In general, make every effort to remove procedural barriers and impediments to civic expression, and discontinue your visible displays of irritation with and hostility towards the public you purport to serve. Members of the communities most affected by policing are by far the most knowledgeable about the real-world effects of the matters before this board, and about LAPD in their neighborhoods, and you should be doing everything you can to make it easy for them to give public comment. Week after week, your actions belie your hollow claim to be the “citizen’s voice in police affairs.”

I have now spoken with 5 or 6 agencies without any resolution to this housing matter. As of yesterday LA County DPSS was looking into a motel voucher referral to the Winter Shelter office. But this morning they notified me it was reserved for "families with children who've exhausted their eligibility for other DPSS services."

But in speaking directly to Winter Shelter offices this morning I was told " we've got rooms" and the referral would get me one.

So I know rooms are available. And given the criminal issues at play, which have been well-documented in dozens of emails to each of you, refusing services to me is unconscionable and could be viewed as retaliatory in nature.

Additionally, as an HIV+ adult, I know HUD and various agencies who get HOPWA funds could be resources as well.
