September and October 2005.

Audit Division utilized a 95 percent compliance threshold to determine CD compliance. Of the 14 paragraphs evaluated, ten paragraphs exceeded the 95 percent confidence level, and four did not. The table on the following page summarizes the overall audit findings.

The four CD paragraphs that were less than 95 percent compliant are discussed below.

Consent Decree ¶55 (Requirement No. 4) FID Investigator Training Regarding CD ¶80

Force Investigation Division’s goal is to provide formal CD ¶80 training twice a year, which has not yet been accomplished. In the interim, FID ensures the following:

- A copy of CD ¶80 in its entirety is provided to all current and newly assigned personnel; and,
- New personnel are required to meet with their supervisor to discuss CD ¶80 requirements and the Department’s expectations for compliance with the CD mandates.

Regarding formalizing the process to document the training into TEAMS, FID is coordinating efforts with the Peace Officer Standards in Training (POST) Liaison Unit, Training Division, to develop a course code and title for data entry.

⁵ Paragraphs 56 and 147 both require notification to the Inspector General (IG): CD ¶56 requires “immediate” notification, and CD ¶147 requires “timely” notification.

Consent Decree ¶56 (Requirement No. 2) Immediate Notification to the COP, FID, and IG

All but one notification to the DCP was determined to be “immediate” as defined in the audit. The one noted delay was due to Department supervisory personnel who did not initially recognize the incident as a CUOF.

Consent Decree ¶62(a)

Consent Decree ¶62(a) requires Department managers to conduct an analysis of a supervisor’s response to a CUOF and to document and submit the analysis in an Interdepartmental Correspondence, Form 15.02, within one week (seven calendar days) of the incident. Of the 11 incidents examined, nine analyses were documented and submitted as required. Of the two remaining incidents; one analysis was completed, but was not submitted within the required week, four days late; and, one was not completed at all.

Consent Decree ¶67

To address the issue of untimely submission of CUOF investigations to the Police Commission (PC), the PC established a FID Committee that focused on the current backlog at FID and the delay in the completion and submission of CUOF investigations. The committee, comprised of the IG, PC Executive Director, and the C/O of Consent Decree Bureau, performed an assessment of FID systems, and the approval process and made several recommendations, all of which have been approved by the PC and forwarded to FID for implementation.

The committee asserted that implementation of the proposed recommendations would result in a significant improvement in FID processes and a reduction in the current backlog of cases awaiting PC review.

CATEGORICAL USE OF FORCE AUDIT REPORT

Pursuant to the CD and the Department’s AAP, AD completed an audit of CUOF investigations. The audit evaluated compliance of CUOF investigations with CD ¶s 57, 80(a, b, c, e, f and g), 82, 128, and 129.

The evaluated CD ¶s were categorized into 21 audit objectives. The population consisted of 24 CUOF investigations that had been completed (reviewed and approved by the Commanding Officer of FID) from November 3, 2005 through February 7, 2006.

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The overall evaluation of each audit objective with its corresponding CD ¶ is listed in the following table. (Note: all numbers are rounded to the nearest percentage.)

The five objectives (Objectives No. 4, 5, 16, 18, and 21) with compliance rates of less than 95 percent are discussed below.

Objective No. 4 – No Group Interviews (CD ¶80c)

Two (eight percent) of the 24 CUOF investigations included indications that a group interview had been conducted without documented justification.

Objective No. 5 – Interview On Scene Supervisors Regarding Their Conduct (CD ¶80e)

Two (eight percent) of the 24 CUOF investigations included indications that on scene supervisors were not interviewed regarding their conduct at the scene, and there was no documented justification.

Objective No. 16 – Underlying Action Conformed with Department Procedure [CD ¶128c(ii)]

Of 21 CUOF incidents tested for this objective, two (10 percent) appeared to be out of policy. Additionally, the UOFRB found these two incidents to be out of policy.

Objective No. 18 – Post-Incident Review [CD ¶128d(ii)]

Fifteen (63 percent) of the 24 CUOF investigations contained discrepancies that should have been identified and addressed in the review process.

Objective No. 21 – Adequacy of the Investigation (CD ¶129 c)

Thirteen (54 percent) of the 24 CUOF investigations did not meet the standards for this objective. The most frequent finding was the lack of documentation as to the reason witnesses identified in the investigation were not interviewed.

The following recommendations were made:

1. It was recommended that Force Investigations Division (FID) consider obtaining position authorities for Police Performance Auditor IIIs to supplement current staffing for its Quality Assurance Unit.
2. It was recommended that FID investigators continue to have discretion to determine whom to interview. However, when a decision is made not to interview a person identified as a witness, it is recommended that FID document the reason for not interviewing the person in the CUOF investigation report.

COMPLAINT, FORM 1.28, INVESTIGATIONS AUDIT – PHASE II

In accordance with the FY 2005/06 AAP, AD conducted an audit of Complaint, Form 1.28, Investigations to assess the Department's compliance with the requirements of the CD. The audit was conducted pursuant to CD ¶ 129, which states: "The LAPD shall conduct regular, periodic audits of random samples of...(iii) all Complaint Form 1.28 investigations."

The Department's compliance with the CD has improved over the past year. The audit conducted last year indicated that the Department was not compliant with CD ¶s 80f, 80g, 82, 84, and 129c. The specific areas of non-compliance included:

- Interviewing of witnesses;
- Witness statement inconsistencies;
- Initiation of complaints for additional misconduct;
- Dismissal of witness statements based upon familial and social relationships; and,
- The general consistency of paraphrased statements.

This year, the Department exhibited compliance in 15 of the 16 objectives reviewed. The Department was non-compliant with CD ¶80, and specifically, CD ¶80(a) and (b) as detailed below.

Consent Decree ¶80(a) – Tape Recording of Interviews

The Department was **not compliant** with CD ¶ 80(a). Although all of the 69 IAG investigations reviewed indicated that interviews were appropriately tape-recorded, tapes could not be located for seven (ten percent) of the 69 investigations, which placed the Department at a 90 percent compliance level.

It should be noted, however, that while compliance was not reached under this objective, the Department has improved significantly in the storage and accessibility of taped statements. There were 321 tapes identified in the 136 complaint investigations reviewed. All 321 tapes were requested, and 310 were obtained and reviewed. The remaining 11 tapes that were unavailable represented three percent of the total number of tapes associated with the investigations.

Consent Decree ¶80(b) – Canvassing and Interviewing of Witnesses/Complainants

The Department was **not compliant** with CD ¶80(b). Four (6 percent) of the 69 IAG investigations identified witnesses who may have significantly contributed to the investigations, but, were not interviewed. This placed the Department at a 94 percent compliance level.

Though not required by the CD, all Chain of Command (COC) complaint investigations were reviewed to assess whether interviews were conducted with all appropriate witnesses. Six COC investigations contained indications that conducting additional interviews may have significantly contributed to the quality of the investigation.

Alternative Complaint Resolution Findings

There were a number of issues noted in the complaints resolved through the Alternative Complaint Resolution (ACR) process, such as documentation issues and the applicability of the process. The ACR Guide does not offer clearly stated documentation requirements. However, in one of the frequently asked questions, the ACR Guide states that an entry should be made on the complaint's chronological record documenting the persons who attended the ACR session. Five (83 percent) of the six ACR investigations did not contain a chronological record from the Investigating Officer (I/O).

One recommendation was made and addressed the issues regarding investigations handled through the ACR process.

1. It was recommended that the ACR Guide be updated and require the inclusion of the I/O's chronological log and an entry that identifies the parties who were in attendance. Further, training materials should emphasize the requirement to tape-record the initial statements of the complainants when they agree to participate in the ACR process.

The following table reflects a summary of the compliance for the 16 CD paragraphs evaluated in the Complaint, Form 1.28, Investigations audit.

GED SELECTION CRITERIA/ELIGIBILITY

The purpose of the audit was to assess the Department's compliance with the mandates of CD ¶s 51(b and d), 106 (b, c and d), 107(a, b and c), and 131(b).

The audit tested officers' and sergeants' selections into GEDs, their suitability for the position, and that extensions for this limited tour assignment complied with CD mandates and Department policy. The time period tested for selection was DP No. 2, 2006 (February 5 through March 4), which included all personnel assigned to directly monitor or reduce gang activity. The time period tested for extension and current suitability was DP No. 4, 2005 through DP No. 2, 2006.

The audit population included all personnel assigned to directly monitor or reduce gang activity and included all Area GEDs, Community Law Enforcement and Recovery (CLEAR) Units, and personnel assigned to the Operations-South Bureau gang detail.

The following table summarizes the audit's findings by objective and describes each objective as it relates to the respective CD paragraph.

Methodology Change

A change in the methodology measuring the compliance rate for CD 107(b) contributed to the decrease in the compliance rate from 60% in the previous audit to 45% in this audit. However, as in prior audits, the Area commanding officers' late review of selection packages continued to be a factor in noncompliance.

The CD requires supervisors to use annual Performance Evaluation Reports to assist in evaluating the applicant for selection into a GED. Audit Division determined that for the controls suggested by the CD and Special Order No. 27 (which implemented this CD mandate into Department policy) to be relevant, AD needed to redefine the meaning of the "two most

recent" Performance Evaluation Reports. Past methodologies allowed for the most current Performance Evaluation Reports available to be considered at the time of selection. However, this practice allows for significant unevaluated periods of time, which AD considered a risk issue. Consequently, AD defined "two most recent" as the last two Performance Evaluation Reports due prior to the start of the selection process.

Audit Division has recommended that Planning and Research Division define the "two most recent" Performance Evaluation Reports as those immediately due prior to the start of the selection process. Audit Division has also recommended that the Office of Operations reinforce to its command officers the importance of reviewing and approving selection packages prior to the employee's selection into the GED.

Compliance Assessment of CD ¶107(c)

Compliance determination regarding CD ¶107(c) was withheld, as the sampled officers had not received any sustained complaints or adverse judicial findings related to those subjects specified in the CD, during their assignments to GEDs.

This is the third GED Selection Criteria in which a determination was withheld for this paragraph. Interviews with Bureau Gang Coordinators regarding this issue have indicated that it is possible that Area commanding officers are reassigning personnel from GED units as soon as a complaint involving use of force, false arrest or charge, unreasonable search and seizure, sexual harassment, discrimination, or dishonesty is sustained. Consequently, by the time an audit is conducted, the employee having received the sustained complaint or adverse judicial finding has been removed from the GED and the list of active GED personnel. Audit Division will establish a methodology to test for compliance with this CD paragraph in the next GED Selection Criteria Audit.

SUPERVISOR AND FIELD TRAINING OFFICER TRAINING (INCLUDE SEU)

In order to ensure compliance with CD ¶s 51(b), 114, 115, 116, 121, 122, and 123, the Department's AAP for FY 2005/2006 mandated an audit of the FTO Program and Supervisor Training. The purpose was to determine whether the Department was in compliance regarding FTO and supervisor training pursuant to the aforementioned CD ¶s.

The timeframe of June 26 through October 15, 2005, which coincided with Deployment Periods (DPs) 7, 8, 9, and 10, was selected for the audit. This timeframe was considered as a recent and reasonable period prior to the commencement of the audit and in consideration of available resources.

The following recommendations were made:

1. In order to ensure appropriate FTO training, as soon as a PO-3 transfers into a patrol division as an FTO, the training coordinator should be tasked with immediately reviewing the officer's TEAMS report to verify whether or not that PO-3 has been to the

approved FTO or FTO Update modules. The training coordinator should also ensure that a TEAMS Evaluation form and FTO Acknowledgement form is on file for each FTO. When training is lacking, the Area training coordinators should ensure that each PO-3 is immediately scheduled for the next 40-hour Basic FTO School or FTO Update modules.

2. It was recommended that supervisors be provided training for completing Personnel Evaluation Reports for FTOs with regard to the mandates of CD Paragraph 116. This training should be included in the FTO block (Section XVIII) of Supervisory School and annually in the third quarter of Standardized Quarterly Supervisor Training. This should also be incorporated into the Department's Roll Call Training plan. Also, Manual Section 3/760.20 is vague and needs to be revised to include the mandates of Consent Decree Paragraph 116.

