SOUTHEAST COMMUNITY POLICE ADVISORY BOARD (CPAB)

MEETING MINUTES

Date: Tuesday, June 16, 2026

Time: 5:50 PM – 7:30 PM

Location: LAPD Southeast Community Police Station

I. Welcome & Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 5:30 PM by the CPAB Co-Chair. Attendees were welcomed, and the purpose of the meeting—to foster collaboration between Southeast Area residents and the police department—was reiterated.

II. Commanding Officer's Update: Current Crime Statistics

The Southeast Area Commanding Officer provided a detailed presentation on the latest COMPSTAT crime trends and regional division statistics.

- **Violent Crime Overview:** Aggravated assaults and robberies have shown a slight downward stabilization over the last 30 days compared to earlier in the quarter. However, the division remains heavily focused on targeted enforcement to curb gang-related firearm activity.
- **Property Crime Trends:** There has been a noticeable regional fluctuation in property crimes, particularly vehicle break-ins (Theft from Motor Vehicle) and Grand Theft Auto (GTA).
- **Department Initiatives:** The Commander stressed the critical importance of timely reporting by residents. LAPD is deploying tactical focus units to high-incident corridors based directly on community reporting data. Residents were urged to continue participating in neighborhood watch efforts and utilizing online reporting tools for non-emergency property offenses.

III. Senior Lead Officers (SLOs) Update: Quality of Life Issues

The Senior Lead Officers presented updates on specific neighborhood issues across the Southeast footprint, focusing heavily on transient traffic, illegal dumping, and multi-agency coordination.

- **Encampment & Right-of-Way Coordination:** SLOs detailed ongoing challenges regarding public safety, sanitation, and overall quality of life surrounding homeless encampments. It was reported that LAPD is working in active collaboration with:
 - **Caltrans:** For cleanup operations and safety mitigation on state-controlled freeway underpasses and right-of-way zones.
 - **Union Pacific Railroad:** To address hazardous encampments and trespassing directly adjacent to or on railroad property.
- **Balanced Response Approach:** The officers emphasized that these multi-agency operations prioritize connecting unhoused individuals with city housing and social services via outreach teams, while maintaining lawful enforcement actions to resolve severe safety hazards.

IV. Council District 15 (CD-15) Update

A representative from Councilmember Tim McOsker's office (CD-15) provided a brief status report on pending city services and capital improvements in the district.

- **Infrastructure Maintenance:** Crews are moving forward with a localized tree-trimming initiative in the Watts neighborhood, focusing specifically on areas north of Century Boulevard.
- **Public Safety Impact:** Overgrown trees are being cut back to eliminate obstructions to street lighting and clear visibility blind spots at key intersections. This initiative aims to reduce opportunities for opportunistic crime in dim spaces and establish safer walking paths to local schools and transit hubs.

V. Public Comments

The floor was opened to community members to air grievances, ask questions, and share local public safety concerns.

- **Traffic & Speeding:** Residents voiced ongoing complaints about street racing and dangerous driving habits near residential parks during evening hours.
- **Reporting Timelines:** Inquiries were made regarding dispatch times for non-emergency quality-of-life calls. SLOs reaffirmed that high-priority life-safety calls dictate immediate response, but encouraged neighbors to keep reporting every incident to ensure data-driven patrol mapping accurately covers their blocks.

VI. Adjournment

The Co-Chair thanked the community members, officers, and city staff for their ongoing engagement and partnership.
