Property crimes are the Harbor Gateway South’s biggest crime problem!

We can never be too careful, too prepared or too aware. Please share this information with family, friends and neighbors. The Los Angeles Police Department and Harbor Community Relations Office wishes you a safe Spring Break and Easter Holiday.

### Home

Be extra cautious about locking doors and windows when you leave the house, even for a few minutes. When leaving home for an extended time, have a neighbor or family member watch you house and pick up your newspapers and mail. Indoor and outdoor lights should be on an automatic timer. Leave a radio or television on so the house looks and sounds occupied.

### Strangers at Your Door

Be aware that criminals sometimes pose as Couriers delivery gifts. It is not uncommon for criminals to take advantage of the generosity of people during the holiday season by soliciting donations door-to-door for charitable causes although no charity is involved. Ask for their identification, and find out how the donated funds will be used. Donate to a recognized charitable organization.

To combat property crimes, PLEASE, LOCK your homes when you leave. If you are able to, park your vehicle(s) in your driveway. LOCK your vehicle(s) whenever you are not in them. DO NOT leave expensive or valuable items in your vehicle(s). For example, many victims have reported expensive items such as; laptop computers, purses, GPS devices, and money taken from their vehicle.

Thieves have been targeting the catalytic converters from vehicles. The vehicles that have had the most crimes against the owners are Japanese made vehicles (Toyotas, Hondas, Nissans), KIA, especially the SUV models because the thieves can get under the rear of the vehicle easier. Please keep an eye out for potential car thieves. Park your vehicles in a driveway if possible. Other thefts include; GPS's, computers, vehicle batteries, purses, money, passports, etc.

Furthermore, many of the vehicles were unlocked during the commission of the crime. Help your neighbors to remember to secure their homes and vehicles.

Hello East Wilmington Community, hope you are all enjoying the summer, and may this letter reach you all in good spirits. I want you to please pay attention to the below information due to it impacting your community and please call or email me if you have any questions.

I wanted to remind everyone to please continue to **lock and secure your vehicle**, we continue to have “Theft from motor vehicle” in and around the Wilmington area. The most common vehicles are newer model vehicles such as Kia’s, Honda’s, Pickup Trucks and Toyota Camry’s. Please be aware of your surroundings and keep an eye on each other and please report any suspicious activity to me your community (**See Something Say Something**) officer or 911 if it’s an emergency.

Our Harbor division “Quality of Life Issues” officers in our division, Officer Woodard and his partner Officer Eick#38627 continued to address concerns regarding community issues. They have addressed several issues in our division and have removed several encampments. They continued to identified problems in our communities and please forward them any concerns you might want them to address for you regarding “Quality of Life Issues”, **both officers have been issued city cell phones and you can contact them directly on the below numbers.**

Please feel free to call them at below number and address with them any of your community concerns. I will continue to also assist both Officers with our transient related problems in our community and will give you monthly updates on how we are addressing this problem. Please never hesitate to call me at the above cell phone number and address in concern in your community that you may need my assistance, I know together we can resolve any community issued.

I continued to work very hard to address our homeless problem in the East Wilmington area. As you know, I am currently working with several business owners in the community and having them do follow-up to Long Beach Court and placing “Stay-away Orders and Restraining Orders”

on our known problem transients in the area, to reduce crime in the area and better the quality of life for our community.

**The following ideas can help keep you safe and avoid being a victim of crime.**

As you know most vehicles are stolen due to many of our community members leaving the vehicles unlocked. Help your neighbors by reminding them to lock your vehicles and have get any kind of safety device (The Club/Alarm) on your vehicle so that you **DO NOT** become our next victim.

Please do not leave valuables in plain sight inside your vehicle. It's always a great idea to secure valuables inside the trunk. Always be mindful of your surrounding's as you walk to and from your vehicle. The last advice I will give you is to not park your vehicle in dark areas when you shop.

- Closed circuit security cameras that view the area where you park your car.
- Kill switch works great too to prevent your vehicle from being stolen.

We are more than halfway through 2024. Car theft is still at an all time high. Kias, Hyundai's and Chevrolets (Silverados) are still at the top of the list for stolen vehicles. Please continue to do you part to prevent car theft. Reach out to the dealerships and inquire about safety update software that has been created to prevent these vehicles from being stolen. Do not leave valuable items in the vehicle or in plain sight. Conduct periodic vehicle inspections and ensure that both of your license plates are still attached to your vehicle. If one or both of the license plates are missing, notify law enforcement immediately.

An update to the intersection of 19th/Pacific. Since partnering with Council District 15, Sanitation, LAHSA and other City and County entities, I am happy to report that the calls for service at that location have decreased drastically. Also, the encampments that seemed to be a permanent fixture for the past several years have been non-existent as of late. We will continue to work hard to keep that intersection looking great.

Hello Coastal San Pedro,

I hope everyone is doing well and staying healthy during this time. Coastal San Pedro has had a decrease of total violent crimes. If you able to, Park your vehicle inside your garage or driveway. Also

you're your vehicle in a well-lit area. Don't leave anything in your vehicle open to view that might attract

thieves. This includes but is not limited to purses, bags, laptop computers, cellphones, GPS devices,

expensive sunglasses, work IDs, garage door openers and tools.

There has also been “porch Pirates” in the area as well. If you are expecting a package and will not be

home during the delivery let your neighbor or a family member know that you are expecting a delivery and to keep an eye out so they can hold it for you. Many mail order services offer locker service where your package will be delivered and kept securely until you are ready to pick up from a

secured locker. (UPS “Access Point “Lockers, “Amazon” lockers, FedEx “Ship & Get” lockers)

Catalytic Converter Theft is still an ongoing issue. The type of vehicles that have been affected are

Toyotas, Hondas, Nissans.

Take the time to clean out the garage to create a space for your vehicle in order to prevent any thefts

/catalytic convertor thefts.
