Subject: LAPD public comment meeting on March 19th, 2024; Los Angeles residents notice of intent to file a lawsuit against Los Angeles city/county, and LAPD (Helicopter pilots) and the FAA for intent to cause harm.

24 hours a day, 7 days a week, Los Angeles county residents are dealing with rogue LAPD helicopter pilots sitting less than 50FT from the rooftops of our homes, schools, workplaces and other day to day spaces. In the attached videos, there are two military choppers and 1 LAPD pilot flying low over a residential community and near a grade school. The daycare in the area had to close because no child can grow up healthy in these polluted conditions.

LAPD helicopter pilots, per the LA Controller's report and other FACT based evidence, have/are causing much more harm than good. We have rogue state agents that are coming into our towns

causing 24 hours of noise, fuel, and lead pollution linked to violent crime, dementia, heart disease, hearing loss and other serious issues. We will be posting the information about these LAPD pilots on flyers in the coming weeks as we go out into the community to take back our public spaces from these rogue militias that are polluting us non-stop.

We have proof of the city of Los Angeles/LA City council aiding LAPD to cut down trees (to deprive residents of oxygen) in order to allow LAPD pilots to invade our residential towns. LAPD helicopter pilots are not a measure of public safety, they are a measure of public harm and wasteful spending. We will not be paying taxes to deal with 24 hours of noise pollution in our communities. LAPD is flying so low and fast across our homes that they are knocking stuff off of tables within the home, they are depriving residents of sleep and so much more. We are not going to be paying taxes to deal with this. We will create a new currency if it comes down to it in order to starve this system out completely. Basic civil liberties are being violated.

Along with requesting land back for new towns that are founded on COMMON SENSE PRINCIPLES, we have started going neighborhood to neighborhood in Los Angeles county to support communities within Los Angeles city/county that may want to withdraw from LA City council districts and into intentional ones. We simply cannot allow LAPD helicopter pilots and other rogue aviation pilots to destroy our communities as they are being aided by a corrupt government that has REFUSED to address concerns of LAPD helicopter pilots and other rogue aviation that has destroyed the material conditions of our communities. More billboards and more information about the harms of noise pollution are coming soon to the community. We will again provide evidence to the collective to show that this government has intent to cause harm as they have refused redress of a very serious issue. There are more

than 200,000 residents that have left Los Angeles county within the last couple of years and I have written testimony to show that many residents left because of LAPD helicopter pilots specifically. We are dealing with systematic violence and it will no longer stand. LAPD helicopter pilots are disrupting the entirety of LA county, not just Los Angeles city and that is a very serious problem.

LAPD Chief Dominic Choi, Board of Police Commissioners, the Entire LAPD and Public,

Improved morale among the officers will lead to many positive benefits to the officers and most importantly, public safety for all.

So what is the plan to improve officer morale? We are sure that Chief Choi will bring innovative ideas and thinking to this issue.

In the spirit of collaboration and partnership with a shared vision of a more capable LAPD that can more effectively protect and serve the citizens of Los Angeles we humbly submit some ideas to improve officer morale and public safety, especially community policing.

1. Return the Blue Line American flag to the lobbies of the stations where they were removed. This powerful symbolic act will show the proper respect to fallen officers who sacrificed their lives in the line of duty and all officers who risk their lives every day and make up the fabric of law enforcement and the noble profession of policing in America.

2. Implement a program for the officers that requires all of them to "check-in" with a police psychologist for a general assessment. Everyone has problems at some point in their life and officers have an exceptionally stressful life. Show the officers you care and that there is no stigma to going to BSS for a mental health check. If everyone has to go within a three year cycle then some will take the initiative to go sooner but all will go sooner or later. It could be called the "Officer Wellness Program" and if it saves one life of an officer it will have served its purpose.

3. Do an assessment of the Police Stations as to the physical condition of the buildings and the atmosphere which should be positive and inspirational.

4. Have Police clergy and/or Police Psychologists regularly visit Roll Calls and be there for the officers for consultation.

5. Immediately abolish the "Covid-19 vaccine" requirement for officers and for police officer applicants.

6. Overhaul the [LAPDONLINE.ORG](https://lapdonline.org) website and have it emphasize the strength and nobility of policing.

Update all the information and make it a tool of community policing where LAPD meetings with all communities are listed BEFORE the meeting. All meetings should be hybrid meetings with a virtual option.

These are some suggestions from the Voices that are For the LAPD. We, the People who love and appreciate our officers and will work with the LAPD to truly implement community policing and reduce the fear and incidence of crime.
