Good morning, Police Commissioners, I hope everyone is doing well, I would like to start off with a quote from Jane Casey, "Sometimes the hardest thing is admitting you were wrong. It's hard to say you need to be forgiven."

As we enter 2023 the month of January is almost complete. **187 total Covid-19 infections** within the LAPD for this month. **156 of the 187 infections are from the vaccinated** employees and **31 of the 187 are unvaccinated employees within the LAPD**. This does not include the Covid-19 figures for today.

Chief Moore continues to mention 14 "Long Covid Cases" employees are off work. I'm not comprehending what exactly that means, did these employees suffer from an adverse event from the Covid-19 shot? We continue to hear about these employees' month after month. I will pray for a speedy recovery and pray they do not suffer any long-term injuries as a direct result of your current policies and procedures.

On January 26, 2023, the FDA hosted a Vaccine and Related Biological Products Advisory Committee (VRBPAC). The CDC Deputy Director Tom Shimabukuro admitted that Covid-19 vaccines are causing "Debilitating Illnesses". He further stated, "We are aware of these reports of people experiencing long-lasting health problems following Covid vaccination." Perhaps this is what Chief Moore is speaking of during Police Commission meetings when he mentioned there are currently 14 "Long Covid Cases".

You speak a lot about the importance of being transparent with the public, because it builds public trust. Please make a better attempt with aligning your words with your actions. There are several valid questions that have been repeatedly asked and gone unanswered. As a public official you don't get to pick and choose

what questions you decide to provide an answer to. This is the profession that you all have chosen. When you don't provide answers, we begin to question your true intentions.

Mayor Bass, you have a way with words and perhaps you can publicly address the City of Los Angeles and explain how the Covid mandate is in the best interest of public safety and to "protect the City's workforce and the public that it serves". Your own data does not support the C.O.L.A. to have a Covid-19 mandate. We would like to hear what you have to say about this. I think it would be good for you to answer our unanswered questions because no one else is willing apparently. I would like to know your rationale on why this Covid-19 mandate is still active?

Help us all understand because this is clearly not adding up. There is plenty of documentation that being vaccinated doesn't stop infection or transmission of the Covid-19 variants. If you would like this documentation, just ask. I will gladly provide my sources.

Currently the C.O.L.A. only is requiring the unvaccinated employees to test for Covid-19. Many of the positive Covid-19 cases stem from vaccinated employees. This month alone, 83% of your infections are from the vaccinated employees. Why isn't the C.O.L.A. testing all employees every week for Covid-19? I would think by testing ALL employees this would be the best practice to ensure proper public safety for everyone. The vaccinated last year made up 78% of the infections within the LAPD. The C.O.L.A. isn't requiring its employees to stay current on Covid-19 Boosters. Fox 11 news also interviewed Dr. Michael Daignault a board-certified E.R. Doctor. Fox 11 news asked Dr. Daignault, "When was the last time you personally saw, what you would consider a Covid death in the hospital?" Dr. Daignault replied, "It's been a while, it's been over a year and probably since last winter." Fox 11 news further inquired with Dr. Daignault if he believes that Covid is still a public health emergency? Dr. Daignault replied, "As far as the strain on hospitals, No I wouldn't classify Covid as an emergency anymore. Were back to business as usual, and we have been in the E.R. and hospitals for the last year. We are not overstressed with Covid anymore."

Fox 11 news reported that 40% of the admitted Covid positive patients were admitted due to "virus related illness", while the others were admitted for other reasons, and in many cases only learning they were infected when they were tested at the hospital. 171 of the 427 were admitted for Covid-19 related ailments and 256 of the 427 were admitted for other reasons, later learning they have tested positive for Covid while already being admitted into the hospital for other medical reasons.

Good morning, Police Commissioners, I hope everyone is doing well, I would like to start off with a quote from Jane Casey, "Sometimes the hardest thing is admitting you were wrong. It's hard to say you need to be forgiven."

As we enter 2023 the month of January is almost complete. **187 total Covid-19 infections** within the LAPD for this month. **156 of the 187 infections are from the vaccinated** employees and **31 of the 187 are unvaccinated employees within the LAPD**. This does not include the Covid-19 figures for today.

Chief Moore continues to mention 14 "Long Covid Cases" employees are off work. I'm not comprehending what exactly that means, did these employees suffer from an adverse event from the Covid-19 shot? We continue to hear about these employees' month after month. I will pray for a speedy recovery and pray they do not suffer any long-term injuries as a direct result of your current policies and procedures.

On January 26, 2023, the FDA hosted a Vaccine and Related Biological Products Advisory Committee (VRBPAC). The CDC Deputy Director Tom Shimabukuro admitted that Covid-19 vaccines are causing "Debilitating Illnesses". He further stated, "We are aware of these reports of people experiencing long-lasting health problems following Covid vaccination." Perhaps this is what Chief Moore is speaking of during Police Commission meetings when he mentioned there are currently 14 "Long Covid Cases".

