This Train the Trainer is designed to prepare a cadre of instructors to teach the Firearms Semi Auto Pistol 1911, 20-hour course (1850-31810).

**Prerequisite:** the students must be HITS certified to participate in the training and become a member of the 1911 Transition Training Cadre.

<u>Instructional goal</u>: To teach officers how to present and proficiently, operate a 1911 semi-automatic pistol. Topics covered Include proper manipulation, marksmanship, maintenance, parts replacement, care and cleaning of this weapon system.

- I. FIREARMS SEMI AUTO 1911 INTRODUCTION AND OVERVIEW (30 mins)0600-0630
  - A. DISTRIBUTE: Firearms Semi Auto Pistol 1911 20-hour 1850-31810 Lesson Plan
    - 1. Point out that the students will be looking at the course from the perspective of a student for the first 20 hours and then from the role of an instructor for the remaining 20 hours
    - 2. Advise the students to follow along in the lesson plan and make notes that will help them when they are teaching the course
  - B. Advise the students that they will be tested on their ability to not only operate the 1911 but on their ability to teach others to operate the 1911

    - a. Ensure that shooter keeps pistol pointed in safe direction
    - b. Ensure that shooter during the course of this drill maintains a safe shooting position be aware of hazards

#### X. LIVE FIRE DRILLS

(60 mins) 1100-1200

- A. **LECTURETTE**: One handed manipulations
- B. **DEMONSTRATE**: One handed shooting
- C. **DRILLS**: One handed shooting
  - 1. Students will dry practice the above drills
  - 2. Students will continue the drills until instructor assess their ability
  - 3. Students will live fire the drills
    - a. Students will fire 2 fully loaded magazines in each position

- b. At 7, 10 and 17 yards
- c. Students shall reload using 2 hands
- C. PRACTICAL APPLICATON: Bonus Course
  - 1. Students will receive a brief of the elements of the Bonus Course
    - a. Discuss each of the 6 phases of fire
    - b. Discuss starting positions
    - c. Discuss rules and regulations of the course of fire
  - 2. The student will fire the Bonus Course of fire 1 time as described in the LAPD Manual
  - Ensure that the students score is recorded in to the LAPD computer system (SQUAB)
- D. Upon completion of the drills clean up the range by policing up the brass casings and putting away all of the targets

# XI. LIVE FIRE TACTICAL DRILLS

(150 mins)

#### 1300-1530

- A. **LEARNING ACTIVITY:** Practical Combat Range
  - **1.** Range preparation:
    - **a.** Students will load six rounds of ammunition in three magazines at a designated loading barrel
    - **b.** Officers are to make their weapons ready for live fire while positioned at the designated loading barrel.
    - **c.** Eye protection, ear protection and body armor is required for all officers while on the Practical Combat Range.
  - 2. Debrief
    - a. Review scores with student
    - b. Cover each scenario as a group
    - c. Discuss the seriousness of identifying the threats prior to deploying deadly force
    - d. Discuss policy and /or legal issues
    - e. Discuss Use of Force considerations
    - f. Special Order 36 Objective Reasonableness
    - g. Moral obligations

#### XII. KEY LEARNING POINTS

(30 mins) 1530-1600

- A. Effective use of the 1911 will provide the user and increased probability of survival in the field
- B. In order to remain effective in the field shooters must to continue to practice and enhance their manipulation and marksmanship skills

#### XIV. DEBRIEF of 20 HOUR COURSE

- A. Identify from the students perspective
  - 1. Time to learn the skills
  - 2. Blocks of instruction appropriate to gain an understanding of the pistol and its capabilities
  - 3. Does the student have all of the necessary skills to care for the pistol and all of the associated equipment
  - 4. Thorough understanding of the Department policy as it relates to the 1911 as an on duty and off duty weapon

# XV. INSTRUCTOR ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

(60 mins) 0700-0800

- A. Current certifications
  - 1. Point out the importance of maintaining not only the proficiency with the weapon but also as an instructor
  - 2. Advise instructors that they must participate in Instructor Update training
  - 3. 1070 requirements
    - a. Specialty Instructor Training
    - b. 8 hours of update training every 3 years
    - c. Must teach at least 24 hours in that same time frame
- B. Always enforce all safety rules
- C. Instructor student ratios must be maintained
  - 1. 1:40 in class room
  - 2. 1: 5 for live fire static drills
  - 3. 1:1 for shooting on the move drills
- D. POST roster must be completed
  - 1. No Social Security numbers
  - 2. POST ID #s instead
  - 3. POST ID # located on the InfoWeb on front page
- E. POST rosters must be submitted with 10 days of course
- F. Ensure pistols are inspected and registered with the LAPD Department Armorer
