As I came to visit him in the hospital, I remember each time him always saying "tell them I'll be back in the park soon. We have more work to do."

I for one will miss his smile, his words of encouragement and dedication to a better quality of life and safety for wonderful people of Skid Row who deserve it. We have a lot of new faces in Skid Row as of late many of them women. No matter your reason for being here, I want you to know that your safety is important. We have had a increase in sexual assualts this year. For the new arrivals, my hope is that you find shelter as soon as possible. These streets can be cruel.

I want you to know that if you are sexually assaulted by anyone out there, it is NEVER your fault. It doesn't matter if you were homeless, using drugs or engaged in sex work, if anyone has commits a sexual act against your will or without your consent, you will not be judged by us, no matter what some may tell you to dissuade you from the help you need. We are here to serve you like anyone else in the city.

Please be careful sharing narcotics, many sexual assualts occur when a victim is provided one thing, but it is laced with something that incapacitates you.

Avoid entering tents of people you don't know well or trust. The same goes for hotels.


If you can, avoid sleeping on public sidewalks please. Get to a shelter.

Historically, women have made up 40% of the Skid Row population. 2/3 of them have been a victim of sexual assualt.

My hope is that you are never a victim, but if it happens, when it is safe to do so, please call 911, and cooperate with repsonding officers so we can get justice for you.
