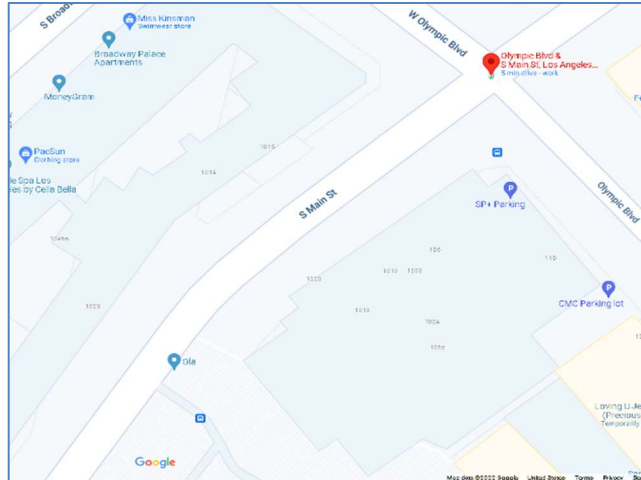

Public's Assistance Needed

On March 14, 2022, at 8:40 p.m. a male Black pedestrian was crossing eastbound on Main Street, between Olympic Boulevard and 11th Street. As he was crossing the No. 1 lane of northbound Main Street, a dark colored, unknown make and model vehicle, struck him, and knocked him onto the street.

The pedestrian began to crawl towards the east sidewalk of Main Street. As he was crawling on the No. 2 lane, a dark colored, 4-door passenger vehicle ran over the pedestrian, and dragged him approximately 15-feet before being dislodged. Both vehicles failed to stop to render aid and identify themselves.

Drivers are reminded that if they become involved in a traffic crash, they should pull over and stop as soon as it is safe to do so, notify emergency services, and remain at the scene to identify themselves. Don't convert a traffic crash into a crime.
