6:00 – 6:05	Greetings / Opening Prayer Tennille Parish gave opening prayer	Tennille Parish / Pastor Cagle
6:05 – 6:15	Introduction / Updates Capt Gonzalez provided updates. Not available at this time.	Captain III Adrian Gonzalez 77 <sup>th</sup> Street Commanding Officer
6:10 – 6:18	Stolen Veh/GTAs  Where to place airtags in vehicle. Where to buy airtags, ie amazon, that is compatible with your phone. Most common vehicles stolen in 77th are Chevy Silverados, Kias, Hyundais, occasional Dodge Chargers/Challengers. Occasionally GMC/Denali. Why stolen vehicle numbers declined – community is more informed of their vehicles, new DA filing cases. Capt Gonzalez – People who steal vehicles make up small percentage of people, new DA files cases making those people less likely to steal again. Different taskforce deals with street takeovers. The vehicles burned are stolen.	Detective Kincaid
6:18 – 6:34	SLO Updates  SLO Canizalez, 12A73, most crime is down except for vehicle thefts. 28 prior, 35 now. Street takeover in the area of Century/Western. Report takeovers when you see it, do not wait for meeting. That way they can be kept track of. RVs appearing more. Use 311 app to report any encampments. Report to Council District as well.  SLO Cook advised most crime was motor vehicle related. Community advised Cook unknown persons casing the area. Other crime is down. Beautifying community is recommended by reaching out to council district to participate in cleanups. Coffee with a Cop was successful.  SLO Cardenas, 12A53, advised crime is mainly auto theft but numbers overall are down. RVs are appearing more or just move when approached by LE. 311 is a tool to report. Special Olympics fundraising yielded \$5,000. SLO Cardenas clarifies the boundaries of his area.  SLO Abanobi, 12A51, advised most crime is down in his area. GTAs are down by 3. Currently at 52 incidents. Typically a lot of Kias, but now more Chevy Silverado and even push to start. Push to start vehicles need	77 <sup>th</sup> SLO Updates

	special knowledge to steal. Discusses possible defenses such as wheel locks, steering wheel locks, airtags, community watch. Most robberies in the area happen around bus stops. Targets are mostly females/older females. Suspects are mostly children. They steal phones. Cameras in the area assist specialized units with takeovers. Vallarta grocery opened up. No longer food desert.  SLO Sovick, 12A45, wishes mothers happy mother's day. Crime is down in his area. Decreased car thefts. Part 1 crime is down 42%. Most of crime in the area is related to unhoused population. Impounded 3 RV chassis. Mobile clinic will be providing resources for people without proper documentation to get houses. 7-11 at Vermont and Florence is in Sovick's area. Citizen advised 7-11 is dirty. Sovick advised 7-11 corporate has taken over store from store owner because store owner/franchisee did not maintain store. Other SLOs had to arrive early to clean 7-11 parking lot, ie dirty diapers in parking lot. Sovick has good connection with 7-11 corporate. ACE checking store next to 7-11 had unhoused people removed, approximately 9 people.	
6:34 – 6:36	Updates Tennille Parish Parish advised meetings are being rotated from in-person to virtual. In person is at 5pm. Great time to meet community. Virtual is still at 6pm. If anyone wants to join the CPAB, contact the station or any listed personnel. Capt Gonzalez advised application and background must be completed. 6:36 – 6:47	Questions / Comments  Morgan asked about officiate from Dawson's office regarding street lighting. Officiate advised solar lights will be going up soon in certain areas. Morgan asked where the lights will be positioned. Capt Gonzalez advised to reach out to CD08 for that information as none was provided to the LAPD.  Morgan thanked the officers involved in reducing crime overall in the 77th Street area. Morgan asked if the deportations effected the reduction in crime. Capt Gonzalez advised it's too soon to tell. Specialized units have been doing a lot of work. New policies changed, meaning suspects are not immediately released following arrest for a crime. The reduction in crime is the police being on the street doing what they can. A lot of work goes on between the detectives and DA's office to convict on crime. The deportations are unknown as there's no statistics to say one way or the other. Gang violence is rarely discussed in CPAB meetings because there has been a major decrease in gang activities. Gangs still	C-PAB and Guests

	exist but there has been a lot of work, from stopping kids joining gangs to prosecuting. New DA has helped as people are aware there are now consequences to crimes. General assaults are down but domestic violence is up. Unknown correlation at this time as what is causing an increase in domestic violence. Numerous resources are being made available to domestic violence. Aside from that there has not been any noticeable differences due to immigrants.  Morgan asked about upticks in domestic violence and whether the mandated vaccine has anything to do with it. Morgan has seen update in crimes/behavior after the vaccine. Capt Gonzalez advised there's no way to measure that but it could be drug use/mental health/etc. Capt Gonzalez discussed how important it is to get to the root cause and they're working with resources. Domestic violence victims will change their stories or refuse to move forward with law enforcement. Prior it was about 15% but now it hovers around 40%. Teams go out with officers to provide victims with resources. LE assists with victims at time, but long term victims change their opinions.  Morgan asked about burglaries. Capt Gonzalez advised 37% reduction, 81 burglaries less than last year.  Parish advised there are different resources for domestic violence victims.
