<b>6:05 – 6:15</b>	<b>Introduction / Updates</b> Crime update: 13 homicides ytd vs 8 last year at this time. Robberies down 8.7%;230 ytd vs 252 last yr. Aggravated assaults up 2.6%: 543 ytd vs 529 last year. Shots fired incidents116 ytd vs 105 last yr. 40 victs shot ytd (includes 13 homicides) vs. 44 last yr. Burglaries 183 vs 124 last yr. Stolen vehicles 472 ytd vs. 487 last yr. Burglary/Theft from vehicle: 310 ytd vs. 286 last yr. Thefts down 32% , 214 ytd vs. 318 last yr.; Overall property down 2% . Shots fired up 20%.. We had a community Carnival Fri thru Sunday. Sat & Sun evening we had a group of kids showed up & intentionally disrupted the event. Fights broke out amongst themselves & officers forcing carnival to shutdown on Sat & end event early on Sunday.	<b>Captain III Adrian Gonzalez</b> <b>77<sup>th</sup> Street Commanding Officer</b>
<b>6:15 – 6:30</b>	<b>Mental Evaluation Unit</b> Collaboration between LAPD and La County Departmental health, 7 teams for entire city. Currently have about 70 field officers, and 30 detectives and supervisors. We are mental health crisis response for any 911 calls. Partners are psychologists, social workers, registered nurses, marriage and family therapists. Go to court to advocate for mental health services. MEU training unit does 40 hr mental health intervention training for department.  Bernita: 988 for suicide crisis before sending law enforcement. Tennille:Why do you guys wait until officers pass probationary period to have them take the training versus taking it right away.