INITIATION OF COMPLAINTS

Pursuant to the Department's AAP for FY 2005/06, Professional Standards Bureau conducted an audit to evaluate complaint intake methods and the distribution of complaint material to community entities pursuant to CD ¶s 74 (a, b, c, and e)

A query of the Compliant Information System identified a total of 1,498 complaints received during the Second Quarter of FY 2005/06, the selected time period. Each complaint was identified by source and origin in order to determine the method by which the complainant notified the Department

Consent Decree ¶s (a, b, c, and e) are provided herein for reference regarding scope. The Department shall continue to provide for the receipt of complaints as follows:

- *in writing or verbally, in person, by mail, by telephone (or Telecommunications Device for the Deaf), facsimile transmission, or by electronic mail;*
- *anonymous complaints ... ;*
- *at LAPD headquarters, any LAPD station or substation, or the offices of the Police Commission or the Inspector General ... and;*
- *distribution of the materials needed to file a complaint upon request to community groups community centers, and public and private service centers.*

The Department demonstrated compliance regarding CD ¶s 74 (a, b, and c). Regarding CD ¶74 (e), Internal Affairs Group considered a prior recommendation to establish a policy requiring documentation regarding complaint requests and determined the recommendation to be infeasible.

The Department's On-Line Unit was contacted and advised to remove the non-working facsimile telephone number published on the Department's website until further notice.

CONSENT DECREE PARAGRAPH 117 TRAINING

To ensure compliance with the attendance mandate of CD ¶117, the Department's AAP, FY 2005/06, mandated an audit of attendance to courses identified as containing the mandates of CD ¶117. The purpose of the audit was to assess how many officers completed mandated CD ¶117 coursework within the specified timeframe of April 01, 2005 through March 31, 2006. The audit was conducted in conjunction with the Training Content Interim Report, Third Quarter, FY 2005/06.

The audit time frame of April 01, 2005, through March 31, 2006, was selected to coincide with the mandated provision of regular and periodic training for CD ¶117.

The population for the audit was Department sworn personnel as of March 17, 2006. Department deployment figures were obtained via Information Technology Division. Officers who were sick and/or Injured on Duty (IOD) or on military leave for a period of 60 days or more, recruit officers, reserve officers, and civilians who took the courses, were omitted from the population count. The Department Deployment roster for DP 3-2206 was utilized for tracking attendance.

Training Division personnel queried the Department's Training Management System (TMS) to determine which courses Department personnel had taken to meet the mandates of CD ¶117. To achieve compliance, the TMS and attendance records shall indicate that greater than 94 percent of all sworn members of the Department received training on CD ¶117.

Attendance for all courses was analyzed on a daily basis throughout the last two months of the audit time period. Analyzing attendance allowed auditors, Quality Assurance Unit (QAU), Training Division (TD) personnel, to perform real-time projections and quantitative analysis of attendance needs, percentages of sick, IOD, and those on military leave in proportion to the Department's deployment. Auditors contacted the Divisional Training Coordinators and the Military Liaison Officer throughout the audit period for a count of all officers who were either on medical, IOD, or military leave. For the final determination of quantitative compliance, the auditors adjusted the population count for the training period by subtracting the most current counts for sick/IOD and military leave as reported by those offices.

The Department was compliant with the attendance mandate of CD ¶117. Auditors reviewed attendance records and verified that greater than 94 % of sworn Department employees completed courses identified as containing the mandates of CD ¶117. The Department used both hands-on courses and web-based training to train 8,067 (95.7%) of 8,428 sworn personnel pertaining to the attendance mandate of CD ¶117.

The 361 officers yet to receive the training were instructed to complete the CD ¶117 coursework through their training coordinators.

Note: There were 568 officers excluded from the population because they were either on vacation, sick, IOD, military leave, or other excused leave of absence. These officers, through their training coordinators, were encouraged to complete CD ¶117 mandated training upon return to duty.

SUPERVISORY PERFORMANCE EVALUATIONS

Pursuant to the FY 2005/06 AAP, Civil Rights Integrity Division (CRID) completed the Supervisory Performance Evaluations Audit to assess compliance with the mandates of CD ¶s 62, 70c, and 108i regarding documentation of manager analysis as reflected in supervisors' performance evaluations. Although not required by the AAP, the audit included an assessment of CD ¶ 54.

The Performance Evaluation Report Audit included in the AAP for FY 2005/06 was initially assigned to Personnel Group, but was reassigned to CRID.

Because the inspection standard was deemed reliable as the audit standard, the following three inspections, *Inspection of Sergeant Performance Evaluations*, *Inspection of Performance Evaluations - Detective Supervisors*, and *Inspection of Supervisor Performance Evaluations – Specialized Entities*, each dated January 2006, and corresponding working papers, were used as source documents.

Performance evaluations for sergeants and detectives were selected to assess whether manager analysis regarding CD mandates was documented. The time period assessed for sergeants encompassed performance evaluations due from June 30 through November 30, 2005. The time period assessed for detectives encompassed performance evaluations due from November 1, 2003 through October 31, 2004, and 2005 evaluations through November.

A total of 253 sergeants and detectives was identified as the population. Two samples were selected from the population: 1) a Department-wide sample of 88 sergeants; and, 2) all detectives assigned to Narcotics Division, 77th Street, Southeast, and Van Nuys Areas.

Table No. 8 reflects findings for manager's analysis in performance evaluations for sergeants and detectives as to each CD paragraph pursuant to the AAP.

Although not required by the AAP, the audit tested for completeness and timeliness of performance evaluations. Of 253 evaluations required, 173 (68%) had been completed. Of the 173, 140 (81%) were completed in a timely manner.

Table No. 9 on the following page reflects findings for CD ¶ 54 tests conducted outside of the requirements of the AAP.

The three inspections and supporting working papers contain recommendations addressing deficiencies found within the original inspections. Nine of these recommendations are relevant to the audit report. Three recommendations are directed at Consent Decree issues, including ensuring that performance evaluations document CD related performance criteria, and avoiding “boiler plate” or “canned” language. The remaining recommendations address improvements to tracking systems, training on the completion of performance evaluations with emphasis on the use and inclusion of comment cards, and a recommendation for an administrative re-evaluation of due dates for performance evaluations.

The Civil Rights Integrity Division has a formal process in place to track all recommendations contained in its inspections, and therefore will be tracking the nine recommendations relevant to the audit report.

GANG AWARENESS TRAINING

Pursuant to the CD, Special Operations Support Division (SOSD) in collaboration with the Bureau Gang Coordinators completed an audit of training received by GED personnel. The following paragraph established the standard for the audit

Paragraph 106a

The Bureau gang coordinators coordinate the Bureau-wide activities of these units, provide training and technical assistance, and are involved in coordinating and providing information for the audits of these units.

The audit assessed the completion of training by GED personnel, as documented within each randomly sampled employee’s TEAMS Training History and within the Divisional Employee Folder. The audit period was January through December 2005. Of the total population of 300 officers and 36 sergeants, a sample size of 80 officers and 34 sergeants was derived.

Course with mandated dates of completion

Of the six courses having mandated dates of completion, one course, Sexual Harassment for Supervisors, had a completion rate less than 94 percent. The required completion date for this

Auditors noted that some TEAMS records were not reflective of training received by employees, in that some completed training was not entered timely into employees' training histories. The following recommendations were made:

1. Gang Impact Team Officers in Charge and Area training coordinators should continue to monitor training of GED personnel to ensure they receive all mandated training by the deadlines set by the Quality Assurance Unit, Training Division.
2. Area training coordinators should effectively track GED training completion and ensure attendance is promptly entered into each employee's training history.
3. Gang Impact Team Officers In Charge are to ensure that all newly assigned GED personnel receive CAL/GANG training and have been tentatively scheduled with SOSD for the next available class

SPECIAL ORDER NO. 8

March 22, 2006

APPROVED BY THE BOARD OF POLICE COMMISSIONERS ON MARCH 21, 2006

SUBJECT: FORCE INVESTIGATION DIVISION - ESTABLISHED

PURPOSE: As a result of the Consent Decree between the City of Los Angeles and the United States Department of Justice, the Department established Critical Incident Investigation Division (CIID) as the entity responsible for investigating all Categorical Use of Force (CUOF) incidents. Although CIID was charged with conducting the administrative portion of CUOF investigations, the criminal probe and the investigation of alleged misconduct associated with the incident were conducted by other Department entities.

Conducting separate investigations of the same incident was well intentioned at the time CIID was established, but has since proven to be inefficient. The organizational separation has at times resulted in delays and inadequacies in the investigations, exposing the Department to criticism, and in some instances, non-compliance with the mandates of the Consent Decree.

An important factor in achieving full compliance with the Consent Decree relies on the Department's ability to conduct thorough, objective and timely CUOF investigations. To that end, this Order deactivates CIID and activates Force Investigation Division (FID) as the Department's sole entity responsible for investigating and reporting all aspects of a CUOF.

All previous references to CIID shall be replaced with FID. Upon its publication, the 2005 Department Manual made reference to FID but did not include the updated organization, functions and responsibilities. This Order updates the organization, functions and responsibilities of FID and supercedes all previously published references to CIID and FID.

PROCEDURE:

- I. **CRITICAL INCIDENT INVESTIGATION DIVISION - DEACTIVATED.**
Critical Incident Investigation Division is hereby deactivated.

March 22, 2006

- II. **FORCE INVESTIGATION DIVISION - ACTIVATED.** Force Investigation Division is activated and operates under the direction of the Commanding Officer, Professional Standards Bureau (PSB).
- III. **FORCE INVESTIGATION DIVISION - FUNCTIONS.** Force Investigation Division is responsible for investigating all aspects of CUOF incidents and any other investigation at the direction of the Chief of Police (COP). A CUOF is defined as:
- * An incident involving the use of deadly force by a Department employee;
 - * All uses of a carotid restraint control hold by a Department employee, including the use of a modified carotid, full carotid or locked carotid hold;
 - * All deaths while the arrestee/detainee is in the custodial care of the Department, commonly referred to as an in-custody death;
 - * A use of force incident resulting in death;
 - * A use of force incident resulting in an injury requiring hospitalization;
 - * All head strikes with an impact weapon (e.g., baton, flashlight, etc.);
 - * An incident in which a member of the public is bitten by a Department Canine and hospitalization is required (although investigated in the same manner as a CUOF, a canine bite is not considered a use of force); and,
 - * Incidents where the Department has agreed to conduct similar investigations for a non-Department entity, such as the Los Angeles Fire Department Arson Unit.

When an animal shooting and/or non-tactical accidental or negligent discharge of a firearm occurs, Area/divisional personnel shall notify FID and Real Time Analysis and Critical Response Division (RACR). Unless unusual circumstances exist, chain of command supervisors from the involved officer's Area/division will be directed to conduct the investigation.

- IV. **FORCE INVESTIGATION DIVISION - ORGANIZATION AND ASSIGNMENT.** Force Investigation Division is composed of:

- * Office of the Commanding Officer;
- * Criminal Investigation Section;
- * Administrative Investigation Section; and,
- * Investigative Support Section.

Sworn personnel assigned to FID shall be selected in accordance with Department Manual Section 3/763.70.

A. Force Investigation Division - Commanding Officer.

The Commanding Officer, FID, under the direction of the Commanding Officer, PSB, has line command over FID.

B. Criminal Investigation Section - Responsibilities.

When conducting a CUOF investigation, Criminal Investigation Section shall be responsible for:

- * Conducting the preliminary investigation of any crime associated with an incident for which FID has investigative responsibility;

Exception: In cases where the crime committed by the civilian suspect(s) is not against the involved officer (e.g., driving a stolen vehicle), Area detectives may, at the discretion of FID, be assigned the responsibility for investigating the criminal components of the case and conducting the related follow-up investigation. Additionally, at the discretion of the Commanding Officer, PSB, Robbery-Homicide Division may continue to investigate incidents where an employee is killed or seriously injured as a result of being the victim of, or suspect in a crime.

- * Conducting the criminal investigation, if appropriate, of the actions of the officer(s) involved in a CUOF incident;
- * Taking charge of the scene of a CUOF incident;
- * Interviewing civilian and non-involved Department employee witnesses;
- * Investigating any incident involving a sworn officer from an outside agency who uses deadly force within the City of Los Angeles; and,
- * Investigating any other incident at the direction of the COP.

