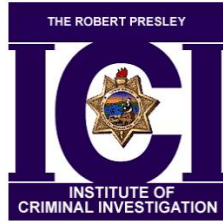

Instructional Goal: To provide gang investigators the training techniques, skills, and information necessary to investigate gang-related crimes.

Performance Objectives: Utilizing adult-based learning concepts and assigned coursework, students will participate in hands-on activities and group collaboration, as well as submit a legally-sufficient search warrant.

Upon completion of this course, the student/investigator will be able to:

- Interpret and apply laws related to gangs and the connection with PC 186.22.
- Conduct a comprehensive gang investigation.
- Manage informants.
- Understand the different types of gangs.
- Development of a personal curricula vitae emphasizing gang expertise.
