




Types of Crime Reports That Can Be Filed Online:

- **Harassing Phone Calls:** Any person who repeatedly, with the intent to annoy, telephones or makes contact by means of an electronic communication. For example, immediate hang-ups, obscene language, emails, text messages with no known suspects.
- **Lost Property:** Personal property that was unintentionally left by its true owner. For example, property left behind at an unknown location or left behind with no attempt to retrieve it.
- **Vandalism:** Any person who maliciously damages, destroys or defaces the property of another person. For example, knocking over a mailbox, spray painting a wall, or throwing a rock through a window.
- **Theft:** Personal property taken from a publicly accessible location. For example, a package is taken from your porch; or, you left your wallet behind in a restaurant, but when you attempted to go back to retrieve it, the wallet was no longer there.
- **Theft from Vehicle:** Theft from an unlocked or locked vehicle.
- **Minor Traffic Collisions:** Minor injuries and you have exchanged information
- **Hit and Run:** Damage caused by another vehicle in which the driver should have left information or fled the scene without stopping to provide information.
- **VICE Tips:** Tips may be reported filer may remain anonymous.
- **Narcotics Tips:** Tips may be reported filer may remain anonymous.
- **Identity Theft:** Crime location should be reported as the filer's home residence address (regardless of where the crime is believed to have occurred), and reported to the filer's local law enforcement agency for investigation.
- **Hate Incident:** A hate incident is any non-criminal act, including words, directed against a person(s) based on that person's actual or perceived protected characteristics. Hate incidents do not violate criminal law statutes. Hate incidents are generally protected free speech under the First Amendment of the U.S. Constitution.
- **Illegal Dumping:** Willfully or intentionally depositing, dropping, dumping, placing, or throwing onto public or private property. What Is Human Trafficking?

Human trafficking is the illegal trade of people for exploitation or commercial gain. Every year, numerous men, women and children are trafficked in countries around the world, including the United States. Human trafficking is among the most profitable transnational crimes, next to drug and weapons trafficking. Victims of human trafficking rarely come forward to seek help because of language barriers, fear of the traffickers and or fear of law enforcement. Traffickers use force, fraud or coercion to lure their victims into labor or commercial sexual exploitation. The trauma caused by the traffickers can be so great that most victims may not identify themselves as victims, or ask for help.

Sex Trafficking is the exploitation of an adult or a child who engages in commercial sexual activity for financial gain. Sex trafficking charges may be brought in cases in which adult victims are deprived of their liberty and commercially sexually exploited. Any sexually exploited child may be a sex trafficking victim even if there is no force or coercion. Any minor who is induced, caused or persuaded to engage in commercial sexual activity is a victim of human sex trafficking.

¿Qué es la trata de personas?

La trata de personas es el comercio ilegal de personas para su explotación o beneficio comercial. Cada año, muchos hombres, mujeres y niños son objeto de trata en países de todo el mundo, incluidos los Estados Unidos. La trata de personas es uno de los delitos transnacionales más rentables, junto con el tráfico de drogas y armas. Las víctimas de la trata de personas rara vez acuden a buscar ayuda debido a las barreras idiomáticas, el miedo a los traficantes o el miedo a las agencias de cumplimiento de la ley. Los traficantes utilizan la fuerza, el fraude o la coerción para atraer a sus víctimas a la explotación sexual laboral o comercial. El trauma causado por los traficantes puede ser tan grande que la mayoría de las víctimas pueden no identificarse como víctimas ni pedir ayuda.

La **trata sexual** es la explotación de un adulto o un niño que realiza una actividad sexual comercial para obtener un beneficio económico. Pueden presentarse cargos por trata sexual en casos en los que las víctimas adultas sean privadas de su libertad y explotadas sexual y comercialmente. Todo niño explotado sexualmente puede ser víctima de trata sexual, aunque no haya fuerza ni coerción. Todo menor que sea inducido, obligado o persuadido a participar en una actividad sexual comercial es víctima de trata sexual de personas.

TIK-TOK AUTO THEFT TREND



2010 - 2021 KIA's / HYUNDAI's
(VARIOUS MAKES AND MODELS)



In 2021, Kia and Hyundai vehicles made up almost 13% of all vehicle thefts in the City of Los Angeles. In 2022, Kia and Hyundai vehicles account for almost 20% of all vehicle thefts, 7% increase for these vehicles.

The current Tik-Tok Kia/Hyundai social media challenge is comprising factor for the increase in vehicle thefts. The primary cause for the increase in vehicle thefts is that Kia and Hyundai vehicles, produced between 2010 thru 2021, are not equipped with an ignition immobilizer. Therefore, these vehicle ignitions can be compromised using a USB cable. It is recommended that owners of these vehicles utilize a steering wheel locking device or aftermarket anti-theft system is an effective way to deter these thefts.

TIPS TO MINIMIZE THEFTS:

- Install a steering wheel locking device
- Install a battery disconnect switch
- Install a kill switch (may require professional installation)
- Install an aftermarket anti-theft system (may require professional installation)
- Lock all windows and doors
- Park in a well-lit area
- Park in a secured location (i.e., garage, parking structure, etc.)
- Install GPS tracking device



Burglars spend an average of 8 to 12 minutes in your home.

65.8% of burglaries are residential.



Homes without security systems are about three times as likely to be broken into than homes with security systems.

First stop: Usually the master bedroom because most people keep their valuables there.

Favorite items: Cash, jewelry, electronic equipment, silver, guns and other items easy to sell.

 The typical house burglar is a male teenager who lives within a couple of miles of your home. The chance of being victimized by a professional thief is low.

PRECAUTIONS YOU CAN TAKE

Burglars search for homes that appear to be unoccupied. A car in the driveway, motion-sensitive exterior lights, interior lights, and radios and TVs on timers all give the impression that someone is in the home. Stop newspaper and mail delivery, and have neighbors watch your home.

Burglars want to spend no more than 60 seconds breaking into a home. Measures that raise this time — deadbolt locks, bars on windows, and pins in sash windows — might change a burglar's mind.

Don't give burglars any help. Clear shrubs and trees around your home. Don't give burglars a place to hide. Secure tool sheds and ladders. Some thieves will steal tools from around your property and use them to break windows and doors.



Prevent Catalytic Converter Theft

What is it?

- It is a critical component of your car's exhaust system and can cost up to \$2,000 to replace.
- Thieves target it because it contains expensive metals, has a street value of up to \$200, and removal can take less than 1 minute.



Theft Prevention Tips

- Park in a garage or a well-lit area.
- Engrave your VIN number into your catalytic converter.
- Install a catalytic converter protection device.
- Install a car alarm to set off when it detects vibration.






