In an interview with KTLA on February 1st, LAPD's Michel Moore attempted to revise the narrative by indicating that 14-year-old Valentina Orellana-Peralta was killed as her mother tried to "shield her from an attack of a person suffering from mental illness," and calling this "yet another episode of law enforcement being called in to stop the violence, stop the threat." This is far different from reality and how police rushed in and escalated the violence, killing Daniel and Valentina, then failed to check on Valentina and her mother Soledad Peralta, <u>even as Soledad screamed for help</u>.

It is a pattern for Moore to refer to folks with mental illness or who are in crisis as threats or in ableist and derogatory terms; referring to people as being "mentally deranged," and speaking of "random attacks," while failing to acknowledge that in a community where health care services and support were accessible and affordable on an ongoing basis, there would likely be a decrease in the number of folks in crisis. Instead, Moore blames mental health care services, indicating it is a failure in which people with mental illness are "released" and "end up being back in our communities." The Feb. 1st Police Commision Meeting was the second in recent weeks when LAPD outright stated that it just hasn't been following policy set by BOPC; another recent time being when the OIG reviewed the audit of Non-categorical use of Force (NCUOF) for q1 2021, and revealed that LAPD has not been following a policy regarding this since 2012 (I think?) when the policy was passed at BOPC: that different cops who are part of a NCUOF, fill out different forms, not share one form.

On Feb. 1st 2022 though, it was regarding Automatic License Plate Readers, that LAPD has been using in some capacity since about 2005, but that it only developed a policy on in 2020 (which was likely voted through by BOPC as usual, with a round of congratulations to all, on how the system is working). At last week's meeting though LAPD indicated, out of the mouth of McMahon, that they have not been able to check if the data has been accessed improperly, due to the "antiquated" nature of the system - and for that same reason, an audit has not been possible - which makes one wonder, WTF did LAPD agree to the Dec 2020 policy? Did they not read the policy, or understand the limits of their own system? Oh wait they knew it wouldn't really matter.

Then last week McMahon further stated, LAPD does not share this ALPR data with fusion centers... this is so highly unlikely, as this is the reason these data systems exist, and why LAPD signed with Palantir and with JRIC, the nearest fusion center, to be able to quickly and seamlessly share info. What the hell is LAPD talking about.

What liars, which is never surprising, but wow commissioners. You cannot trust LAPD, they will never change, and they must be defunded.