C. Administrative Investigation Section -

Responsibilities. The Administrative Section shall be responsible for:

- * Liaising with Criminal Investigation Section during their investigation;

- * Conducting the compelled interviews and walk-throughs of involved officers;
- * Completion of the arrest, booking, reporting and investigative follow-up of a suspect involved in the CUOF incident;

Note: In order to protect statements which may be contained in an arrest report and were provided by victim officers involved in the CUOF incident, the Administrative Investigation Section shall handle the arrest and booking of civilian suspects, except in those cases where Robbery-Homicide Division or Area Detectives are responsible for the follow-up criminal investigation.

- * Completion of the administrative CUOF Report; and,
- * Presenting the findings of the CUOF investigation at Use of Force Review Board hearings.

D. Investigative Support Section - Responsibilities.

Investigative Support Section will be responsible for the following at the direction of the Commanding Officer, FID:

- * Tracking and reviewing all FID investigations;
- * Conducting quality assurance audits and research projects; and,
- * Providing investigative analysis and statistical information for FID investigations.

Additionally, the Officer in Charge, Investigative Support Section, will oversee administrative functions such as personnel, training and overtime.

V. FORCE INVESTIGATION DIVISION - SPECIAL DUTIES. Force Investigation Division is responsible for the following special duties:

- * Attending all autopsies resulting from incidents within their investigative responsibility;
- * Providing the Department of Justice, Bureau of Criminal Statistics, with written notification for each adult in-custody death within ten days of occurrence;
- * Providing the State of California Board of Corrections with written notification and all requested

- information for each in-custody death of a detained juvenile;
- * Maintaining files and reports pertaining to CUOF and animal shooting/non-tactical accidental or negligent discharge of a firearm investigations;
 - * Acting as a liaison with the District Attorney's Office and the Office of the Inspector General at the scene of a CUOF incident and throughout the investigation;
 - * Responding to Subpoena Duces Tecum requests and other court orders that pertain to FID criminal investigations and records; and,
 - * In all cases where an individual sustains a gunshot wound, and in other FID cases as appropriate, notifying Media Relations Section, Public Information Office.

VI. NOTIFICATIONS AND INVESTIGATIVE GUIDELINES.

A. Required Notifications Following a Categorical Use of Force Incident.

1. **Area Watch Commander/Incident Commander.** Upon learning that a CUOF has occurred, the Area watch commander/Incident Commander shall ensure that RACR Division is notified in addition to their commanding officer, the commanding officer of the Area of occurrence and the appropriate Bureau commanding officer. Guidelines for making this notification are clearly delineated in Department Manual Section 3/794.35.
2. **Real Time Analysis and Critical Response Division.** When contacted by the Area watch commander/Incident Commander that a CUOF incident has occurred, RACR shall make notifications to the following entities:
 - * Force Investigation Division (or the designated on-call FID team during non-business hours);
 - * Office of the Chief of Police or his designee;
 - * Chief of Staff;
 - * Office of the Inspector General on behalf of the Board of Police Commissioners;
 - * Commanding Officer, Professional Standards Bureau;

- * Los Angeles District Attorney's Office for those cases identified in the "roll-out" protocol governing such notifications; and,
- * Risk Management Group.

B. Categorical Use of Force Investigations.

1. **Response and Crime Scene Responsibilities.** Force Investigation Division shall be available to respond 24-hours a day to incidents for which it has investigative responsibility. Upon receiving notification of an incident, an FID investigator shall promptly respond to the scene.

When multiple investigating entities are present (i.e., Area detectives), the senior FID member present shall have overall command of the crime scene and the on-scene investigation. This does not preclude the Chief of Police or his designee from assuming command when there is a specific need to do so.

2. **Force Investigation Division Investigative Guidelines.** Force Investigation Division investigators shall follow established Department procedures for investigating all incidents for which it has investigative responsibility. Additionally, FID investigators shall:

- * Record all interviews (i.e., audio or video recording) of involved officers and witnesses (if not recorded, provide justification);

Note: Whenever possible, recorded interviews should include a complete record of the interview including a preamble and interview conclusion.

- * Interview civilian witnesses at locations and times convenient to the witnesses, whenever it is practical and appropriate;
- * Prohibit group interviews;

Note: If the subject of the use of force or a civilian witness was not interviewed separately, document that the witness (s) was

not interviewed separately along with an explanation.

- * Interview all involved supervisors (applies only to those actively involved in managing the scene) regarding their management of the scene during the incident;
- * Coordinate the collection and preservation of all appropriate evidence, including canvassing the scene to locate possible witnesses if appropriate;
- * Ensure that all officer's and suspect's injuries are photographed (if no photographs are taken provide an explanation why); and,
- * Identify and document all inconsistencies in officer and witness interview statements.

3. **Investigations Involving Allegations of Misconduct.** Whenever an FID investigation identifies an allegation(s) of misconduct, the officer in charge of the FID investigation shall ensure that a Personnel Complaint, Form 1.28, is completed in accordance with Department policy. The officer in charge of the FID investigation shall cause the COP, or his designee, and the Commanding Officer, PSB, to be notified regarding allegation(s) of serious misconduct.

4. **Test Firing of Firearms Used in Categorical Use of Force Incidents.** As part of Categorical Use of Force Investigation protocol, FID investigators will retain any firearm discharged by an officer during a CUOF incident so that ballistic testing of the firearm can be completed. The involved officer will receive a replacement firearm from FID until his/her firearm is returned. The firearm will be returned to the involved employee immediately after testing is completed.

In certain instances, it may be necessary to obtain all or portions of the involved officer's leather gear.

VII. **FORCE INVESTIGATION DIVISION - UNIT DESIGNATION.** The radio designation for the Commanding Officer, FID, shall

be identified by the word "commander" followed by "7D." All other FID personnel shall be identified by "7D" followed by the numerical designation assigned by the Commanding Officer, FID.

VIII. CORRESPONDENCE REFERENCE NUMBER, FORCE INVESTIGATION DIVISION. Force Investigation Division is assigned correspondence Reference Number 13.1. Official correspondence addressed to, or initiated by, FID shall bear the assigned reference number.

AMENDMENTS: All previous Volume 2 references to Force Investigation Division have been amended to reflect the recent Department Reorganization. For reference, the functions of Force Investigation Division are outlined in 2005 Department Manual Sections 2/255 - 2/255.20. In addition, this Order amends Sections 3/409.20, 3/794.10, 14, 20, 25, 30 and 32, 3/794.35-39, 3/796.01, 05 and 08, 4/110.20, 4/204.80, 4/214.50, 4/238.35-36, 4/245.05 and 11, 4/648.14, 5/030.50 and 5/080.96 of the Department Manual.

AUDIT RESPONSIBILITY: The Commanding Officer, PSB, shall monitor compliance with this directive in accordance with Department Manual Section 0/080.30.





SPECIAL ORDER NO. 14

SUBJECT: FORM 1.28.10 - DEACTIVATED, FORM 1.28.0 AND SPECIAL ORDER NO. 17, 2004 - REVISED

EFFECTIVE: IMMEDIATELY

PURPOSE: On November 3, 2005, the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals issued its decision in Chaker versus Crogan, 428 F.3d 1215 (9th Circuit 2005), holding Section 148.6(a)(2) Penal Code (PC) unconstitutional because it criminalizes only citizens knowingly making false statements against officers, and not citizens knowingly making false statements in favor of officers, during a complaint investigation.

PROCEDURE:

I. COMPLAINT ADVISORY.

Effective immediately, Department personnel shall not advise complainants, either in writing or verbally, that it is a crime to make false complaints against police officers, pursuant to Section 148.6(a)(2) PC.

II. COMPLAINT ADVISORY FORM, FORM 1.28.10 - DEACTIVATED.

The Complaint Advisory Form, is deactivated. The current Complaint Advisory Form shall be destroyed and placed in the divisional recycling bin.

III. COMPLAINT FORM, FORM 1.28.0 - REVISED.

The Complaint Form, Form 1.28.0, is revised by removing the check box used to indicate that the 148.6 (a)(2) PC advisory was given to the complainant.

A. Use of Form. The form shall be used to document all complaints, and a Complaint Form (CF) number shall be issued for each form.

B. Completion. The form shall be completed by a Department supervisor and approved by a commanding officer or chief investigator before the issuance of a CF number by Internal Affairs Group (IAG).

C. Distribution. The Complaint Form is a triplicate form set with a designated distribution as follows:

- 1 - Original, forwarded to the Commanding Officer, IAG, within two working days of complaint

April 21, 2006

initiation (or in the event of a weekend, the following business day)

- 1 - Copy, issued to complainant upon his/her initiation of an in-person complaint.
- 1 - Copy, mailed to complainant (with a CF number) by IAG.

3 - TOTAL

FORMS AVAILABILITY: The revised Complaint Form, Form 1.28.0, will be available for ordering from the Distribution Center, Department of General Services, in approximately 90 days. A copy of the form is attached for duplication and immediate use. This form may also be downloaded and printed from the Chief's page, under LAPD Reference.

AMENDMENTS: This Order amends Department Manual Sections 3/811.05 and 3/816.01, and deletes Department Manual Sections 5/1.28.10 and 3/814, from the Department Manual.

AUDIT RESPONSIBILITY: The Commanding Officer, Professional Standards Bureau, shall monitor compliance with this directive in accordance with Department Manual Section 0/080.30.

Preliminary Case Screening

- The complaint, as stated, would not amount to the commission of a felony or misdemeanor crime.
- The complaint, as stated, may not result in discipline against the employee, or the complained of act or omission by the employee has no nexus to the employee's position with the Department.
- The complaint does not allege any of the following: Unauthorized force; discrimination of any kind; unlawful search and/or unlawful seizure of person or property; dishonesty; domestic violence; improper/illicit use of alcohol, narcotics, or drugs; sexual misconduct; theft; or retaliation/retribution against another employee. Exception: When a complaint is clearly exonerated or unfounded at the time it is initiated, the complaint may be handled as a Non-Disciplinary complaint.
- The complaint was not as a result of concerns arising out of a criminal prosecution, or, dismissal of California Penal Code Section 148 charges, or, otherwise initiated by a judge or prosecutor acting in their official capacity.
- The accused employee has no apparent pattern of similar behavior (should generally be limited to the past five years) for which he/she is accused.
- The complaint was not initiated in response to civil suits or claims for damages involving on-duty conduct and civil lawsuits regarding off-duty conduct required to be self-reported by employees.

All boxes in the preliminary case screening must be marked for classification as Non-Disciplinary.

COMPLAINT ADVISORY INFORMATION

According to California State law, you have the right to make a complaint against a police officer for any improper police conduct. California law requires this agency to have a procedure to investigate community complaints. You have a right to a written description of this procedure. This agency may find after investigation that there is not enough evidence to warrant action on your complaint. Even if that is the case, you have the right to make the complaint and have it investigated if you believe an officer behaved improperly. Complaints and any reports or findings relating to complaints must be retained by this agency for at least five years.

HOW TO MAKE A COMPLAINT. You may make a complaint in person or by calling or writing to any Los Angeles police station or administrative facility. If you write, your complaint does not have to be on any special form. When you make a complaint in person, please ask to speak to a supervisor who can assist you. If you choose to call in your complaint, you may dial toll-free, (800) 339-6868, which is the Internal Affairs Hotline, staffed 24-hours a day. Complaints will also be accepted via facsimile, or electronically via the LAPD website, www.LAPDonline.org. If you choose to file a complaint using a

Complaint Form, forms are available at police facilities, City Council field offices, at the Police Commission, 150 N. Los Angeles Street, and at the Inspector General's office, 201 N. Figueroa Street. At a minimum, your complaint should include important facts, such as where the incident occurred, date and time of occurrence, and the name(s) of the involved employee(s), if known. Postage-paid envelopes are also available.

ALTERNATIVE COMPLAINT RESOLUTION. The Department offers an alternative approach to resolving public complaints through discussions between the complainant, the involved employee(s) and/or the assigned supervisor, with the goal of arriving at a mutual understanding. If this approach to resolving your complaint interests you, please mention it to the supervisor taking your complaint.

WHAT HAPPENS AFTER THE COMPLAINT IS MADE? A Department supervisor will investigate your complaint. The investigation will be assigned to a local police station or to Internal Affairs. The accused employee's commanding officer will review the investigation and render a finding. The findings are reviewed at several other levels, including Internal Affairs. The Chief of Police

will make the final determination on any discipline imposed. You will be notified in writing of the outcome of the findings. We ask your patience, as the process is lengthy but necessary to ensure fairness and thoroughness.

