Meeting Notes

March 18, 2025 Virtual Meeting Via Zoom

I. Hollywood Station Command Update

Captain Heredia shared the crime stats for Hollywood Division.

Violent crime overall is down 24.7%

- This time last year there were 4 homicides, this year o
- This time last year there were 18 sexual assaults, this year 20
- This time last year there were 87 robberies, this year 73 (-16.1%)
- This time last year there were 187 aggravated assaults, this year 130 (-30.5%)
- This time last year there were 146 burglaries, this year 114 (-21.9%)
- This time last year there were 194 grand theft auto, this year185 (-4.6%)
- This time last year there were 324 burglaries from motor vehicles, this year 248 (-23.5%)
- This time last year there were 440 thefts, this year 419 (-4.8%)
- This time last year there were 1,400 part 1 crimes* this year 1,189 (-15.1%)
- This time last year there were 17 criminal shootings, this year 8
- This time last year there were 7 shooting victims, this year 8

Q: How are crimes of arson tracked by the LAPD system?

A: Captain Heredia will report back on that at the next CPAB meeting.

II. Updates from Officials & Reps

Ellen Evans from PLAN (Protect LA Neighborhoods) gave an update on short-term rental enforcement.

The LA City Council is considering a proposal to improve enforcement of the Home Sharing Ordinance (aka short-term rental ordinance). Since it was implemented in 2019, the ordinance has not been adequately enforced. Council members will be looking at funding for staff to crack down on illegal, unregistered home-sharing properties. These properties are often used as "party houses" which cause issues in neighborhoods like the Hollywood Hills.

J Anderson, Field Rep for CD4 commented that CM Raman had made a motion back in 2021 to have the processes for enforcement reviewed and asked the LA Planning Dept. to produce a report with their findings. The last of these reports were voted on today in Council.

III. CPAB Membership

We reviewed the composition and format / operations of the board. We discussed what's working and what's not working. Captain Heredia suggested the Hollywood CPAB could be more productive as a working group tackling specific issues and that we use our meeting time for that purpose. We also discussed alternating in-person and virtual (via Zoom) meetings to allow flexibility. Some liked the idea of meeting at different locations in Hollywood for the in-person meetings.

The Official Board should be comprised of those who are willing and able to go through the LAPD volunteer application process.
