I have seen first-hand the harm that police cause to my community, particularly people of color and other marginalized individuals. As a white ally, I am committed to reducing this harm by reducing police presence.

In closed session the Board will talk about one murder and one shooting by LAPD last April, one day apart. In both cases police drew weapons and fired at people who were in severe crisis. On April 23rd, 2021 police shot Edwin Vasquez, who is listed by a different last name on the LAPD website. Edwin had been reported to LAPD as being suicidal and was clearly in distress, harming himself with a knife. Several cops stood nearby with a taser, 40mm "less lethal" device, and a gun pointed at Edwin, and all three weapons were used on Edwin (first the TASER, then the 40mm and gun were used at the same time). This is one of many shootings where numerous cops were armed with less-lethal devices and also guns, and multiple weapons were fired simultaneously, all towards a person who was in crisis and truly needed support and help.

LAPD also shot Richard Solitro on April 24th, 2021, killing him as he stood in the street. Richard was a loving father and husband, son, brother, uncle, and friend. He was also a person with bipolar disorder who had been having an episode of psychosis. As <u>detailed by Knock LA</u>, Solitro's family had been searching for him, and his wife and parents reported contacting multiple organizations seeking help for Richard while he was in Los Angeles, but organizations "ultimately redirected them to contact law enforcement." Like Edwin Vasquez, Richard Solitro was a person in crisis who needed support and accessible services, not a cop with a gun. We need funding for health care services and programs for communities, not funding for police!

On April 23rd, 2021 police shot Edwin Vasquez, who is listed by a different last name on the LAPD website. Edwin had been reported to LAPD as being suicidal and was clearly in distress, harming himself with a knife. Several cops stood nearby with a taser, 40mm "less lethal" device, and a gun pointed at Edwin, and all three weapons were used on Edwin (first the TASER, then the 40mm and gun were used at the same time). This is one of many shootings where numerous cops were armed with less-lethal devices and also guns, and multiple weapons were fired simultaneously, all towards a person who was in crisis and truly needed support and help. Is there a reason that we cannot provide mental help to those in crisis instead of sending killer cops with guns??

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My friend recently told me a story about how she was stopped by the police when she had recently moved to the country at the age of 17. An officer pulled a gun on her when she moved towards her license and registration. She said she was so scared and this was before she knew that she could get killed for "just moving". Officers with guns and a mentality to "shoot and then ask questions later" will continue to cause harm to our communities. I'm so tired of asking you to hear me- hear US. We want more funds for community

resources to prevent the need for COPS, not more COPS. It is extremely disheartening to see how many lives are taken and how many officers continue to get away with murder.

As detailed by Knock LA, Solitro's family had been searching for him, and his wife and parents reported contacting multiple organizations seeking help for Richard while he was in Los Angeles, but organizations "ultimately redirected them to contact law enforcement." Like Edwin Vasquez, Richard Solitro was a person in crisis who needed support and accessible services, not a cop with a gun. We need funding for health care services and programs for communities, not funding for police!
