Skopenow's software gathers information about people using social media platforms and intends to "predict" a person's next move. LAPD wants to use this software to gather information about people from online sources, which will be used as "proof" of a person's suspicious behavior, or their likelihood of becoming a "threat," all of which will be used to justify LAPD's surveillance and stalking of individuals.

The subscription will be donated to the Threat Management Unit, which claims to investigate stalking cases and workplace violence, but LAPD's own officers engage in stalking behavior and workplace violence constantly and are never reprimanded; it is part of the culture of LAPD. This software expands the surveillance power of cops, and will not be used for community safety or well-being.

Further, Skopenow's Photo-Based Identification does use facial recognition software to compare photos, and this application is a part of the Enterprise package LAPD is getting. LAPD claims "no Department user shall use the Skopenow optional photo-based filtering feature," then suggests LAPD will only manually compare photos. This is simply not believable.

We reject the funding of more spying and surveillance technology when what people need are investments in fundamental services, support, health, and housing! Divest from LAPD, and invest in the community.