WHAT IF YOU DON'T LIKE THE OUTCOME OF THE INVESTIGATION? Your reply letter will explain the general findings of the investigation and whether any discipline was imposed. Discipline can vary in severity and is not appropriate for every incident. Your reply letter will include the name of the commanding officer who rendered the findings. You may call the commanding officer, or you may also contact the Inspector General of the Police Commission, who is responsible for auditing the Department's discipline system. The Inspector General's office may be reached at (213) 202-5866. The address is 201 N. Figueroa Street, Suite 610, Los Angeles, 90012. When discussing your complaint with any member of the Department, please refer to the Complaint File (CF) number in the upper right corner of this receipt. If the CF number is not issued at the time you make the complaint, it will be mailed to you at the address you provide.

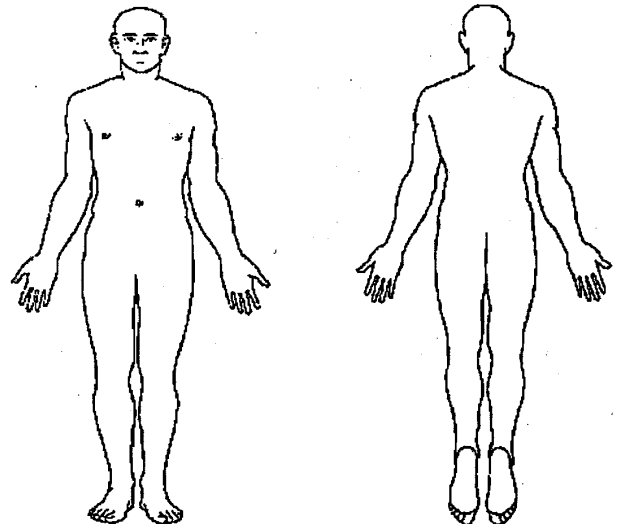

PERSONNEL COMPLAINT INFORMATION

HOW TO MAKE A COMPLAINT OF MISCONDUCT AGAINST AN EMPLOYEE

The purpose of this pamphlet is to explain the complaint process of the Los Angeles Police Department. Anyone who feels that an employee has acted improperly should bring the matter to the attention of a Department supervisor. The allegation will be investigated and appropriate action taken. It is through this process that the individual can help maintain the high standards of quality that the Department demands and the Community deserves.

WHERE AND HOW TO FILE A COMPLAINT

You may make a complaint in person at any Los Angeles police station, Internal Affairs Group, located at 304 South Broadway, Los Angeles, CA 90012, the Police Commission, at 150 N. Los Angeles Street, Los Angeles, CA, 90012 or the Office of the Inspector General, at 201 North Figueroa Street, Suite 610, Los Angeles, CA 90012, regardless of where the incident occurred. If you do not wish to make a complaint in person, you may obtain a "Complaint of Employee Misconduct" form from any Los Angeles police station, the Police Commission, the Office of the Inspector General or any City Council field office. If you are unable to obtain a form at any of these locations, you may call our 24-hour, toll free number, 1-800-339-6868, TDD phone number (213) 485-3604 to file a complaint or request the "Complaint of Employee Misconduct" form.

are very time consuming and involved processes. Please be patient. After the complaint has been thoroughly investigated and the appropriate action taken, you will be notified in writing of the results.

INVOLVEMENT OF THE HEAD OF THE POLICE DEPARTMENT

The Board of Police Commissioners routinely monitors investigations of employee misconduct to ensure that complaints are properly investigated and adjudicated.

The Board of Police Commissioners is the head of the Police Department. The Board is made up of five members from the community appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by the City Council.

CRIMINAL CHARGES AND THE COURT

Many times people who have been arrested feel that they are not guilty of the charge. However the validity of the arrest and the guilt or innocence of the person involved must be determined by a Court of Law, not the Police Department. Only the Court is empowered by law to adjudicate such matters. A court proceeding provides an impartial forum in which both sides of the case can be heard and the truth determined.

If you feel more comfortable making your complaint in writing, you may send a letter directly to Internal Affairs Group, the Office of the Chief of Police or the Board of Police Commissioners. Any of these offices will be able to assist you. The mailing address for Internal Affairs Group, is 304 South Broadway, Los Angeles, CA 90012, the mailing address for the Police Commission, is 150 N. HOW A FORMAL PERSONNEL COMPLAINT IS HANDLED

After filing, a formal personnel complaint will be investigated by either a supervisor from the division of occurrence or a supervisor assigned to Internal Affairs Group. Once the complaint has been thoroughly investigated, the Captain of the investigating division will review the entire complaint and render a finding.

Your complaint will then be reviewed at several additional levels to ensure that nothing has been overlooked. A Commander or Deputy Chief will examine your complaint, as well as the recommendations made by the Captain prior to the final approval by the Chief of Police.

Investigation of a personnel complaint and the subsequent review of the investigation (including the administration of discipline against a Department employee when warranted)

Ang Internal Affairs Group ay matatagpuan sa 304 South Broadway. Ang Police Commission ay matatagpuan sa Parker Center, 150 North Los Angeles Street. Ang Office of the Inspector General ay matatagpuan sa 201 North Figueroa Street, Suite 610. Kung ayaw mong personal na magsampa ng reklamo, maaari kang kumuha ng pormang "Reklamo tungkol sa Masamang Asal ng Empleyado" mula sa alinmang himpilan ng pulis sa Los Angeles, Police Commission, Office of the Inspector General, o sa alinmang City Council field office (panlabas na opisina ng Konseho ng Siyudad). Kung hindi ka makakakuha ng porma sa alinmang mga lugar na nabanggit, maaari mong tawagan ang

PAANO PINAMAMAHALAN ANG ISANG PORMAL NA REKLAMO TUNGKOL SA EMPLEYADO

Matapos magsampa ng pormal na reklamo tungkol sa empleyado, ito'y iimbestigahan ng superbisor mula sa pangkat ng lugar na pinangyarihan o ng isang superbisor na nakatalaga sa Internal Affairs Group. Matapos na lubusang maimbestigahan ang reklamo, rerepasuhin ng Kapitan ng nag-iimbestigang pangkat ang buong reklamo at magbibigay ito ng resulta ng imbestigasyon.

Pagkatapos ay rerepasuhin ang iyong reklamo ng ilan pang mga kahanay na lugar upang siguraduhing

walang nakaligtaan. Susuriin ng isang Commander (Tagapag-utos) o Deputy Chief (Deputadong Puno) ang iyong reklamo, gayon din ang mga rekomendasyon na ginawa ng Kapitan, bago ibigay ang panghuling pagsang-ayon ng Chief of Police.

Ang imbestigasyon ng reklamo tungkol sa empleyado at ang kasunod na pagrepeaso ng nasabing imbestigasyon (kasama na ang pagsasagawa ng disiplina laban sa empleyado ng Departamento, kung may dahilan) ay nangangailangan ng maraming panahon at ng mga pamamaraan. Kinakailangan lamang ang iyong pasyensiya. Matapos lubusang maimbestigahan ang reklamo, at matapos naisagawa ang nararapat na hakbang, ipaalam sa iyo ang mga resulta sa pamamagitan ng isang sulat.

PAANO KUMIKILOS ANG PUNO NG DEPARTAMENTO NG PULISYA

Palagiang sinusubaybayan ng Board of Police Commissioners ang mga imbestigasyon ng mga masamang asal ng empleyado upang siguruhin na ang mga reklamo ay tamang naimbestigahan at napagpasyahan.

Ang Board of Police Commissioners ay ang puno ng Departamento ng Pulisya. Ang Board ay binubuo ng limang kasapi mula sa komunidad na itinalaga ng Alkalde at kinumpirma ng Konseho ng Siyudad.

MGA SAKDAL NA KRIMINAL AT ANG HUKUMAN

Kadalasan, naniniwala ang mga taong naaresto na sila'y walang kasalanan sa kaso. Gayunman, ang pagpapatunay ng aresto at ng kasalanan o pagiging inosente ng taong nasasangkot ay kinakailangang matiyak ng Hukuman ng Batas, hindi ng Departamento ng Pulisya. Ang Hukuman lamang ang binigyang kapangyarihan ng batas na magpasiya sa mga ganitong bagay. Ang paglititis ng hukuman ay nagbibigay ng walang pinapanigang pag-uusap kung saan ang bawat panig ng kaso ay mapapakinggan at ang katotohanan ay malalaman.

職員苦情データ

不正行為を行なった職員に対する苦情申し立て方法

この冊子はロサンゼルス警察の苦情処理の説明を目的として作成されています。不相応な振る舞いをしたと思われる職員に対し、統括指揮者が注意を向けられるよう協力してください。その申し立てには適切な措置で調査されます。各個人がこの過程を行うことで担当部門の要求や地域社会にふさわしい高い基準を維持することができます。

苦情申し立てと申し立て先について

その出来事が起きた場所に拘らず、本人が警察の各派出所、内政団体、警察本部、あるいは監査局へ出向いて苦情申し立てすることができます。内政団体の所在地は、304 South Broadway (南大通り 304) です。警察本部所在地は、Parker Center, 150 North Los Angeles Street (北ロサンゼルス通り、パーカーセンター 150) です。監査局所在地は、201 North Figueroa Street, Suite 610 (北フィグエロア通り 201、スイート 610) です。直接苦情申し立てをしたくない場合は「職員不正行為申立書」用紙をロサンゼルス警察の各派出所、警察本部、あるいは監査局や市議会議会出張所などから入手してください。これらの所在地から入手不可能な場合は、24 時間のフリーダイヤル、

1-800-339-6868、TDD (聾啞者用通信機器) 番号、(213) 485-3604 へ電話し、苦情申し立て、あるいは「職員不正行為申立書」用紙を要求してください。用紙記入した時点で FAX 番号 (213) 978-6565 にて苦情申し立てすることができます。

書面の方が安心感を高めるという方は、内政団体や警察署長、あるいは警察委員会へ直接送付してください。このような組織が援助してくれます。これら 3 つの団体の送付先は、150 North Los Angeles Street, Los Angeles, California, 90012 (90012 カリフォルニア州ロサンゼルス市、北ロサンゼルス通り 150) です。また監査局へ直接送付することもできます。送付先は、201 North Figueroa Street, Suite 610, Los Angeles, California, 90012 (90012 カリフォルニア州ロサンゼルス市、北フィグエロア通り 201、スイート 610) です。さらに、ウェブサイト www.lapdonline.org の電子フォームから E-mail 経由でも申し立て可能です。書き方に決まりはありません。あなたの一番安心する方法でその事実をお聞かせください。ただし重要要素を含めてください。例えばその出来事が起きた場所、日付と時間、職員名などが必要となります。

職員苦情処理形式について

申し立て提出後、その出来事が発生した部署の統括者、あるいはその統括者が任命した内政団体のどちらかが調査します。徹底的に

苦情調査した後、調査部署の警部が苦情を包括的に再調査し、結果を提出します。

何 1 つ見落とすことがないよう、数回に渡る再調査の時点で追加水準を裏付けます。総括者、あるいは副責任者が苦情調査するだけではなく、統括者が推薦状を作成し、警察署長が事前に最終決定を下します。

職員の苦情調査とそれに続く再調査 (行政の規律に反した際は部門職員を含む) は、多大な時間を要し非常に複雑です。忍耐強く待ってください。苦情を完全に調べ終え適切に対応をした後、書面にて結果をお知らせします。

警視総監の関与について

苦情を適切に調査、及び判決が下されるために、警察委員会が随時職員の不正行為の取調べを監視します。警察委員会とは警視庁総監のことです。議会は市長と市議会の支持によって地域社会で任命された 5 名で構成されます。

刑事責任と裁判所

何度も逮捕された人は有罪判決になるのではないかと感じます。たとえ正当な逮捕であったとしても、その関係者が有罪か無罪かを決定するのは、警察ではなく裁判所です。裁判所が唯一法律で裁く権利を持っているところであり、原告・被告の両意見を聞き、真実を調査する公平な場とします。

CHI TIẾT VỀ VIỆC KHIẾU NẠI NHÂN VIÊN

CÁCH KHIẾU NẠI VỀ HÀNH VI XẤU CỦA NHÂN VIÊN

Tập tài liệu này có mục đích giải thích tiến trình khiếu nại tại Sở Cảnh Sát Los Angeles. Bất cứ ai cảm thấy một nhân viên cảnh sát có hành động thiếu đứng đắn đều cần trình vấn đề này với một giám thị Cảnh Sát. Cáo buộc sẽ được điều tra và biện pháp thích ứng sẽ được thực hiện. Qua tiến trình này cá nhân nào cũng có thể giúp duy trì tiêu chuẩn phẩm chất cao do Sở Cảnh Sát đòi hỏi và Cộng Đồng đáng được hưởng.

