Mona Sutton presided over the meeting welcome and introduction new community members.

Guest Speaker District Attorney (DA) Chin for a presentation. Introduced her team.

LA County is challenging with lots of tension. The goal of new DA is to bring back public safety, take care of victims and witnesses. Extremely short staff because so many quit and it will take years for DAs office to get back to normal staffing. Morale in the office is high. Back to filing cases but it's going to take time to see the results. Do jury duty, be involved, report crimes to the police and don't be upset with the results, keep being involved. The state of California changed so many laws making it more difficult to prosecute certain crimes like Gang Enhancements. We are back to doing Parole hearings.

Captain McGuyre provided an overview of recent crime trends and issues facing the department.

- Violent Crime. Homicides are equal from last year. Rapes are down 23%, Robberies are up 6%. Assaults are down 21%. Total Violent crime down 15%.
- Property crime down 30%. Storage locker crimes are an issue., BFMV up 1%, GTA down 18%, GTA arrests are up, LPR cameras are helping, Thefts up 1%
- Total crime down 11%
- Sworn staffing is the same
- County street racing, working with other agencies like TRAP, LA County, made arrests and citations.
- Hope to see an increase in new hire dispatchers.

- Made 20 vandalism arrests
