I get a lot of complaints from people who live in the community about loud radios.

At the end of the day, it comes down to respect. You must respect people's right to peace and quiet. Many people in this area are in recovery, and struggle with many issues. The noise interferes with their recovery and impacts their mental health.

Skid Row is not a quasi community. It is a real community. There are people here who want the same thing people want in other communities. And that is a safe, sane and queit place to live.

I know you love your music. I have to admit, some of it I love, but when the community is in right standing with the law, I must support them. There are laws in place that prohibit playing loud music in residential areas. I want to educate you on them, so it will be no surprise if I have to enforce the law. Which I do not want to do, but if I cannot get the cooperation from you, you will be cited for the following violations:

112.01 LAMC – Loud radios/sterios, TVs, musical instruments, amplified devices are prohibited in residential area.

41.57 LAMC – Loud or raucus noises from any sound making or sound amplifying device in your control.

As you know, I only cite people as a last resort. Please keep your radios down to am minimum. Think of your neighbors. Most are not going to tell you because they are trying to avoid confrontation. That's why they call me. and I will respond.

We are still urging all to all to walk away from arguments that can turn into violence. We are still getting too many reports where two people are arguing over something trivial, and someone ends up seriouisly hurt. Please walk away and be safe in 2024.