KHIẾU NẠI Ở ĐẦU VÀ BẢNG CÁCH NÀO

Quý vị có thể đích thân khiếu nại tại bất cứ trạm cảnh sát nào, Nhóm Đặc Trách Nội Vụ, Ủy Ban Cảnh Sát, hoặc Văn Phòng Tổng Thanh Tra, bất kể trường hợp đó xảy ra ở đâu. Nhóm Đặc Trách Nội Vụ và Ủy Ban Cảnh Sát đặt trụ sở tại Parker Center, 150 North Los Angeles Street. Văn Phòng Tổng Thanh Tra đặt tại 201 North Figueroa Street, Suite 610. Nếu không muốn đích thân khiếu nại quý vị có thể xin một mẫu đơn "Khiếu Nại về Hành Vi Xấu của Nhân Viên" tại bất cứ trạm Cảnh Sát Los Angeles nào, Ủy Ban Cảnh Sát, Văn Phòng Tổng Thanh Tra hoặc bất cứ văn phòng nào của Hội Đồng Thành Phố. SỰ THAM GIA CỦA HỘI ĐỒNG QUẢN TRỊ CẢNH SÁT

Hội đồng Quản Trị Cảnh Sát thường xuyên theo dõi các cuộc điều tra về hành vi xấu của nhân viên để bảo đảm rằng khiếu nại được điều tra và xét xử đúng mức.

Hội Đồng Quản Trị Cảnh Sát là thành phần đầu não của Sở Cảnh Sát. Hội Đồng này gồm có năm ủy viên từ cộng đồng do Thị Trưởng bổ nhiệm và được Hội Đồng Thành Phố đồng thuận.

KẾT ÁN HÌNH SỰ VÀ TÒA ÁN

Nhiều khi những người bị bắt giam cảm thấy rằng họ không phạm tội như bản án của họ. Tuy nhiên, vấn đề bắt giam, có tội hoặc vô tội của người can hệ phải do Tòa Án xác định, chứ không phải là Sở Cảnh Sát. Chỉ có Tòa Án mới được luật pháp ủy quyền xét xử những vấn đề như vậy. Phiên tòa là một diễn đàn vô tư để đôi bên của vụ án có thể trình bày và sự thật được xác định.

Nếu cảm thấy viết thư khiếu nại dễ dàng hơn, quý vị có thể gửi thư trực tiếp cho Nhóm Đặc Trách Nội Vụ, Văn Phòng Cảnh Sát Trưởng, hoặc Hội Đồng Ủy Viên Cảnh Sát. Bất cứ một văn phòng nào trong số những nơi kể trên đều sẽ có thể giúp quý vị. Địa chỉ gửi thư cho cả ba văn phòng đó là 150 North Los Angeles Street, Los Angeles, California 90012. Quý vị cũng có thể gửi thư thẳng cho Văn Phòng Tổng Thanh Tra tại số 201 North Figueroa Street, Suite 610, Los Angeles, California, 90012. Các than phiền cũng có thể gửi qua điện thư dưới dạng điện tử hiện có tại mạng lưới www.lapdonline.org. Quý vị không phải theo một hình thức nào cả; quý vị có thể kể lại câu chuyện của quý vị theo cách quý vị cảm thấy dễ dàng nhất. Tuy nhiên, quý vị phải ghi rõ những dữ kiện quan trọng, chẳng hạn như biển số đó xảy ra ở đâu, ngày và giờ nào, (các) tên họ của (những) nhân viên liên hệ, nếu có.

CÁCH GIẢI QUYẾT ĐƠN KHIẾU NẠI CHÍNH THỨC VỀ NHÂN VIÊN

Sau khi nộp đơn, khiếu nại chính thức về nhân viên sẽ được một giám thị của phân ban nơi xảy ra biển cố hoặc một giám thị được chỉ định vào Nhóm Đặc Trách điều tra nội vụ. Sau khi điều tra cận kề, Trưởng nhóm điều tra sẽ duyệt xét toàn bộ vấn đề khiếu nại và đưa ra kết quả.

Đơn khiếu nại của quý vị sau đó sẽ được duyệt xét thêm ở một vài cấp nữa để bảo đảm không sơ sót một chi tiết nào. Một Chỉ Huy Trưởng hoặc Phụ Tá Cảnh Sát Trưởng sẽ xem xét đơn khiếu nại của quý vị, cũng như những đề nghị từ trưởng nhóm trước khi xin chấp thuận sau cùng của Cảnh Sát Trưởng.

Việc điều tra đơn khiếu nại về một nhân viên và cuộc duyệt xét tiếp theo của cuộc điều tra (kể cả việc áp dụng biện pháp kỷ luật đối với một nhân viên Sở Cảnh Sát, khi cần) là những tiến trình rất tốn thời giờ và phức tạp. Xin quý vị hãy kiên nhẫn.

投訴職員資料

怎樣去對一個行為不檢的雇員作出投訴？

此冊子的目的是解釋洛杉磯警察局投訴過程。任何人如感到一位雇員的行為有所不檢，應該向其所在的內的上司指出問題的存在，所作出的控告將會被調查和採取適當的行動，只有此過程才可以幫助個人對警局最高素質和社區所應得到的服務有所保障。

怎樣去提出投訴？

不管事件是在那裡發生，你可以親自向任何警局內部事務部和警察委員提出投訴，內部事務部和警察委員的地址為柏克中心，一百五十號，洛杉磯街，如果你不想親自作出投訴，你可以到任何洛杉磯警局、警察委員或市議員辦事處索取「雇員行為不檢投訴表」。如果你不能夠在以上地點索取此表格，你可以使用二十四小時電話：1-800-339-6868 作出投訴或用此電話索取「雇員行為不檢投訴

表」。

如果你覺得用寫的方式作出投訴比較方便，你可以把信直接寄到內部事務部、警察局長辦公室或警察委員會，以上任何一個辦公室都可以幫助你。以上三個辦公室的地址是一百五十號，北洛杉磯街，洛杉磯，加利福尼亞州，郵政區號碼九 00 一二，信上並沒有有一定的格式，你只需要把事件的經過用你認為最方便的方式描寫出來，但是你一定要包括最重要的事實之內。例如：事件發生地點、日期、時間和雇員的姓名。

雇員的投訴是怎樣處置？

提出投訴之後，投訴將會由事件發生的所在地的上司或內部事務部作出調查，投訴在被徹底的調查之後，調查部的警長將會詳細的檢閱整個投訴和作出決定。

你的投訴然後會再由其他幾層人員過目以保證沒有漏掉任何資料，在警察局長審核之前，指揮官或者副警局長將會檢閱你的投訴和警長的提議。

調查一件雇員投訴事件和調查後的檢閱（包括受行政處分的雇員）是需要很長的時間和不同的步驟，請耐

心等待。投訴在經過詳細調查和採取適當的行動之後，你將會收到書面的通知。

警局領袖的角色

警察委員會經常注意調查雇員行為不檢的經過以擔保投訴受到適當的調查和審核。警察委員會是警局的領袖，委員會是由五位社區人士組成，由市長指派市議會認可。

刑事罪和法庭

很多時候當人們被逮捕之後感到他們是沒有罪的，但是被逮捕之後清白或有罪是由法庭來決定，並不是警察局，只有法庭在法庭上才有權對這問題作出判決，法庭的過程是由雙方把案件提出然後定出真理。

INFORMACIÓN SOBRE QUEJAS CONTRA EMPLEADOS POLICIALES

COMO PRESENTAR UNA QUEJA DE MALA CONDUCTA CONTRA EMPLEADOS POLICIALES

El propósito de este folleto es explicar el proceso para iniciar una queja dirigida al Departamento de Policía de Los Angeles. Toda persona que piense que un empleado policial actuó manera incorrecta o injusta, debe presentar su queja a un supervisor del Departamento. La alegación será investigada y se resolverá justamente. Es a través de este proceso que la comunidad puede ayudar al Departamento a mantener el alto nivel de servicio que el Departamento exige y la Comunidad merece.

DÓNDE Y CÓMO HACER LA DENUNCIA

Usted puede hacer su denuncia en persona en cualquier estación de policía (comisaría), en la División de Asuntos Internos (Internal Affairs Group), o en la oficina del Comisionado de Policía, sin importar donde ocurrió el incidente. La dirección de la División de Asuntos Internos es: 304 South Broadway. La dirección de la oficina del Comisionado de Policía es: Parker Center, 150 North Los Angeles Street. La oficina del Inspector General está situada en 201 North Figueroa Street, Suite 610. Si no desea hacer su queja en persona, puede obtener un formulario en Español, "Queja de Mala Conducta del Empleado Policial" en cualquier estación de policía (comisaría) de Los Angeles, en la oficina del Comisionado de Policía o en la oficina de su concejal. Si por alguna razón no puede obtener

este formulario en los lugares mencionados, puede llamar gratis a cualquier hora al 1-800-339-6868, o al sistema TDD (213) 485-3604, para presentar su queja o solicitar el formulario. Una vez que lo haya completado, tiene la opción de enviar la queja por fax al (213) 978-6565.

Si usted se siente mas cómodo presentando su queja por escrito, puede enviarla por correo directamente a la Oficina de Asuntos Internos, a la Oficina del Jefe de Policía o a la Junta de Comisionados de Policía. La dirección de estas tres oficinas es: 150 North Los Angeles Street, Los Angeles, California, 90012. No hay una manera determinada para presentar una queja. Puede explicar lo ocurrido de la manera más cómoda para usted pero, tenga en cuenta que deberá incluir los detalles importantes, como: dónde ocurrió el incidente, la fecha, hora y nombre del oficial o empleado civil de policía involucrado, si está disponible.

COMO SE PROCESA UNA QUEJA FORMAL

Después de presentar su queja, un supervisor de la división donde ocurrió el incidente, o un investigador asignado a la División de Asuntos Internos, investigará el caso. Una vez que el caso se haya investigado en detalle, el Capitán del área lo revisará para determinar sus meritos del caso y presentar sus conclusiones.

Luego su queja será revisada por niveles adicionales para asegurar que los detalles del caso estén completos. A continuación un Comandante o Subjefe examinará su queja y también las recomendaciones del Capitán de área, antes de la aprobación definitiva del Jefe de Policía.

La investigación de una queja personal y el examen de dicha investigación (así como la aplicación de medidas disciplinarias contra un empleado del Departamento, si lo merece) son procesos complicados que consumen mucho tiempo. Por favor tenga paciencia. Una vez que se termine la detallada investigación, y se tome la acción apropiada y justa, usted recibirá una notificación por escrito de los resultados.

FUNCIÓN DE LA DIRECCIÓN SUPERIOR DEL DEPARTAMENTO DE POLICÍA: LA JUNTA DE COMISIONADOS DE POLICÍA

Es rutina de la Junta de Comisionados de policía controlar las investigaciones de mala conducta para garantizar que las quejas sean investigadas debidamente y reciban el fallo o decisión apropiado.

La Junta de Comisionados de Policía encabeza el Departamento de Policía. Se compone de hasta 5 miembros de la comunidad nombrados por el Alcalde y confirmados por el Concejo Municipal.

CARGOS CRIMINALES Y EL TRIBUNAL DE JUSTICIA

Muchas veces las personas que han sido arrestadas no se creen culpable. Sin embargo, la validez del arresto y la culpabilidad o inocencia de la persona la determina el Tribunal, no la Policía. Únicamente el Tribunal tiene el poder de fallar en tales cuestiones. El procedimiento judicial es el único que proporciona un foro imparcial donde se pueden escuchar las dos partes de la causa y determinar la verdad.

