Our officers in the Southwest Division have been working extremely hard to reduce crime and provide a safe environment and a better quality of life for our community members of the Southwest Division.

In the last 3 weeks we have been doing exceptionally well as far as crime. In the first 3 weeks of the month basic car 3Al only had 4 crimes. Out of the 4 crimes only one was an aggravated assault between husband and wife, the other 3 were recovered vehicles. The last week of the month we had 5 burglary from motor vehicles, so please remember to lock your car and do not leave anything of value in your car. Please remember our LAPD saying, "Lock It, Hide it and Keep it."

Just wanted to give a quick update on Westside Park. I have been providing extra patrol in the park and it looks great since CD 10 cut all of the bushes back and trimmed all of the trees. I have not seen any homeless individuals in the park or any of their tents. I will continue to monitor this location and if you see any illegal activity please do not hesitate to call me.

Basic Street Sense

- Wherever you are on the street, in an office building or shopping mall, driving, waiting for a bus or subway - stay alert and tuned in to your surroundings.
- > Send the message that you're calm, confident, and know where you're going.
- > Trust your instincts. If something or someone makes you uneasy, avoid the person or leave.
- > Know the neighborhoods where you live and work. Check out the locations of police and fire stations, public telephones, hospitals, and restaurants, or stores that are open late.

West Adams

Basic Car 3Al5 had 5 GTAs throughout my area during the last few weeks. Please always make sure to always lock and secure your vehicles and remove your property.

On Western Ave between Adams Blvd south down to Jefferson Blvd we have had several complaints with prostitution in the area. I have met with Captain Lorenz and we will work on having VICE conduct enforcement in this area. I will also meet with Southwest VICE Sergeant Cervantes and discuss the complaints and concern from the community. Southwest Vice will monitor the area.

I also have had South Traffic Division monitor/enforce the Adams Blvd corridor between Crenshaw east to Arlington Ave for any speed violations. STD is also monitoring the West Adams Aves for violators and any street takeovers.

On my eastside I'm still working with CD-8 on 22nd St between Normandie Ave and Vermont Ave with the quality-of-life concerns regarding the homeless encampments and the problem RVs in this area. I will also request from Patrol to conduct enforcement between 0200-0600 with the posted signs in the area. Remember if anyone observes any suspicious activity please call the non-emergency line or 911 if it is an emergency. On April 15 we conducted a Care Plus Clean-up on 22nd St west of Raymond Ave. Also 25th St/Vermont area was cleaned as well.

On 04/09/24, at approximately 5:05 pm, a gang related homicide occurred in the strip mall at the N/W/C of MLK and Vermont. At that time (2) males observed a single male standing in the parking lot. One of the persons in the vehicle fired a handgun at the victim, striking the victim several times. At nearly the same time Southwest LAPD Officers literally turned the corner in their patrol vehicle and heard shots being fired. They observed the vehicle leaving the scene with the suspects inside. Officers stopped the vehicle and ultimately detained the driver. The passenger fled the scene on foot and was eventually apprehended after a thorough search of the area. Both suspects as well as (2) firearms were recovered, the victim ultimately succumbed to his injuries at the scene.

It is the result of businesses and individuals failing to properly dispose of solid waste or hazardous waste in our communities. Businesses and individuals that dump waste also gain an unfair competitive advantage over those that pay proper waste disposal costs. Those who dump illegally in the city are likely breaking the law due to a perceived lack of consequences.

The health, safety, and environmental impacts of illegal dumping and the accumulation of trash and harmful substances are of great concern to all in the City. Senior Lead Officer Saldana is consistently focusing on public safety and how illegally dumping affects public safety in our community. Illegal dumping can obstruct and inhibit the ability of pedestrians, cyclists, and motorists to safely reach their destination. Some sites have items that can cause bodily harm, and substances that are flammable and cause damage to nearby structures.

The Community-Police Advisory Board (C-PAB) acts as the manifestation of the partnership between the police and community, providing community members with an avenue to share their voice in the policing of their communities.

- > C-PAB identifies disorder and neglect that can breed serious crime, develops strategies to address these potential criminal issues, and mobilizes the community and government resources to help solve these problems.
- ➤ Each C-PAB has two co-chairs one is the Area Commanding Officer and the other is a member of the community. The members of C-PAB are selected by the Area Commanding Officer with recommendations from the community.
- > Community members include representatives from the business, educational, religious, and social entities within the Southwest Area, each able to fulfill the role of liaison.
- ➤ The C-PAB liaison advises the police leadership of the Southwest Area of the concerns of the community while participating in the monthly New Employee Orientation.
- > The primary goal of this organization is to reduce the fear and incidence of crime while enhancing the quality of life in our area.

Burglary Prevention Checklist







- Lock all doors and windows when leaving your residence
- Know your neighbors and exchange contact information
- Install an audible alarm security system
 - o Always turn it on, even if you leave for a few minutes
 - Consider an exterior bell in addition to a siren
 - Use yard signs to help deter criminals, front and rear yards
 - Test system periodically
- Install camera surveillance systems and/or doorbell camera
- Secure irreplaceable items and valuables
- Do not hide valuables in unlocked drawers or cabinets
- Ask neighbors to move in trash containers, newspapers, mail, etc.
- · Window security bars make sure they are secure and not loose
- Safes should be bolted down to floor or wall
- Keep records of serial numbers of expensive items; photos help too
- Lighting (use a timer, dusk-dawn sensor or motion sensor)
 - Exterior lights on at night
 - Interior lights on when away


