


Commendable Officer and Citizen Incidents

On January 27, 2024, at approximately 1755 hours, Officer Cardenas and Officer Diaz were in the area of 68th Street and Figueroa Street, when they observed a vehicle driving at a high rate of speed. The vehicle was travelling approximately 50 mph in a residential area and failed to stop at a cleared posted stop sign. The officers conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle. During the investigation, officers received consent from the driver of the vehicle, to search the vehicle. During the search, officers located a firearm under the center console cup holder. The driver was detained for the firearm. Officers discovered that the firearm was a reported stolen firearm. The driver was booked for concealed weapon in vehicle.

Commendable Officer and Citizen Incidents

On /16/2023 Officer Aguilar # 43073 and Officer Salguero # 425558 were working 77th GED. Officers were conducting crime suppression in Crenshaw and Slauson. Officers observed a vehicle that had serval violations. Officers conducted a traffic stop on that vehicle. Both Officers recognized both occupants as documented Rollin 60's. Officer Aguilar observed the passenger make a furtive movement towards the center consol. Officers order both Driver and Passenger to exit the vehicle. In plain sight Officers observed narcotics and also notice the original integrity of vehicle had been tampered with by the passenger. Based on the GED training and expertise dealing with gang members. The GED officers conducted a through search of the vehicle. Officers also recovered a firearm 9mm, blue steel fully loaded. The suspect was then taken into custody as well as the firearm was recovered. Good Job by the Officers paying close attention to detail. Thanks to these Officers removing another weapon off the street of Los Angeles.

Personal Safety & Crime Prevention Tips

Basic Personal Safety Safeguard Your Mail

· Retrieve your mail as soon as possible from your mailbox, or set up a P.O. box, so sensitive mail cannot be stolen.

· When possible, mail letters directly at the post office or with your postal worker.

Set up Direct Deposits for Benefit Checks

• Physical checks can be stolen from mailboxes or easily picked up by someone who enters your home. It's best to have your benefit checks deposited directly into your account.

Never Allow an Unsolicited Contractor to Enter Your Home

· Keep your doors locked, and do not invite them in. Ask for identification, even if they say it is an emergency.

· If necessary, call the company to confirm the individual is meant to be there.

• Call a neighbor or 911 if you sense something is not right.

Protect Yourself From Financial Elder Abuse

· Maintain control over your finances and monitor accounts for abnormal withdrawals.

· Regularly review your will, power of attorney, and property titles.

Crime Prevention Tips While You're Out and About

Travel Light

· Carry as few cards as possible in your wallet – that goes for identity cards and credit cards alike. This will save you many headaches if your wallet is lost or stolen, and it helps prevent identity

· Always keep your purse close to your body and never leave it in a shopping cart.

· Avoid carrying large amounts of cash.

Engage in Good Cell Phone Habits Carrying a cell phone with you is a good idea for many reasons, including getting in touch with loved ones or calling for help during an emergency. Just don't let it distract you from what's going on around you. Thieves target people talking on phones or

texting while taking a walk or shopping. Smartphones are frequently stolen right out of people's hands, so keeping it out of sight is best. You can check your texts and play games when you get home!

Commendable Officer Incident

On February 17, 2024, at approximately 2100 hours, Officers Mott #43102 and Choe #43079, assigned to 77th Division Gang Enforcement Detail, were conducting extra patrol in the area of 11th Ave and 60th St. This area has a high history of shootings, robberies, homicides, grand theft autos, various traffic violations and gang activity.

On this day, Officers observed a vehicle that made multiple stop sign violations resulting in a traffic stop. During the traffic stop, the Officers observed several order vehicle code violations that ultimately led them to an illegally possessed firearm inside in the car. They were able to safely conduct a thorough investigation and take the identified subject/driver into custody without any force.

Thanks to the great work by these officers there is one less illegally possessed gun out there in our streets. The presence of the Officers, and the extra patrol provided, shows the community that we are listening to their complaints and doing something to resolve or minimize the occurrence of traffic and firearm related incidents.

This resource connects people to non-emergency City services and information. Use it to make service request which are trackable with confirmation numbers.

Crime Tips

-Always "BE AWARE" of your surroundings, especially while traveling on foot or waiting at the bus stops located on Crenshaw Blvd.

-"LOCK and SECURE vehicles" (Older model vehicles need alarms and clubs for additional security). Do not leave any invisible property (i.e., phone charging cable/bags/clothing) inside vehicle. Secure property in truck of vehicle. If you observe any crime in progress, call the police immediately by dialing 911.

Commendable Officer and Citizen Incidents

On February 14, 2024, Gang Enforcement Officer Pena (Serial No. 42444) and his partner Officer Phillips (Serial No. 43950) were in the area of 85th Street and Stanford Avenue when they observed a group of individuals standing on a corner. Officers observed a suspect concealing a firearm in their front sweater pocket. Their investigation revealed a documented gang member, with previous convictions, to be in possession of a firearm. Officers interviewed witnesses and attained a statement from suspect who admitted possession.