서면으로 신고서를 제출하는 것이 더 편리하실 경우에는, 편지를 직접 LAPD 본부 내사과나 경찰국장 사무실(Office of the Chief of Police) 또는 경찰위원회(Board of Police Commissioners) 앞으로 보내실 수 있습니다. 이 중 어떤 사무실에서든지 귀하를 도와드릴 것입니다. 세 사무실 모두 150 North Los Angeles Street, Los Angeles, California 90012 를 우편주소로 사용합니다. 조사관 사무실로 직접 편지를 보내셔도 됩니다: 201 North Figueroa Street, Suite 610, Los Angeles, California 90012. www.lapdonline.org 웹사이트에서 나와 있는 전자 양식을 통해 신고서를 이메일로 접수할 수도 있습니다. 정해진 형식은 없습니다. 가장 편한 방식으로 귀하의 사건경위를 말씀하시면 됩니다. 하지만, 반드시 사건발생장소·사건날짜 및 시간 및 가능한 한 관련된 직원(들)의 이름을 적어 주십시오.

<직원에 대한 정식신고의 처리방법>

접수된 신고는 사건이 일어난 해당부서의 수퍼바이저나 내사과로 지정된 수퍼바이저에서 수사에 착수하게 됩니다. 철저한 조사를 마친 후, 수사과장(Captain)이 신고서 전체내용을 검토하여 발전사실을 제공합니다.

귀하의 신고는 그런 후에 간과된 사실이 없도록 하기 위하여 몇몇 추가 레벨에서 검토하게 됩니다. 경찰서장(Commander)이나 부경찰국장(Deputy Chief)이 경찰국장이

최종승인을 내리기 전 수사과장이 권장한 내용뿐 아니라 귀하의 신고사항을 검토하게 됩니다.

직관관련 항의에 대한 조사 및 그 조사에 대한 차후 검토(정당한 근거가 있는 경우, 경찰국 직원에 대한 징계를 포함)는 매우 많은 시간이 소요되며 절차가 복잡합니다. 인내심을 갖고 기다려 주십시오. 신고사항이 철저히 조사된 후에는, 적절한 조치가 취해지며 그 결과에 대한 서면통지를 받으시게 됩니다.

<경찰국내 최상급기관의 역할>

경찰위원회(Board of Police Commissioner)는 민원신고에 대한 조사와 시정이 잘 이루어지고 있는지 정기적으로 수사상황을 점검, 수사의 감시기능을 맡게 됩니다.

경찰위원회는 경찰국의 최상급기관입니다. 위원회는 LA 시장의 지명으로 시의회 승인을 거친 5 인의 커뮤니티 구성원으로 이루어집니다.

<형사입건 및 범원>

많은 경우 체포된 사람들은 그 혐의에 대해 무죄라고 생각합니다. 그러나, 체포의 정당성 및 연루된 자의 유·무죄 여부는 반드시 경찰국이 아닌 법원에서 결정할 문제입니다. 법원만이 법에 따라 판결할 권한이 있습니다. 범원의 소송절차는 사건의 양측에 대한 심리를 걸쳐 진실을 판결하는 공정한 포럼을 제공하게 됩니다.


SUBJECT: MEDICAL TREATMENT FOR SUSPECTS SUBSEQUENT TO THE APPLICATION OF A CAROTID RESTRAINT CONTROL HOLD

Recently, the Use of Force Review Board has reviewed several Categorical Use of Force incidents involving the application of the Carotid Restraint Control Hold (CRCH). The review revealed the necessity for the Department to remind officers of their responsibilities as it relates to medical treatment for a suspect whom the CRCH was utilized.

Whenever a CRCH is used, **a physician at a contract hospital or jail dispensary shall**, when practical, examine the suspect. If the suspect is **rendered unconscious and fails to regain consciousness immediately, officers shall request a rescue ambulance.** (Training Bulletin, Use of Force Carotid Restraint Control Hold, Volume XXXVII, Issue 1, August 2005.)

It is the responsibility of all Department employees who become aware that a CRCH has been utilized to ensure that proper medical treatment is obtained for the suspect as outlined in the above-mentioned Training Bulletin.

SUBJECT: TRAINING UPDATE SUBSEQUENT TO A CATEGORICAL USE OF FORCE, ANIMAL SHOOTING, NON-TACTICAL/ACCIDENTAL OR NEGLIGENT DISCHARGE OF A FIREARM

PURPOSE: Department personnel who *substantially* participate in a Categorical Use of Force (CUOF), animal shooting, non-tactical/accidental or negligent discharge of a firearm shall receive a **training update**.

The purpose of the **training update** is to ensure that positive work habits and skills are reinforced. It is not the intention to "debrief" personnel, obtain additional information relative to the incident or penalize the involved employee(s).

PROCEDURE:

I. COMMANDING OFFICER'S RESPONSIBILITIES. The Area/division commanding officers of any employee who substantially participated in a CUOF incident, animal shooting, non-tactical/accidental or negligent discharge of a firearm shall:

- * Identify those personnel who were substantial participants in the event;

Example: Substantial participants include the employee(s) applying force or who had a significant tactical or decision making role in the incident. For instance, one of two partner officers involved in a foot pursuit has a CUOF. The partner officer in the foot pursuit should also attend a **training update** because they participated in the foot-pursuit, made the broadcast and some tactical decisions during the incident. An officer who arrives after a CUOF incident and is directed by a supervisor to handcuff a detained prisoner would generally not attend a **training update**.

- * Attend the "Chief of Police 72-hour Briefing" if convened. At the briefing, the commanding officer shall obtain concurrence from the Chief of Police or his designee on tactical and training issues and which employee(s) are to receive a **training update**;

- * If no "Chief of Police 72-hour Briefing" is conducted, consult with the concerned bureau commanding officer to obtain concurrence on tactical and training issues and which employee(s) shall receive a **training update**;
- * Forward an Intradepartmental Correspondence, Form 15.2, to Training Division identifying the concerned employee(s) and provide sufficient information to determine the training topics that should be emphasized during the **training update**;
- * Ensure the substantially involved employee(s) receives a **training update** as directed by Training Division within 21 days following the incident; and,
- * If Training Division directs the concerned Area/division to conduct the **training update**, the involved division shall forward an Intradepartmental Correspondence to the Commanding Officer, Training Division so that an entry into the employee's Training Evaluation and Management System (TEAMS) is completed indicating the **training update** was completed.

II. COMMANDING OFFICER, TRAINING DIVISION, RESPONSIBILITIES.

The Commanding Officer, Training Division, shall:


- * Review the information provided by the employee's commanding officer or presented at the "Chief of Police 72-hour Briefing" to determine the training topics that should be emphasized during the **training update**;
- * Direct the **training update** to be conducted by personnel designated by Training Division;
- * Ensure that Training Division staff completes an entry into the employee's TEAMS report to indicate the **training update** was completed;

Note: The entry into the TEAMS report shall specifically state "**Training Update.**"

- * Ensure that Training Division staff does not conduct interviews of the officers to determine specific facts related to the incident. Training Division staff should only be aware of the general facts of the incident and provide the employee with meaningful training based on those issues; and,
- * Forward an Intradepartmental Correspondence to the Area/division of occurrence noting the **training update** was completed and a TEAMS report entry was made for the concerned employee(s).

AMENDMENTS: This Order amends Section 3/796.35 of the Department Manual.

AUDIT RESPONSIBILITY: The Commanding Officer, Use of Force Review Division, shall monitor compliance with this directive in accordance with Department Manual Section 0/080.30.



The use of any templates that do not comply with the above should be discontinued immediately and any copies should be discarded.

Footnotes to Appendix A

This is the combined search warrant and affidavit form. It is preferable to the older forms involving a separate search warrant and separate affidavit.

There may be more than one affiant on a search warrant. (See *Skelton v. Superior Court* (1969) 1 Cal.3d 144 and Penal Code § 1527.) Further, the affiants need not be police officers. (See *People v. Bell* (1996) 45 Cal.App.4th 1030, 1055.)

The incorporation of the written affidavit allows reference to the affidavit to supplement inadequate or ambiguous residence and property descriptions on the face of the search warrant. (See *People v. MacAvoy* (1984) 162 Cal.App.3d 745.)

The language of the search warrant is derived from Penal Code section 1529.

Penal Code section 1529 has been amended to order service by "any peace officer", instead of "any sheriff, marshal, or police officer". The serving officer need not be the affiant. Civilian witnesses can assist serving officers, such as a victim pointing out stolen items. (See *People v. Superior Court (Meyers)* (1979) 25 Cal.3d 67.)

The search warrant must indicate which of these grounds is being relied upon for the issuance of the warrant. These grounds are statutory pursuant to Penal Code section 1524 and cannot be modified.

The search warrant must describe with "reasonable particularity" the place, vehicles, and persons to be searched (Penal Code section 1529). The general rule is that descriptions should be of sufficient particularity so that if an officer with no knowledge of the case were to serve the warrant, he would have no difficulty in locating and identifying the place, vehicle, or person to be searched. (*People v. Rossman* (1971) 19 Cal.App.3d 8, 11.)

The property and/or person to be seized must also be described with "reasonable particularity" (Penal Code § 1529).

Penal Code section 808 designates as magistrates judges of the superior courts, courts of appeal, and Supreme Court. Any of these judges is empowered to act as a magistrate and issue a search warrant. A commissioner, a judge pro tem, and a referee are not magistrates.

The Hobbs sealing request is based on *People v. Hobbs* (1994) 7 Cal.4th 948, which holds that all or part of a search warrant affidavit may be sealed to protect an informant's identity.

Good cause for a night search should be shown in the affidavit, as set forth in Chapter V. However, failure to do is not grounds for suppression of evidence. (*Rodriguez v. Superior Court* (1988) 199 Cal.App.3d 1453, 1470.)

A magistrate can issue a search warrant for any location within the county in which he or she sits. (*People v. Emanuel* (1978) 87 Cal.App.3d 205; *People v. Smead* (1985) 175 Cal.App.3d 1101.) A magistrate can issue a search warrant for a location outside his or her county but within the State of California so long as it relates to an offense that can be prosecuted in the magistrate's county. (*People v. Ruster* (1976) 16 Cal.3d 690; *People v. Fleming* (1981) 29 Cal.3d 698, 707; and *People v. Easley* (1983) 34 Cal.3d 858, 869-70.)

SPECIAL ORDER NO. 19

**SUBJECT: CRIMINAL DISCOVERY REQUESTS ASSOCIATED WITH
NON-CATEGORICAL USE OF FORCE INVESTIGATIONS -
ESTABLISHED**

PURPOSE: Criminal discovery requests associated with Non-Categorical Use of Force (NCUOF) investigations typically result from cases that involve a battery on a police officer, resisting arrest, and cases related to physical altercations with police officers. The majority of these crimes are misdemeanors and do not have an investigating officer assigned as a liaison with the prosecuting agency.

This Order designates responsibilities to each geographic Bureau Detective Coordinator (BDC) for responding to criminal discovery requests associated with NCUOF investigations when there is no investigating officer assigned to the case. However, in cases when there is an assigned investigating officer, the investigating officer will be responsible for handling these requests.

PROCEDURE:

- I. CRIMINAL DISCOVERY REQUESTS INVOLVING NON-CATEGORICAL USE OF FORCE INVESTIGATIONS.** Criminal discovery requests are received from the City Attorney's or District Attorney's Offices requesting the Department to disclose and provide information associated with a criminal case.

Normally, the criminal discovery requests associated with NCUOF investigations will be forwarded to the assigned investigating officer handling the case. However, when there is no assigned investigating officer, it shall be handled by the geographic BDC from the Area of occurrence or the BDC where the officer is assigned if the incident occurred outside the City.

- A. Discoverable Information.** Information that may be available during these procedures include, but are not limited to:

- * Photos, videotapes or audiotapes, and a description of the relevant items;
- * Witness statements;
- * Scene diagrams;
- * Documents not previously listed in a crime or arrest report;

- * Newly discovered evidence not contained in a crime or arrest report; and,
- * Corrections or reconciliation of conflicting information.

B. Non-Discoverable Information. Certain information in NCUOF investigations is considered confidential and shall not be provided as part of the discovery response. Such information includes, but is not limited to:

- * Adjudication of the Use of Force incident;
- * Critiques of an officer's tactics;
- * Training Evaluation and Management Systems II (TEAMS II) reports;
- * Training and/or counseling documentation; and,
- * Disciplinary issues or actions.

Note: Certain items of information may not be clear as to whether a confidential or privileged status exists. In such situations, a city attorney assigned to Police Discovery of the City Attorney's Office shall be contacted for guidance.


