Esteemed Councilmembers,

SUPPORT IMMIGRANTS

The League of Women Voters of Greater Los Angeles (LWVGLA) has been a strong supporter of immigrants, who are vibrant community members and essential to the success of our City's economy. LAPD must come into full compliance with the Los Angeles City's sanctuary policies and maximize protections for immigrant residents. One critical way is to cancel its ALPR contract with Flock. Note [Berkeley's recent action](#). We are concerned about the use of Flock's Automatic License Plate Readers to facilitate mass deportations and criminalization. As reported by [CalMatters](#), the LAPD searched license plate readings on behalf of ICE and CBP as recently as May 2025. Another important policy to implement is to limit LAPD's responses to calls for support from federal immigration enforcement to only when they receive a federal judicial warrant authorizing an arrest.

LIMIT PRETEXTUAL STOPS

LWVGLA has read the studies regarding pretextual stops. [CA DOJ Racial and Identity Profiling Act](#), [NYU's Policing Project](#), and [Catalyst CA](#). Data shows that pretextual stops disproportionately impact people of color and do not result in greater public safety. LWVGLA supports prohibiting all pretextual stops and detentions that result from pretextual stops of motorists and cyclists, except in cases where the violation poses a significant and imminent safety risk.

We know the reality is that federal agencies are able to access Flock data and have done so without permission in many cities including Mountain View, Santa Cruz, Oxnard, and Ventura. Flock's ALPR hits are then used to create a digital web for ICE to track, hunt, and abduct community members. Regardless of citizenship status, ALPR data is used to criminalize Angelenos across the city, expanding the presumption of guilt.

As Flock continues to criminalize, we demand that Los Angeles join cities across California and nationwide in canceling their partnerships with Flock, including Santa Cruz, Mountain View, Denver, Lynwood, Austin, Evanston, and many more to come. We demand that Los Angeles cancel all partnerships with Flock "Safety" with immediate effect.

We know that LAPD is unwilling to act on their own. LAPC must take action to hold LAPD accountable and ensure the protection and well-being of all our community members.
