Crime Trends

During the past month, thefts and robberies were the primary problem for Basic Car 13A13. Majority of these crimes are occurring during PM2 & AM1 hours. These crimes are spread out throughout the entire area, but I am noticing more activity in RD's 1322 & 1323. W3 Patrol Officers are aware of the problems in the area and using their available time to work on these crimes. We will also be implementing a 211 Task Force (Force), during various hours and days. SLO's also have been running **TASK FORCE/ FOOT BEATS** in the Fashion District, 2 – 3 times a week. Officers have seized, well over 2 million dollars, in counterfeit items.

Gang Activity

Primera Flats (PF) has continued to be very active in the Trinity Park area. There has been several shootings and other gang related issues with Ghetto Boys. You can also see an increase in graffiti throughout the area which is common when they are feuding with rival gangs. Newton Gang Enforcement Detail (GED) officers continue to do an excellent job working PF's gang members as well as their rivals. I have met with LA Parks & Rec Staff and Supervisors to discuss safety in the parks for the community as well as Parks & Rec Staff.

The boundaries for the for the Basic Car 13A61 are from Vernon Avenue to the north, 52nd Street south, Central Avenue to the east and Grand Avenue to the west.

Crime Trends:

The Broadway, Main and Central Corridors continue to be one of the area's top crime problem locations, there have been an increase in theft for motor vehicle along those corridors. Gang crime in the Basic Car area for 13A63 has been reduced. Wall Street between Vernon Avenue and 45th Street is an active area for narcotic sales, usage, drinking in public and transient activity. This area is now being monitored on an around the clock basis by SLOs, Vice Officers and Patrol Officers.

We also have seen an increased activity to the rear of 501 E Vernon Ave (AT&T) bldg, due to the homeless. Officers have made numerous arrest at the location and there is a active SARA Project, open at the location.

South Park also continues to be an ongoing problem with narcotics activity, due to the Methadone Clinic located at 49th/ Avalon. Gang activity, graffiti and drinking in public or also concerns around the park benches. These particular areas rely on targeted and high visibility patrol. The efforts, of the Basic Car (13A63), Gang unit, Vice and Narcotics units continue to combat crime in concerned areas. Newton Division will keep-up enforcement in crime hot spots.

Gang Activity

The **Playboys** remains one of the most active Hispanic gangs in the area and have a constant feud with surrounding Hispanics gangs. The **5-Trey Avalon Gangster Crips** and **52 Broadway Gangster Crip** are the two most active black gangs, which are responsible for much of the areas narcotics sales. The Swap Meet is also plagued with people drinking in public, transient activity, illegal vending, sales of false government identification cards, illegal DVD sales and gang activity. This area is now being monitored on a round the clock basis by SLOs, gang officers, vice officers, patrol officers and Central Bureau Motor Units. The Pueblo Del Rio Housing Projects continue to be a hot bed for gang activity and narcotic sales. The Newton Area C.L.E.A.R. gang unit will keep up enforcement in the hot spots.

Also be aware of robberies of gold chains which have become major problems throughout the City, as well as vehicle break-ins. Please do not wear any exposed gold jewelry, and please do not leave any valuables in plain view inside your vehicle. The Department's campaign to combat vehicle break-ins is 'Lock It, Hide It, Keep It.'

Gang Activity

The 38th ST criminal street gang, remains one of the most active Hispanic gangs in the area and have a constant feud with surrounding Hispanics gangs and black gangs (52 Pueblo Bishop Bloods, AFC "All for crime," Florencia 13 and BMS "Barrio Mojados"). One of the Top 5 intersections for traffic collisions is in our area: Main Street and Gage Avenue use caution near this and all other intersections. Remember not all drivers are as careful as you. Do not use your cell phone or text while operating a motor vehicle, Newton officers will be watching, and violators will be CITED! Buckle up and use caution!