II. INVESTIGATING OFFICER/BUREAU DETECTIVE COORDINATOR'S RESPONSIBILITIES. An investigating officer or the BDC assigned to the case shall be responsible for handling criminal discovery requests associated with a NCUOF investigation from the City Attorney's or District Attorney's Office. The investigating officer or the BDC handling the request shall:

- * Prepare a package that contains the related discovery material;
- * Complete a Follow-Up Investigation Report, Form 3.14, summarizing the response to the discovery request;
- * Complete a Proposed Protective Order (see attached exemplar); and,
- * Forward the package to the requesting entity (City Attorney's or District Attorney's Office).

Note: If the case is less than three weeks old, the related reports may be available in the geographic Bureau Training Coordinator's Office. Cases older than three weeks may be stored at the Use of Force Review Division.

AMENDMENTS: This Order adds Department Manual Sections 4/792.20, and 4/792.30.

AUDIT RESPONSIBILITY: The Commanding Officer, Detective Bureau, shall monitor compliance with this directive in accordance with Department Manual Section 0/080.30.

SUBJECT: TRAINING EVALUATION AND MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (TEAMS) -
EXPANDED

PURPOSE: The Consent Decree mandated a number of changes to Department operating practices. One of the mandated changes was the expansion of the Training Evaluation and Management System (TEAMS) to promote professionalism and best policing practices while encouraging appropriate employee mentoring. Consequently, TEAMS was enhanced to become TEAMS II with the addition and modification of several databases, an ability to receive, organize and store data from 14 information databases, an ability to complete on-line reports/investigations, and an ability to perform complex employee and organizational performance analyses.

While TEAMS II stores data from a number of specific databases and allows for a "drill down look" at specific records associated with a specific performance entry, it is the Risk Management Information System (RMIS) that collects selected performance data, identifies connecting reports, and performs analytical performance comparisons with corresponding notices.

Office of the Chief of Police Notice, dated July 10, 1997, *Training Evaluation and Management System (TEAMS) Department - Wide Implementation*, implemented TEAMS and established the initial usage and access guidelines. Special Order No. 13, dated April 5, 2002, *Training Evaluation and Management System Guidelines*, refined those guidelines and is summarized in Department Manual Section 1/668. This Order updates Department Manual Section 1/668 by renaming TEAMS as TEAMS II, identifying the nature of on-line reporting, and reinforces the existing TEAMS usage and access protocols.

PROCEDURE:

- I. **TRAINING EVALUATION AND MANAGEMENT SYSTEM II (TEAMS II) - ESTABLISHED.** The expanded Training Evaluation and Management System (TEAMS) is now known as TEAMS II and is composed of the following:
 - A. **Contributing Source Systems.** The following databases contribute selected data to TEAMS II:

- * Canine System (K-9)
- * Claims/Lawsuit Information System (CLIS)
- * Complaint Management System (CMS)
- * Comprehensive Automated Permit System (CAPERS)
- * Consolidated Crime Analysis Database (CCAD)
- * Department Employees Commendation System (DECS)
- * Deployment Period System (DPS)
- * Fleet Safety Reporting (FSR)
- * Shooting Qualification and Bonus System (SQUABS)
- * System to Organize Pedestrian/Vehicle Stops (STOPS)
- * Traffic Information System (TIS)
- * Training Management System (TMS)
- * Use of Force System (UOFS)
- * Vehicle Pursuit System (VPS)

B. Risk Management Information System (RMIS). RMIS is comprised of selected data from the source systems. The system performs analytical comparisons, threshold evaluations, and cross-referencing. It also prepares reports and produces action items and notifications.

C. Access Control. TEAMS II shall provide common access functionality and shall be strictly regulated through the Access Control System, which also gives the Department the ability to perform on-line reporting.

II. USE OF TEAMS II. The guidelines and protocols currently used for TEAMS remain applicable to TEAMS II. Whereas TEAMS was a "pointer" system used predominantly to generate a complete or modified personnel summary report, TEAMS II is a "pointer" system to be used not only to obtain a personnel summary report, but to identify those employees and organizational entities whose performance is well outside that of their respective peer group average, and encourage appropriate supervisory recognition or mentoring.

It is the responsibility of managers and supervisors to regularly review an employee's personnel file and other documents, which are the source documents for a TEAMS II entry. It is only from actual review of such documents that a conclusion may be made as to whether or not a problem exists and what, if anything, should be done. In no case shall a TEAMS II report be used as a substitute

for an employee's personnel file or any other document(s), which is the source for a TEAMS II entry.

A. TEAMS II Employee Summary Report. The TEAMS II Employee Summary Report contains personnel summary information. Currently, a TEAMS II Employee Summary Report includes the following personnel information categories:

- * Arrest/Crime Reports summary
- * Attendance data summary
- * Citations data summary
- * Civil Litigation data summary
- * Major and Minor Commendations summary
- * Discipline data summary
- * In-Service Training Courses summary
- * Pursuit data summary
- * Rank/Assignment summary
- * STOPS data summary
- * Traffic Collisions data summary
- * Use of Force (all) data summary
- * Work Permit data summary

An inquiry to obtain a TEAMS II Employee Summary Report will not only provide summary data, but will also allow the operator to select a specific entry and view associated reports in RMIS and in the case of UOF or complaints, the completed investigation.

Note: Attendance data will not be displayed on the initial Teams II Employee Summary Reports; it will be added in the future.

B. TEAMS II Performance Assessment. Individual performance assessments are accomplished using the new Teams II Summary Report and the appropriate RMIS Reports.

III. TYPES OF TEAMS II REPORTS.

A. TEAMS II Employee Summary Reports. TEAMS II Employee Summary Reports will continue to be produced in multiple versions or "views" based on how the report is to be used. These versions or "views" differ only in the manner in which information about personnel complaints will be displayed on the report. Attachment No.1, "TEAMS

Filters used to determine when a complaint is displayed on a TEAMS Report," has been updated and includes the following new versions or "views" of the report:

1. Risk Management Executive Committee (RMEC) Profile Review.
2. Professional Standards Bureau (PSB)/Force Investigation Division (FID)/Office of Inspector General (OIG) Review.
3. Risk Management Information System Threshold View.

B. OTHER REPORTS. TEAMS II will also provide a number of standardized reports that provide a summary of an employee's performance in comparison to their peer group, their co-workers, watch, division, area, bureau, etc. There are similar reports for supervisors as well as organizational comparisons.

IV. AUTHORIZED ACCESS. Access to TEAMS II remains as specified in Department Manual Section 1/668.

V. ACCESS AND PROXY DELEGATION. TEAMS II has the ability to allow an authorized user to delegate access rights to other users depending upon the employee's rank, pay grade, organization, function, and duty assignment. Delegation of access rights is the process of limiting or permitting a user's access to various RMIS reports and information. Proper delegation of access rights ensures that each user can only access information to which that user has a right and a need to know.

An authorized user may also delegate proxy rights to a subordinate that allows the subordinate to act for the authorized user. This includes approving reports such as Use of Force reports, action items, and complaints that require a commanding officer's signature for approval. A commanding officer can give proxy rights to their assistant commanding officer or a member of their staff such as an adjutant, who could then sign off for the commanding officer, when he/she is not available to access the system and has at least verbally approved the report. Granting proxy rights shall be closely monitored by a commanding officer and should be rarely used.

A commanding officer is responsible for the actions taken by their proxy. The system will always record the name of the actual person taking the action if the approval is by an authorized proxy, similar to signing your name with the word "for" over the signature block of another person on paper documents.

Access control is dependant upon the DPS system and it is critical that all commands keep the DPS up to date. Access and proxy delegation may only be made to personnel within the delegating person's chain of command, where the delegated rights will remain in effect until one of the following occurs:

- * The status of the employee changes, (e.g., transfer, change in rank, or resignation);
- * The status of the person delegating changes (e.g., transfer, change in rank, resignation);
- * The matter requiring the delegated access was completed (e.g., a captain delegated their access rights to their adjutant to complete a specific project generated by the TEAMS II system. Upon completing the project, the adjutant reverts back to their personal access rights); or,
- * Risk Management Group rescinds the access rights.

VI. RESPONSIBILITY FOR MAINTAINING TEAMS. The Department entities responsible for the data entry/maintenance of the specific categories are as follows:

A. Entering Data. The Department entity responsible for maintaining information used by TEAMS II shall ensure that any new or revised data is entered into the appropriate system within 30 days of receiving the information.

B. Correcting Data. The procedure to correct TEAMS II data remains the same as required by Department Manual Section 3/791.

VII. PROCEDURE TO DISPUTE INFORMATION CONTAINED IN TEAMS II.

The procedure to dispute information contained in TEAMS II remains the same as required by Department Manual Section 3/791.

VIII. CONFIDENTIALITY OF TEAMS II INFORMATION. Although computerization makes TEAMS II data more readily available, it is critical that each employee understands the confidential nature of such information. **Breaches of such confidentiality will not be tolerated.**

The information contained in TEAMS II is confidential personnel information and should be treated as such. The fact that this information is accessible to certain select individuals on a "NEED TO KNOW/RIGHT TO KNOW" basis does not diminish the confidential nature of this material. Because it may contain information obtained from police officer personnel records concerning discipline, use of force, attendance, medical information or injured on duty status, whether in cursory form or in

detail, said information is subject to protection as confidential personnel documents under Penal Code Sections 832.7, 832.8, Government Code Section 6254(C) and (G), Government Code Section 6255, and Article 1, Section 1 of the California Constitution, as well as Department Manual Section 3/405.

Note: TEAMS II contains a monitoring feature that allows managers to monitor an employee's access of TEAMS II data.


- IX. Information Technology Division's Responsibility.** The requirement for Information Technology Division to process TEAMS access authorization requests is rescinded. TEAMS II access control provides managers with the ability to delegate and restrict access authority based on the information maintained in the Deployment Period System.
- X. Risk Management Group's Responsibility.** Monitoring responsibilities assigned to Risk Management Group relative to TEAMS remains unchanged for TEAMS II.
- XI. Employees' Responsibility.** Employees are responsible for reviewing his/her TEAMS II Employee Summary Report to ensure the information is accurate and complete. Any discrepancies shall be brought to the attention of the appropriate entity, as established in this Order.
- XII. Supervisors' Responsibility.** Supervisors shall ensure that access rights to the TEAMS II/RMIS, which they have granted or delegated to other employees, has been done so only on a "NEED TO KNOW/RIGHT TO KNOW" basis. The TEAMS II query may contain information obtained from police officer personnel records concerning discipline, use of force, attendance, medical information or injured on duty status, whether in cursory form or in detail, said information is subject to protection as confidential personnel documents under Penal Code Sections 832.7, 832.8, Government Code Sections 6254(C), 6254(G), and 6255, and Article 1, Section 1 of the California Constitution, as well as Department Manual Section 3/405.
- XIII. Commanding Officers' Responsibility.** Commanding officers shall ensure that access rights to TEAMS II/RMIS have been granted or delegated to employees within their command only on a "NEED TO KNOW/RIGHT TO KNOW" basis.

Commanding officers shall ensure supervisory personnel provide a TEAMS II Employee Summary Report to each employee in conjunction with the service of the employee's annual (post-probationary) Performance Evaluation Report.

AMENDMENTS: This Order amends Department Manual Section 1/668.

24 **I. INTRODUCTION**

25 **A. OVERVIEW**

26 This report summarizes the implementation activities performed by the City of
27 Los Angeles ("City") pursuant to the Consent Decree, and discusses actions taken
28 since the City's February 2006 Status Report to the Court.

Two major events involving the Court occurred during the past six month
period. First, on March 22, 2006, the Court denied the joint motion made by the City
and the United States Department of Justice ("DOJ") (collectively "the Parties") to
amend Paragraph 132. As a result, the LAPD continues to meet and confer with the
Los Angeles Police Protective League ("PPL") in regard to Paragraph 132.

1 Secondly, on May 15, 2006, the Court ruled on the extension of the Consent
2 Decree, ordering that the entirety of the Consent Decree be extended for an additional
3 three years. Subsequently, the City, DOJ and Independent Monitor ("Monitor") have
4 been working to develop a monitoring schedule covering the additional three years.

5 Additionally, over the past six months, the City has made significant progress
6 toward compliance with the TEAMS II provisions of the Consent Decree. The
7 Deployment Period System ("DPS") and Use of Force System ("UOFS")
8 deployments have been completed Department-wide. The City is close to
9 completing the testing of Phase 1 of the Complaint Management System ("CMS"),
10 which is targeted for deployment in August 2006. Testing of and training for the
11 Risk Management Information System ("RMIS") has continued over the past six
12 months, and RMIS employee reports were deployed Department-wide. The RMIS
13 action items are scheduled for deployment Department-wide in August 2006.

