The Board of Police Commissioners (Board) shall provide an opportunity for members of the public to address the Board on any specific item of business on the agenda. During each regular meeting, the Board shall also provide an opportunity for members of the public to address the Board on any topic within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board ("General Public Comment"). All public comment shall be taken at or near the beginning of each meeting.

A member of the public wishing to speak on an agenda item(s) will be allowed to speak for up to one (1) minute per item, up to a total of two (2) minutes per meeting. A member of the public wishing to speak during general Public Comment shall be allowed to speak up to one (1) minute at each regular meeting. Speakers who are allowed to speak on both agenda items and general public comment shall have a cumulative total of three (3) minutes as allocated above. In order to allow members of the public who do not attend in person to participate in public comment, the Board shall also take public comment via electronic means. The Board shall take a total of 45 minutes of public comment.

Time cannot be ceded to another speaker, and an individual may speak only once during the public comment period. While every effort will be made to accommodate as many speakers as possible, some members of the public may not be heard if the number of speakers exceeds the amount of time allotted for public comment. The Presiding Officer may manage the meeting and the public comment time allotted in consultation with the City Attorney.

To facilitate the orderly process of public comment and to assist the Board in conducting business as efficiently as possible, a member of the public who attends in person and wishes to speak on the agenda item or during General Public Comment is requested to complete and submit a speaker card to a Sergeant-at-Arms. Individuals will be called in the order in which the speaker cards are submitted by the Sergeant-at-Arms to the Board Secretary.