You speak a lot about the importance of being transparent with the public, because it builds public trust. Please make a better attempt with aligning your words with your actions. There are several valid questions

that have been repeatedly asked and gone unanswered. As a public official you don't get to pick and choose what questions you decide to provide an answer to. This is the profession that you all have chosen. When you don't provide answers, we begin to question your true intentions.

Mayor Bass, you have a way with words and perhaps you can publicly address the City of Los Angeles and explain how the Covid mandate is in the best interest of public safety and to "protect the City's workforce and the public that it serves". Your own data does not support the C.O.L.A. to have a Covid-19 mandate. We would like to hear what you have to say about this. I think it would be good for you to answer our unanswered questions because no one else is willing apparently. I would like to know your rationale on why this Covid-19 mandate is still active?

Help us all understand because this is clearly not adding up. There is plenty of documentation that being vaccinated doesn't stop infection or transmission of the Covid-19 variants. If you would like this documentation, just ask. I will gladly provide my sources.

How much overtime was spent on protest preparation for dozens of folks this past Friday night? How many helicopters, cruisers, and OT officers wasted taxpayers money in response to ANOTHER brutal murder by police?

What justifies this response? What justifies contacting neighborhood councils warning them about antifascists? What is the goal of this inflammatory language in response to the brutal murder of Tyrone Nichols, Keenan Anderson, Oscar Leon Sanchez, Takar Smith, the 7 people LASD killed this year already, and so many others?! Truly what is going on with this department? Multiple reports detailed the ineffective, inappropriate, and botched response of the LAPD to the 2020 uprising. What new strategies are in place?

With all that was going on Friday night, why wasn't there one cop on traffic control? Why was it up to city bus drivers to block and divert traffic? If there was a traffic collision which resulted in injury based on the ineffective staging strategy of LAPD which drew dozens of people into an open road, how much would that cost taxpayers in settlements from resultant lawsuits against the department?

Why are officers, like officers Peltekian and Salcedo, still pointing "less than lethal" munitions at protester, media, and legal observer's heads/faces, at point-blank?! After the 2020 uprising, the commissioners called for more training, yet the officers you deploy to manage these situations show that they are dangerously negligent and unable to follow protocol. This is the kind of violent, fear-based escalation the public has come to know and expect from the LAPD.

Last week we talked about the new camera cop unit for crowd surveillance at actions - we know you're funding different approaches to crowd control - has there been any research of funding into deescalation of unarmed crowds that doesn't involve weapons such as clubs or foam bullets? Has there been any attempt to meet nonviolent crowds with anything other than violence

Last week Soboroff said, "you only need to do a quick Google to find out how body cams lead to less out of policy action by officers" but the truth is body camera footage is actually routinely used as evidence to convict poor people of things like drug possession and trespassing and almost never used against police officers. And to Soboroff's point, the first result I found when Google-ing "Do body cameras curb police violence" returned this article from the National Institute of Justice, which states "A comprehensive review of 70 studies of bodyworn cameras use found that the larger body of research on body-worn cameras showed no consistent or no statistically significant effects." (https://nij.ojp.gov/topics/articles/research-body-worn-cameras-and-law-enforcement)

The truth about body cameras is that many departments wanted them for years before they were able to finance them. After the killing of Michael Brown, "reformers" enabled millions in federal grants to pay for this technology, increasing the surveillance infrastructure in the guise of "reform" for police violence, while it actually ushered in a new era of state repression. This boon not only further equipped departments like the LAPD with a new paradigm of surveillance technology, but GREATLY profited it's corporate partners, specifically AXON, who's higher-ups Chief Moore was speaking with this past week with regards to tasers.

As we saw in the brutal killing of Tyrese Nichols, body cameras do not deter officers from a culture that they are trained to enact. As Chief Moore said last week, "culture eats policy for breakfast AND lunch." Body cams did nothing to prevent the death of Keenan Anderson or Takar Smith. Body cams did nothing to prevent the death of Valentina Peralta. Instead they manufacture "content" which continuse to perpetuate the cycle of "spectacle lynching" which reenforces police dominance and black disposability, traumatizing Black minds and entertaining white ones. or the threat of violence?

Instead of more funding, more training, and more body cameras, we want to see the suspension of paid administrative leave for cops under investigation. We want to see withheld pensions for cops involved in excessive force. We want cops to be liable for misconduct settlements, not taxpayers.

Finally, we want to see an end to Michael Moore leading the LAPD as chief. You've heard me bring up on the past three meetings some of his failings, including the explosion in South LA which was the result of his officers inappropriate misuse of their bomb-disposal technology, resulting in the death of Auzie Houchins and Ramon Reyes, his sustaining a culture where officers were enabled to circulate a "Valentine Card" with a horrendous reference to Mr. Floyd and the words, "you take my breath away", and lying on record about the number of traffic stops in South Central in 2021, misquoting the number as 74 when in reality it was 639. While he has called for reforms for the LAPD, the unsystematic and haphazard response to a few dozen mourning protesters this past Friday make it clear: he has not done his job and will only continue to divert crucial public funds from life-saving and sustaining public programs to the already bloated LAPD budget. LA deserves more, not Moore.

