  - a. Learning Activity: Foot Pursuit Use of Force, two officers responding to a radio call of a "459 suspect there now." As the officers approach the call location, a suspect walk out from between the buildings carrying a bag of property. A foot pursuit occurs on a pre-designated course and the officers will chase the suspect on foot to the termination point in the backyard of a residence. A reportable use of force will occur.
  - b. Assessment of Learning: Instructors will evaluate student's performance in the scenario for officer safety, reasonableness of force, compliance with agency policy, and articulation of the applied use of force
- B. Debrief:
  - 1. Instructor will facilitate a debrief of the scenario.
  - 2. Use of Force Review/Reverence for Human Life
  - 3. If a deviation occurred seek articulation to justify
  - 4. Communication
  - 5. Actions During foot pursuit
  - 6. Termination
  - 7. Perimeters
  - 8. Student Evaluation/Critique

## V. CLOSING

- A. Reinforce the key learning points
  - 1. Foot pursuits are inherently dangerous.
  - 2. Require officers to think.
  - 3. Succumb to the natural urge to give chase
  - 4. Officer must be physically prepared.
  - 5. Mentally prepared.
  - 6. Maintain perishable skills.

  - 9. The Department's guiding value when using force shall be reverence for human life.
