SUBJECT: REVISED - MINIMUM PATROL UNITS UPDATE

Maintaining a minimum number of patrol units is critical to effectively provide services to the residents of Los Angeles and to ensure sufficient units are available to respond to an emergency. It is imperative that Area watch commanders take the necessary steps to meet these minimums. The attached table establishes the number of A or X cars necessary to meet the patrol unit minimums for each Area. If the actual number of units deployed during a watch drops below the minimums established in the table, then watch commanders shall immediately notify their commanding officer and implement established protocols such as, but not limited to, activating specialized units to handle calls for service, holding units over from the previous watch, and/or calling in off-duty personnel to voluntarily work on an overtime basis.

Watch commanders and assistant watch commanders are reminded that these procedures are to be followed in response to deficiencies in staffing resulting from deployment only. In the event of an unusual occurrence or a priority radio call backlog, personnel shall be guided by the Emergency Operations Guide and Operational Order No. 5, *FIELD UNIT SELECTION SEQUENCE AND PRIORITY RADIO CALL BACKLOG - TACTICAL ALERT GUIDELINES – REVISED*, dated November 15, 2017.