As a citizen of Los Angeles District 10 I'm writing to submit my comments on your January 31 meeting.

General Public Comment: Divest from LAPD

As a social worker and current grad student studying and researching police, I've long been telling you that LAPD funds need to be divested. You as the Commission need to be creating alternatives to police in traffic stops and responding to mental health crises. I've studied alternatives to police in these capacities --- the academic research shows that they work, and all without police killing people.

You know the numbers - in 2022 US law enforcement killed at least 1,186 people, more than any other year on record. And LAPD is the police department that kills the most people in the country out of all law enforcement agencies. Police kill despite body camera and no matter the amount of trainings you give them. You are complicit in these murders - you continued to just approve everything LAPD wants. Soboroff, you say that people who believe that are uninformed and that there have been many 3-2 or 4-1 votes. What doesn't matter is the makeup of the votes, but their result -- and they always result in approving LAPD to do whatever it wants to do. You need to defund the police, take those funds, and reinvest in the community.

General Public Comment: DO NOT RE-APPOINT MOORE

As a citizen of Los Angeles that is a social worker and continuously works to promote the equity and true community-based public safety of Angelenos, I beg of you **to not support** the re-appointment of Chief Moore for several reasons.

These reasons include the following:

- Chief Moore continues to defend and facilitate LAPD's violence. As its budget increases year after year, LAPD is still the most homicidal police agency in the US. Despite millions of dollars in training and technology for situational awareness, de-escalation, less-lethal weapons, and mental health evaluation teams, LAPD continues to murder people who are in crisis or in need of aid. Already in 2023 LAPD have killed three people who were in crisis Keenan Anderson, Oscar Leon Sanchez, and Takar Smith. This continued police violence has devastating consequences for communities and families, with Black communities being most deeply impacted.
- 2. Chief Moore oversaw LAPD while it targeted protestors during the 2020 uprising following the murder of George Floyd, Breonna Taylor, and countless other victims of police violence. - 5. Chief Moore oversaw LAPD during the December 2020 assault on protestors taking part in a demonstration with BLM-LA outside the Mayor's mansion, in which members of the crowd were beaten with batons.
- 6. Chief Moore created a culture where cops were enabled to circulate a "Valentine Card" with a despicable reference to George Floyd and the words "you take my breath away." Chief Moore promised he would hold accountable the perpetrator of this gross act, but then did not.
- 7. In his course of his tenure, LAPD continued racialized stops of Black pedestrians and drivers, which Moore defends by presenting LAPD's crime reports through the lens of race: a decades-old tactic to falsely imply race and criminality are linked while justifying the deeply racist policing of LAPD.

- 12. Chief Moore Continued a culture and system in which Metro police officers felt empowered and entitled to enter people they stopped into California's gang database without justification.
- 13. Chief Moore has robbed the budget of the city of LA in 2018 by unethically taking both a \$1.3 million lump sum retirement and a nearly \$400,000 annual salary.
- 14. Chief Moore failed to act on behalf of an LAPD captain who was being sexually harassed at work.
- 15. Chief Moore has continuously Ignored the demands of approximately ⅓ of Angelenos who consistently and loudly demand that LAPD is defunded
- 16. Chief Moore presented internal investigations that repeatedly avoid accountability, including finding that not one of the 4862 racial-bias complaints filed by the public were valid.

We need a chief that will prioritize the diversion of police calls to mental health responders and community ambassadors. Moore *said* he would be open to that but has done nothing to actually do that.

I believe Chief Moore should not be reappointed because he has made at least three decisions that hurt the strength of the LAPD and have hurt my community.

First, Chief Moore ordered all LAPD stations to remove the thin blue line flags because many activists demanded so. This flag represents the honor and respect from the police to an officer who lost his life in the line of duty. Have the families of those officers been asked how they feel about the lack of respect from those activists? The flag should be at the lobby of each police station because it is meaningful to the police.

Second, Chief Moore has failed to back up the LAPD and as a result many officers' morale has gone down. Many of them can't wait to retire early and not many community members are recruited to serve. The communities want more police presence. They want more

Third, Chief Moore transferred officer Contreras from CD7 to CD6 because he reported obstruction of justice from a City Council member who interfered with the search warrant process. This is under current investigation by the FBI. Chief Moore then demoted Captain Smith and transferred him to a different station without previous notice. I am extremely upset by this because these are officers our community is used to dealing with. They are both liked, loved, and respected.

I want to move on to request that we increase the police force. Reimagining Los Angeles simply did not work and proof of that is the high number of incidents of Smash and Grab. Nothing is free and while businesses are suffering for all those items being stolen, eventually it will come down to the consumer. The consumer will have to pay higher prices to make up for the loss due to theft.

I strongly disagree with statements made that black and brown people are being murdered every day. The ordinary citizen who is abiding by the law is not being persecuted nor harassed by the police. Please stop bundling all of us in a single pile. My community is afraid to speak up because activists are loud and aggressive and they don't respect others' points of view.

The community wants our SLOs to do the job they were intended to do. We need them back connecting with students, parents, and all members of the community.

I support the motions regarding money donations to be utilized for police activities.