14 During this reporting period, the Analysis Group issued its report concerning
15 analysis of pedestrian and motor vehicle post-stop data, and gave presentations on
16 the results of its analyses to the Police Commission, Public Safety Committee of the
17 City Council, and the full City Council.

18 The LAPD and the Inspector General ("OIG") have continued reporting to the
19 Police Commission on all compliance issues, as well as reporting on compliance to
20 the City Council. This process continues to assist in remedying compliance
21 deficiencies, where they exist.

22 **B. COMPLIANCE SUMMARY**

23 As part of the Parties' Joint Motion to Amend the Consent Decree to extend
24 certain paragraphs and terminate others, the Parties included a list of those
25 paragraphs for which it was agreed that the City had either been in substantial
26 compliance for the requisite two-year time period, or out of compliance. (List Filed
27 with Joint Motion, attached hereto as Exhibit A). While disagreement existed over
28 whether or not those paragraphs deemed to be in substantial compliance should be

1 extended, the Monitor did confirm its agreement with the compliance status of the
2 paragraphs as set forth in Exhibit A.

3
4 **II. ONGOING COMPLIANCE EFFORTS**

5 **A. MONITORING SCHEDULE OVER THE NEXT THREE YEARS**

6 As a result of the Court's May 15, 2006, order extending the entirety of the
7 Consent Decree for an additional three years, the Parties and the Monitor collectively
8 set out to establish a schedule for the monitoring of those paragraphs for which the
9 City has not yet achieved compliance. The Parties and Monitor believe that a
10 Monitoring Schedule governing the period of the extended Consent Decree will be
11 finalized in the upcoming weeks.

12 The Parties and the Monitor also agree that those paragraphs for which the
13 City has been in substantial compliance (See Exhibit A) will not be actively
14 monitored over the next three years. Rather, all agree that continued compliance will
15 be assumed, unless some event occurs which causes the Monitor to believe
16 otherwise. If the Monitor has reason to believe that a paragraph, previously deemed
17 to be in substantial compliance for the requisite two-year time period, has fallen out
18 of compliance, the Monitor will provide notice to the Parties indicating this. The
19 Monitor will then provide the City with an opportunity to respond to the Monitor's
20 position, after which the Monitor will determine whether or not the provision in
21 question should be reactivated and added to the monitoring schedule going forward.

22 **B. PARAGRAPH 132**

23 As a result of the Court's March 22, 2006, denial of the Parties' Joint Motion
24 to Amend Paragraph 132, the LAPD continues discussions with the PPL regarding
25 Paragraph 132.

26 **C. TEAMS II**

27 The Management Systems Reengineering Project ("MSRP") is primarily
28 responsible for the TEAMS II Development Program, including but not limited to the

1 Risk Management Information System ("RMIS"), Use of Force System ("UOFS"),
2 Complaint Management System ("CMS"), Deployment Period System ("DPS") and
3 LAPD source system data conversion.¹

4 **1. Risk Management Information System ("RMIS")**

5 After a successful pilot deployment of the TEAMS II employee reports to a
6 few LAPD Divisions, the RMIS employee and organizational report functionality
7 was made available Department-wide. RMIS training is continuing and employees
8 are encouraged to make regular use of the RMIS, as described in the approved RMIS
9 protocols, once they have completed the requisite training.

10 Testing of RMIS Action Item threshold activation has continued with very few
11 issues. Over the next two months, RMIS Action Item threshold functionality will be
12 phased in Department-wide. The first Action Items are currently targeted to be
13 deployed Department-wide in August 2006.

14 **2. Use of Force System ("UOFS")**

15 During the past six months, the UOFS Department-wide deployment was
16 completed. While system users have identified a few problems with the system in
17 regard to performance and ease of use, these issues are all presently being addressed.

18 **3. Complaint Management System ("CMS")**

19 CMS phase 1 is currently in the last stages of testing. Phase 1 will be deployed
20 in August 2006 and will provide Professional Standards Bureau ("PSB") with the
21 ability to perform centralized data input of complaint investigation data into a
22 consolidated system. This will allow PSB to shut down some of its current
23 databases, reducing duplicate data entry activities and associated data errors.

24 ///

25 _____
26 ¹ The RMIS is largely the equivalent of "TEAMS II" as described in the Consent Decree. Some data
27 elements of the new UOFS and the new CMS are considered part of "TEAMS II." While the
28 Consent Decree does not require the development of a separate UOFS or CMS, the City determined
it was appropriate to redesign, enhance and develop these systems to provide greater functionality
over the current LAPD systems.

1 **4. Deployment Period System (“DPS”)**

2 DPS has been deployed Department-wide and continues to function with very
3 few, if any, issues.

4 **5. RMIS Use Protocol**

5 The DOJ approved the RMIS Use Protocol on January 11, 2005, and
6 subsequently approved the TEAMS II Use Protocol clarifications submitted by the
7 City. The meet and confer process with all unions regarding the Use Protocol is now
8 complete, and the LAPD has finalized the implementing Orders and protocol for
9 Police Commission consideration.

10 **D. CATEGORICAL USE OF FORCE (“CUOF”) INVESTIGATIONS**

11 A committee consisting of the Executive Director of the Police Commission,
12 the Inspector General and the Commanding Officer of the Consent Decree Bureau,
13 was created in September 2005 to study the practices and protocols of Force
14 Investigation Division (“FID”). These studies included interviews of FID
15 investigative personnel in an attempt to determine causal factors affecting
16 investigative timelines. In November 2005, the Board approved the committee’s
17 recommendations, including streamlining the administrative investigation process,
18 reallocating resources, and transitioning to digital recording devices for use during
19 the investigative process. During the past six months, the LAPD has continued to
20 work to implement these recommendations.

21 The OIG continues to operate under OIG and LAPD procedures, as modified
22 in Fall 2003, relative to CUOF incidents, which include the ability of the OIG to ask
23 questions during Use of Force Review Board proceedings. The OIG also continues
24 to receive briefings regarding CUOF investigative interview processes approximately
25 one week after an incident occurs. Additionally, the OIG continues to enhance its
26 CUOF review procedures to further ensure consistent and comprehensive reviews,
27 and has developed a CUOF database for the capture and analysis of CUOF data. OIG
28 CUOF reviews continue to be communicated to the Board of Police Commissioners,

1 as well as those PSB managers involved with the subject investigations.

2 **E. PEDESTRIAN AND MOTOR VEHICLE STOP DATA**

3 The analysis of post-stop data, collected pursuant to Paragraphs 104 and 105,
4 was completed during this reporting period. The results of the analysis were made
5 public on July 7, 2006. The final Analysis Report may be found in its entirety at
6 <[http://www.analysisgroup.com/AnalysisGroup/uploadedFiles/Publishing/Articles/L
7 APD_Data_Analysis_Report_07-5-06.pdf](http://www.analysisgroup.com/AnalysisGroup/uploadedFiles/Publishing/Articles/L
7 APD_Data_Analysis_Report_07-5-06.pdf)>.

8 **1. Scope of Analysis and Control Factors**

9 The Final Methodology Report explained that an analysis of post-stop data
10 would:

11
12 investigate whether, after controlling for available legitimate factors
13 that may affect police decision-making, different demographic
14 groups (race, age and gender) are subjected to disproportionate
15 sanctions (e.g., citations, warnings, arrests) or other burdens (e.g.,
16 searches) following a stop.

16 (Final Methodology Report, page 6.)

17 While a cursory review of the raw post-stop data indicated racial disparities in
18 these post-stop outcomes, it did not reflect the circumstances surrounding an
19 encounter that may legitimately explain the rationale for the treatment of the persons
20 stopped. Therefore, the Analysis Group developed statistical models to account for
21 these legitimate control factors.

22 The control factors considered included:

- 23 1) Encounter characteristics (e.g, day, time and reason for the stop);
- 24 2) Geographic characteristics (e.g., crime rates in the area of the stop);
- 25 3) Officer characteristics (e.g., length of service and type of assignment); and
- 26 4) Suspect characteristics (e.g., age and gender of the suspect).

27 After accounting for these factors, the Analysis Group attempted to evaluate
28 the effect of the race of the suspect on the post-stop outcome. Outcomes for officers
with gang assignments were evaluated separately from those without gang

1 assignments. Analyses were conducted by Division/Area for non-gang officers and
2 by Bureau for gang officers. Separate effects were measured for Hispanics, Blacks
3 and other racial groups, including Asians and American Indians.

4 **2. Results After Accounting for Control Factors**

5 The statistical analyses revealed a number of general results:

- 6 1) While the raw post-stop data initially indicated racial disparities, these
7 racial disparities were significantly reduced after the control factors
8 described above were considered.
- 9 2) Significant disparities did, however, remain for non-gang officers for some
10 outcomes. Specifically, unexplained racial differences occurred most
11 frequently for non-gang officer requests to exit the vehicle, pat-
12 downs/frisks and higher discretion searches. Gang officer activities,
13 however, did not consistently present these racial disparities.
- 14 3) Although some Divisions/Bureaus had statistically significant racial
15 disparities for some outcomes and some races, when evaluated across all
16 post-stop outcomes, there was no consistent pattern of race effects across
17 Divisions or races.

18 **3. Omitted Variables and Other Possible Explanations**

19 It is important to note that the Report identified several other possible
20 explanations for the racial disparities found in the results of the post-stop analyses,
21 aside from racially biased policing, including:

- 22 • Key factors that were not available or quantifiable which might explain the
23 disparities in these outcomes. Potentially important information that was
24 not available included:
 - 25 ▪ the rates at which different racial groups commit crimes;
 - 26 ▪ suspect attitude or demeanor;
 - 27 ▪ for motor vehicle suspects, vehicle condition (e.g., tinted windows,
broken windows, popped open trunk, and damaged vehicle);
 - 28 ▪ differences in driving behavior;

- 1 ▪ the presence of bystanders; and
- 2 ▪ when there was a victim, whether the victim wanted the police to
- 3 make an arrest.

- 4 • Perceived threats – police frisk suspects and order them out of vehicles
- 5 when they believe that their own safety may be in jeopardy. Such
- 6 perceived threats could be attributable to the unique history of gang activity
- 7 and gang violence in Los Angeles.

8 Because all potentially relevant variables were not available for inclusion in
9 the analysis, the Analysis Group stated in its report that it “cannot draw definitive
10 conclusions about the existence or non-existence of racial profiling by the LAPD.”
11 Thus, the racial disparities and potential areas of concern identified “must be
12 considered in light of all available information, including the potentially relevant
13 information that could not be included” in the analysis.

14 **4. Next Steps**

15 The City is currently discussing how it should proceed, considering the
16 inconclusive results of the post-stop data analysis. The City will also be consulting
17 with the DOJ and the Monitor on this issue.

18 **F. OFFICE OF THE INSPECTOR GENERAL**

19 The Office of the Inspector General has continued to perform informative and
20 insightful audits and reviews. Moreover, in the City’s 2006/2007 Fiscal Year
21 Budget, nearly One Million dollars was allocated for additional OIG staffing and
22 resources.

23 As the OIG will continue to be the eyes and ears of the Commission as well as
24 the public after the Consent Decree expires, the OIG must be staffed during the next
25 three years so that it may begin to assume the role of the Monitor. This transition
26 period will permit the Monitor to assess the Inspector General’s ability to oversee
27 Department reform, and gain confidence that when the Consent Decree expires, the
28 implemented reforms will continue.

1 **G. POLICE COMMISSION**

2 In August 2005, the newly appointed Board of Police Commissioners
3 requested a review of the policies and procedures governing the selection and
4 evaluation of members of the Board of Rights Hearing Examiner pool. That review
5 resulted in the recent de-selection of all existing hearing examiners. Over the next
6 several weeks, the Police Commission will accept applications to fill these vacancies.
7 Once selected, all hearing examiners will be required to attend eight hours of training
8 prior to performing any duties. This training curriculum has been updated, enhanced
9 and reviewed by Monitor staff. Hearing Examiner training is currently anticipated to
10 be completed by the end of September 2006.

11
12 **III. CONCLUSION**

13 The City respectfully submits its August 2006 report on the status of City
14 compliance and implementation efforts in regard to the Consent Decree.
