On Friday, at the Budget and Finance Committee for the Mayor's proposed budget for FY 2022-2023 the budget hearings continued. During public comment many community members shared their experiences, and urged City Councilmembers increase funding for and divert funds to programs that communities desperately need. Some of the services raised that need support include youth programs, mental health care programs, rental assistance and housing funds, housing assistance, more parks and green areas in South Central, an expansion of the guaranteed income program, an investment in transportation, teachers and schools, funding for elder care.

These are critical programs and areas that need funding urgently, and the city has the funding for these programs. What we see instead is that the largest portion of the city budget by far - over \$3.2B of the city budget, and over half of the city's discretionary funds - go to LAPD. This is the opposite of what our communities are demanding, and you know it. Week after week we have been demanding that LAPD receive less funding, and that more money is diverted directly to community funds and much-needed services that are independent from police.

We know communities are safer when people are supported and have their basic needs met, and have access to resources. For too many in Los Angeles today however that is not the case, and the city is failing to make funding and services accessible. It's why the number of unhoused people in our city continuously increases. Furthermore, this is deeply inequitable and starkly divided between neighborhoods and racial lines. The city has no lack of funding, grants, and donations when it comes to paying for surveillance contracts and for the salaries of police in predominantly Black, brown, and poor neighborhoods, but will not invest the millions of dollars required for housing, healthcare, transportation, and all of the things people need to survive and get by. This is by design.

It is the city's choice to spend so much on policing at the expense of everything else. It is the city's choice to perpetuate conditions of poverty, deprivation, trauma, and interpersonal harm in our communities. Every dollar spent by LAPD could instead be used for housing, health care, education, and other investments that actually contribute to people being safe and healthy. This is our demand, and you have the power to meet our demand! Your own demand should be

the same as ours. It may be challenging for you to see how this all impacts you, but I promise that your humanity is being sacrificed in the name of the state.

LAPD's budget further includes millions of dollars of funding for surveillance technology that is used to target, harass, and control our communities. Mass surveillance creates the conditions that endanger Black, brown, migrant, unhoused, and poor people. We demand all surveillance tech be defunded and abolished. Defund LAPD and fund the community!

On this week's agenda, there are three demonstrations of how the City of Los Angeles, LAPD, and technology corporations use Los Angeles neighborhoods as testing and development grounds for policing technology and military surveillance tactics. As Angelenos continue to demand housing, services, youth programs, and investment in schools, the LAPD and LAPF (Los Angeles Police Foundation) continue to pump money into policing, and profit from the results.

LAPD wants nearly \$14M to upgrade its Records Management System (RMS). The five-year contract would go to Motorola Solutions Inc., which offers "faster and easier" records management for every piece of information obtained by or sent to LAPD, as well as every piece of information transmitted, stored, or shared between LAPD and its many partners. Former LAPD Chief and current paid Rick Caruso consultant Bill Bratton was placed on the board of Motorola Solutions in 2011. You cannot tell me there are not more pressing, direct ways this money could serve the members of our community.

It's no surprise that LAPD would give a contract to Motorola, a corporation that helps channel money to LAPD, both through donations to LAPF - where Motorola salesperson Hugh O-Donnell was a long-time board member, and where Joseph Warner, Senior Account Executive at Motorola sits on the board now - and by serving as a willing partner in LAPD's experimental and carceral surveillance tactics in Black, brown, and poor neighborhoods. With its technology, Motorola will continue its tracking and criminalization of people in LA, this time based on a person's movements or very appearance on video, with software that claims to "transform video surveillance from reactive monitoring to automated proactive alerts" when a person, object or vehicle "of interest" is detected by cameras. There is no mention of how this will work, though the software does incorporate technology from Motorola acquisitions Avigilon and WatchGuard, both of which specialize in video analytics and facial recognition.

LAPD further wants to increase funding to Axon, another long-time corporate partner with deep connections to the department, including that former COP Charlie Beck sits on Axon's so-called AI Ethics Board. With a \$6.9M contract, the

city of LA wants to pay Axon for an in-fleet recording platform to add two cameras to 1500 cop cars. Mentioned nowhere by LAPD is that each camera will also have the ability to scan license plates; meaning 3000 Automatic License Plate Readers (ALPRs) will be added to LA streets, constantly gathering information for potential use as "evidence." This is a shameful use of city funding as we demand more services, not more spying and surveillance.

Additionally, the Police Foundation is funding software for LAPD's drones for Traffic Group to create geospatial maps of areas over which drones have flown. We rejected LAPD use of drones in 2014 and 2017 when they were proposed as weapons of surveillance, and we reject them today! LAPD does not need drones. Part of LAPD's militarized occupation and assault includes surveillance from the air, which is accomplished in part by LAPD drones. No drones for LAPD!

Other city council and committee meetings are now happening in-person. You continue to keep this meeting solely online because you are afraid to face the disappointment and demands of the people. If you really were servants of the people, you would make the meeting in-person with options for people to give public comments online or in-person.

Stop capping your meetings' public comment period at a mere forty-five minutes. You give 45 minutes for public comment from a city of 4 million people. Despite your weekly protestations to the contrary, you are silencing the voices of Angelenos by limiting who can speak at your meetings, and for how long.

Let people speak after each agenda item; the other way doesn't make sense.

Members of the communities most affected by policing are by far the most knowledgeable about the real-world effects of the matters before the board, and about LAPD in their neighborhoods, and you need to hear what they have to say.

General Public Comment: LAPD Budget

The proposed LAPD budget is opposite of what people are demanding, which is less funding for LAPD. This past Friday, budget hearings continued at the Budget and Finance Committee for the Mayor's proposed budget for FY 2022-2023. In public comment there were many requests and experiences shared by community members, urging City Councilmembers to divert or increase funding for programs that communities desperately need. Some of the services raised that need support include youth programs, mental health care programs, rental assistance and housing funds, housing assistance, more parks and green areas in South Central, an expansion of the guaranteed income program, an investment in transportation, teachers and schools, funding for elder care. These are some of the critical programs and areas that need funding urgently, and the city has the funding for these programs, but what we see instead is that the largest portion of the city budget by far - over \$3.2B of the city budget, and over half of the city's discretionary funds - go to LAPD.

General Public Comment: Failing to Discipline Mask Mandate Violators

Out of the hundreds of complaints about LAPD officers not wearing masks, only 2 officers sustained discipline. It's more proof that Chief Moore and LAPD sees themselves as above the law and do not take the covid-19 and people's public safety seriously. Chief Moore promised to hold those who didn't wear masks accountable but once again lied. He defended his inaction, saying that the officers benefited more from having their behavior changed and not having them be punished, but defends his officers who brutally punish city residents. He's hypocritical. He additionally didn't provide any proof that such officers who were subject to "non-disciplinary" processes did actually change their behavior