Officers are to be commended for their outstanding observations, investigative skills, and knowledge of the area. Their proactive work resulted in the quick apprehension of a documented gang member and the removal of a loaded firearm from the streets.

On February 21, 2024, Patrol Officer Nafissi (Serial No. 40832) and his partner Officer Duarte (Serial No. 45468), were in the area of Florene Ave and Avalon Bl when they conducted a WW check on a vehicle which returned stolen. During their investigation, Officers detained and arrested the vehicle driver. Their investigation revealed that the suspect/driver was not given permission to drive the vehicle. Consequently, the driver was arrested for 10851 (a) CVC. Officers are commended for a thorough investigation and the fast apprehension of a vehicle theft suspect. Vehicle related crimes are high in the area where suspect was first observed. Officers were able to remove a suspect who was driving a vehicle without owner consent and help a community member attain his property back.

Commendable Officer Incident

Officers received a call from an Amazon delivery employee stating that someone had jumped into his delivery van and drove off. Officers Vega and Wu responded to the scene and met with the driver who was able to provide GPS updated locations of the delivery van. Officers Foca and Valenzuela responded to the updated location provided where they observed the delivery van parked. Officers additionally observed a female suspect walking away from the van carrying Amazon packages. She was detained pending an investigation into the vehicle and package theft.

With the assistance of a supervisor from Amazon and additional officers. Our team was able to positively identify the detained suspect with video evidence as the person who stole the delivery van and the packages. Furthermore, GPS evidence led officers to a local RV encampment where the suspect had parked the truck for several minutes prior to driving away. At the RV encampment several additional Amazon packages were recovered concealed around the RVs.

A huge thank you to all involved in removing this suspect from our streets. And a special thank you for the additional follow up investigations resulting in our community members getting there packages back. It is cooperation like this that provides our community with a safer neighborhood for all.

Commendable Officer and Citizen Incidents

On February 20, 2024 Officer Do #43209, and his partner Officer Ramos #44445 were at 9326 S Western Ave serving a Search Warrant. These Officers are assigned to 77th Narcotics Unit. Officers were monitoring an illegal Cannabis Dispensary.

77th Narcotics Unit served a search warrant on November 1, 2023 where they seized 30 gross pounds of cannabis products and a firearm. Due to the dispensary conducting an illegal operation 77th Narcotics unit conducted a controlled buy.

On February 20, 2024 with Search Warrant in hand undercover personnel entered 9326 S Western Ave. Undercover personnel utilized audio and video to record illegal cannabis sales. Undercover personnel purchased a \$20.00 black Ziploc-type bag containing a green leafy substance resembling cannabis.

Officers formulated a plan and executed the Search Warrant of the Illegal Cannabis Dispensary. During the investigation there were 6 suspects cited for operating an illegal dispensary, 1 firearm was recovered along with 22 pounds of Cannabis.

Officers are to be commended for their teamwork, and investigative skills that resulted in the closure of an Illegal Cannabis Dispensary.

Commendable Officers Incident

On 02-15-24 at approximately 1500 hours, Officer Nafissi #40832 and his partner Officer Duarte # 45468, received a radio call, ADW in progress at Tumby's Pizza, located at 8326 S. Western Ave. Suspect is armed with a knife. Officers arrived at scene and observed a person matching the suspect's description standing in front of Tumby's. Officers gave the suspect commands to lay on the ground. The suspect went to the ground and took a sitting position. The suspect's own momentum caused him to fall backwards onto his back. This movement caused a grey camouflage knife to fall out of his pocket. Suspect was taken into custody without further incident. The victim informed officers that suspect raised the knife above his head and threaten to kill him. There was a person who witnessed the incident and advised the suspect the police were on there way. Victim walked into Tumby's asking for help and waited until police arrived. Officers are to be commended for their quick response, attention to detail, and sound tactics in dealing with an armed and dangerous suspect. Suspect was arrested and booked at 77th station for ADW with a knife.

Crime Tips

Burglary is a crime of opportunity. Make their work risky and difficult, and you stand a good chance of stopping before they get in.

Most burglars enter through unlocked doors and windows. Lock all doors and windows.

Add security bar on windows and doors. Remove shrubs and add light sensors to dark areas.

Add a dog big or small to your family. Criminals tend to avoid homes with dogs.

Install a home alarm system or participate /organize

"Neighborhood Watch". Get to know your neighbor.

If a suspicious person knocks on your door and you feel threatened or uncomfortable. Call 311 or 911 in case of emergency. (DO NOT OPEN THE DOOR!!)

If you suspect a burglary:

*Don't go in-the burglary may still be inside.

*Don't open for business—your employees and costumers may unwittingly alter valuable evidence.

*Call police immediately!

Burglary is the most preventable of crimes. Simply make your home the least burglar-attractive-and most burglary proof-in your neighborhood. Look at your home through a burglar's eyes and improve the worst area first. Fortify doors and windows, good outdoor security lighting and wireless burglar alarms can go a long way towards protecting your home

- 1: Stay visible- wear light or reflective clothing
- 2: Stop and look before crossing
- 3: Stay alert, phone free, and use crosswalks
